### Planting a Refuge for Wildlife

During a recent zoom class, Planting a Refuge for Wildlife was a recommended resource. There is good helpful information in this 40-page booklet. It aims to provide the tools necessary to create pleasing landscapes where wildlife find the food, water and shelter they need to survive. As a starting



point, there's information on evaluating your landscape, creating a plan, features for specific wildlife and table of native plants.

What I liked most was the manageable amount of information which was a good teaser for future research available in its "For more Information" section. You can purchase a copy from the Fish & Wildlife Foundation of Florida for \$5 plus \$2.50 postage.
