This does not even include all of the money given locally that never seems to be reported at Convention. We truly live up to our Motto of "People Helping People." The Membership Luncheon Wednesday saw increased participation as we are trying to get more Aerie Brothers involved as we recognize the top producers in Membership. Look for the final Aerie numbers later in the issue. I would like to thank the Brothers who came to convention and especially those Chairmen who gave reports and those who stepped up and gave reports for those who could not attend.

For the first time in many years we had Aerie Ritual competition at Convention. We had three teams compete in three separate categories. Puyallup competed in 'B' and 'B-2' and the Washington State team competed in 'B-3.' Though there were some 'growing pains,' I would like to commend those who competed and pushed to bring Ritual back to the Convention.

While Convention attendance increased over last year, we still have work to do as nearly half of the Aeries in the State of Washington did not send representatives to the Convention.

Finally, I would like to wish State Worthy President Fred Brattain the best of luck on his upcoming year! Remember, it goes fast so take time to enjoy the moments (and take notes on the way, so you can thank people later!) To our returning State Officers and the three newest ones, I would like to thank you for stepping up to represent the Washington State F.O.E. and I will always try to help any of you on your journey through the State chairs.
