We are so happy that you have chosen BCCS for your family. We are so excited about the direction our school is heading, and we look forward to building a strong relationship with you in the future. As we hold our first lottery under the provisions of our new charter contract with the State Charter School Commission, we will be implementing the lottery with weighted provisions for Educationally Disadvantaged Students. In order for us to ensure that we have all we need to successfully implement the lottery according to the guidelines provided in our contract, ***we feel that we need to postpone the lottery AND reopen our Open Enrollment Window.*** We will have updated enrollment forms for you to complete with the weighted lottery provision included. We are waiting on the stamp of approval from the State Charter School Commission for this form, and as soon as we have their approval, we will mail them to you. All families will need to complete the new forms to be considered in the 2020-2021 lottery. Thank you for your patience as we work to get this process in compliance with our contract guidelines. Weighted Lottery Information (optional, if applicable)

Baconton Community Charter School uses a weighted lottery for Educationally Disadvantaged Students in accordance with O.C.G.A. 20-2-2-66 (a)(1)(A). To receive an increased chance for admission, please review your eligibility for any of the following that apply to the applicant:

1. Students who are economically disadvantaged (Qualifies for Free and Reduced Lunch, federal benefits [ex: SNAP, FDPIR, or TANF Cash Assistance], or are below the poverty line)
2. Students with disabilities (Eligible for and receive services under IDEA)
3. Limited English proficient students (Eligible for services and English Language assistance)
4. Neglected or delinquent students (Adjudicated delinquent or determined to be neglected by a juvenile court)
5. Homeless students (Lack of a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence as defined by McKinney-Vento)
