## Invasives in Our Gardens by [Dorothy Caldwell](#)

A few members wanted the 4 plant lists that I mentioned in Dec2026 explained.

The first 2 lists use the term “Noxious weed” which can be a little confusing. A definition of “Noxious weed”: Any plant or plant product that can directly or indirectly injure or cause damage to crops (including nursery stock or plant products), livestock, poultry, or other interests of agriculture, irrigation, navigation, the natural resources of the United States, the public health, or the environment. [Agricultural Risk Protection Act, Public Law No.106-224 (2000, p. 114)]

**The Federal Noxious Weed List** The Federal Noxious Weed Act of 1974 (“FNWA”, Pub. L. 93–629, 88 Stat. 2148, enacted January 3, 1975) established a federal program to control the spread of noxious weeds. The United States Secretary of Agriculture was given the authority to declare plants “noxious weeds”, and limit the interstate spread of such plants without a permit. While the word ‘weed’ is used, it is any plant from grass, vine, shrub or tree that is determined to be noxious. There are penalties for crossing a state line with a plant on the list from monetary fines to losing agriculture license. There are about 120 plants on this list.

## The Florida Noxious Weed List

Florida defines a noxious weed as any plant that is a serious agricultural threat in Florida; has a negative impact on endangered, threatened or commercially exploited plant species; or is a naturalized plant that disrupts naturally occurring native plant communities. The sale of these plants by a business or person is prohibited and their movement is regulated by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services' Division of Plant Industry, even giving these plants away is prohibited. There are fines and loss of agricultural license if found selling these plants. There are about 35 plants on this list.

## **The Florida Invasive Species Council (FISC) Plant List**

**This is the plant list that Florida Federated Garden Clubs chose to use in 2012, and The Florida Native Plant Society uses.**

There are 175 plants on the FISC list and is divided into 2 categories; Cat 1 and Cat 2. Invasive plants are termed Category I invasives when they are altering native plant communities by displacing native species, changing community structures or ecological functions, or hybridizing with natives. This definition does not rely on the economic severity or geographic range of the problem but on the docu-

mented ecological damage caused. Category II invasive plants have increased in abundance or frequency but have not yet altered Florida plant communities or ecological function to the extent shown by Category I species. These species may become Category I if ecological damage is demonstrated.

### The UF/IFAS Assessment of Non-Native Plants in Florida's Natural Areas

This is the plant list that Master Gardeners use.

The UF/IFAS Assessment of Non-native Plants in Florida's Natural Areas uses literature-based assessment tools to evaluate the invasion risk of non-native species that occur in the state, new species proposed for introduction, and novel agricultural and horticultural selections, hybrids, and cultivars. Our overarching goal is to reduce non-native plant invasions in Florida and throughout the Southeast US for protection of natural and agricultural areas. <https://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/publication/AG376>

IFAS divides the state into 3 regions North, Central and South and uses terms like: Prohibited, Invasive, High Invasion Risk, Moderate Risk/Evaluate, Not a Problem Species,




