

#### **Certified Monarch Butterfly Sanctuary School Garden Project**

Update on the **Certified Monarch Butterfly Sanctuary school garden project at Starke Elementary**We have a team of 10 members of the Milkweed Circle working together sharing ideas, providing positive energy, brainstorming on the best plants to include, where to get donations and a myriad of other details as we look forward to creating the Starke School Garden! These ladies are, Lynda Stein, Jill Drake, Doris Saffran, Dawn Wyatt, Karen Hall, Deborah Dubois, Mary Rose Vogt, Lynn Ventura, Gail LaFayette and Carole Gilbert.

- 1. We learned about 2 possible grants for the garden. We met twice to review the application guidelines and award dates, and found they weren't a good fit, unfortunately.
- However, there is an open grant from Espoma specific to soil, so we're going to check on that.
- 3. The new Edith I. Starke Elementary School is now open and the children are continuing the school year in a completely fresh building! In the first part of October, after everyone is settled in, we'll set a time to visit the grounds to check out potential places for the garden, with the input of the principal.
- 4. The garden will be a Certified Monarch Butterfly Sanctuary so we'll have the required host and nectar plants needed for this designation and then expand on from there to support our other local pollinators.
- 5. We're hoping/planning for a 10 x 10 spot and Lynda Stein found a garden plan with 3 options for this size garden that we can use as a guide.
- 6. After our school visit, we'll begin working on our lists of items, donations, and plants (the most fun part + seeing the smiles as the kids take part).
- 7. Our garden creation date will be shortly after the local March Wildflower Festival, but no specified date has been set at this time. We'll be sure to let everyone know so you can save the date and celebrate with us!!






