From State Membership Chairman, PSP Jack Anderson

Hello one and all:

Jack Anderson here. State Worthy President Fred has entrusted me to serve the year as your State Membership Chairman. Wow! Thank you Fred.

We are planning "Camping with Fred" in our program. Besides some of the prizes to those that successfully sponsor the required number of new and re-enrolled members throughout the fraternal year, SWP Fred and I are still trying to get the final details worked but our plan is to have drawing for prizes and multiple winners for a camping trip with Fred to be drawn at State Convention. Stay tuned for those details.

As you are all aware, Grand Aerie raised our per capita taxes paid to them forcing us all to raise dues. Whenever dues are raised the percentage of members dropped due to non-payment of dues always has a big increase. This year is no different. When the weekly Monday, July 21st, 2025 report was sent out, it shows we dropped 8,080 members that week, with us needing 7,517 for net gain. What a shame to lose that many brothers from our wonderful Fraternal Order of Eagles.

Here is an idea. How about getting approval at a membership meeting of having a 30-60 day re-enrollment special to waive re-enrollment fees for all re-enrollment applicants. Then send notices via newsletters, social media and phone calls to all of the recently dropped brothers. Be sure to include a description of the benefits to our brotherhood (don't forget to include if they were part of the July 2025 dropped list and they re-enroll before May 2026 they get their years of service credit returned – encouraging them to take advantage of the no re-enrollment special term). Hopefully we can get a good portion of those dropped brothers back into our fold.

On another note, Fall Conference is fast approaching. Kelso is hosting this year. It is scheduled for Oct 3-5, 2025. The Fall Conference packets were recently sent out by Kelso. Be sure to ask your secretary for a copy. They are required to report these as communication at the membership meetings. If they haven't done that, please ask. Another option, go to the Washington State website and find the packet in the Flyers, registration drop down box. Deadlines and motel suggestions are in the packet. Program ads, registration and meal orders are all due BY September 15th, 2025. Make motel reservations sooner rather than later.

Speaking of Fall Conference, has your Aerie ever considered hosting Fall Conference? We received no interest at state convention for delegates to approve anyone to host the Fall Conference 2026. And in October 2026, Washington is also responsible for hosting the Pacific Northwest Regional Conference. If you are interested in hosting either event, please contact State Secretary Rick McBee ASAP for a copy of the requirements and then let him know by September 15th of your desire to be contacted to host. Brother Rick will forward the information to the correct committee members, and it can be discussed at the State Aerie Fall executive board meeting.

Upon closing, one of my favorite words is "ostrobogulous", it amuses me. Do you know what it means?

Grand Convention Hospitality Room Report


Brothers and Sisters of Washington State,
