

# 2024 Opportunity Quilt "Window on the World"



TheToyMakers began in 1982 when Jim McCullagh was advised that his grandchild didn't have any toys to play with while in All Children's Hospital in St. Petersburg, Florida. He realized that there was a need there and enlisted the help of his boy-hood friend, Bruce Pahl. They and their wives started making simple, colorful wooden toys. These toys were given to All Children's Hospital, then to local Ronald McDonald Houses, and other local agencies. The ToyMakers grew by word of mouth and they eventually found themselves sending toys, at their own expense, to several other states. The ToyMakers tradition continues today. We have made and distributed over 425,000 toys to this date. All are wooden, no metal anywhere, and brightly colored. We have even made a special toy that has a "handle" for children with Muscular Dystrophy. We respond to all calls for support for children in physical or emotional distress. We are always adding new Friends in the United States as well as in other countries.

The ToyMakers are a not-for-profit corporation - IRS approved 501 (c)(3) - organization that consists entirely of volunteers who make simple wooden toys for sick and needy children. No one receives any compensation for their time. 100% of all donations that we receive goes to the supplies and material required to make these toys. All of our toys are designed to be safe and contain no nails, screws, or staples. We use child-safe paint and round off all sharp corners. Since 1982, we have donated over 425,000 toys to sick and needy children primarily in the Tampa Bay area of Florida but also to other countries through missionary and military friends.





Pattern is a Kimberbell Design. Appliqué, quilt in a hoop.


