Quarter Auction

Update: Since last month's article, I have received some awesome items for the auction. I was concerned at the beginning that we may not have enough. Well that has changed and as I said at the meeting, we may be auctioning all day! That can't happen because we need to be out by noon. Many of the items you will put in a quarter but there are a few that will be 2 or 3 quarters. Steve and Ryuko Hawkins donated a huge quilt kit and Kim Diehl blocks with fabric. Thank you. You will have lots of fun!

The Quarter Auction will be in October at our general meeting. We have never done this before so you may expect a few hiccups. The other quarter auctions we have attended have been so much fun. Some of the table groups will distinguish themselves by wearing something similar like tiaras or mouse ears. Of course, that is not necessary to participate, just something fun to do. You may want to bring some snacks for your table.

What do you need? A numbered auction paddle which you will buy at the door for \$1, lots of quarters and that's it. We are not sure if you will be able to buy more than one paddle. We have ordered 200 so that is a possibility.

How it works. The paddles are numbered. The auction item is shown. If you want to bid on that item, you put a quarter into the jar on the table. The auctioneer pulls a number, announces it and if it is your number, you have won the item for a quarter. If a number is called and the person with that number did not put a quarter in the jar, another number is called until there is a winner.

Finished Size of block is 16-1/2"x16-1/2" FABRIC REQUIREMENTS FOR ONE BLOCK 2 Blocks 7-3/4" x7-3/4" BLUE 2 Blocks 7-3/4" x7-3/4" WHITE 4 BLOCKS 4½" X 4½" BLUE 1 BLOCK 4½" X 4½" RED 2 RECTANGLES 2-3/4" X 6" WHITE 2 BLOCK 2-3/4" X 10" WHITE (Patriotic prints are recommended for the Red and Blue fabrics)			For reference: Fat Quarter = 18" X 21" Fat Eighth = 9" x 21" HST = Half Square Triangle WOF = Width of Fabric RST = Right Sides Together BAC = Background Fabric SA = Seam Allowance				
SQUARES REQUIRED FOR ONE BLOCK 4 BLUE & WHITE HSTs 4½" x 4½" 4 BLUE SQUARES 4½" x 4½" 1 RED SQUARE 4½" x 4½" 2 WHITE RECTANGLES 2-3/4" X 6" 2 WHITE RECTANGLES 2-3/4" X 10"			Use the 7-3/4" blue square and the 7-3/4" white square to make 4 blue & white HSTs. REPEAT Refer to the directions on page 2 for instructions on making 4 HSTs at a time.				
Block Assembly							
Begin by sewing a white 2-3/4" X 6" rectangle on the left side of the 4½" Red Square and one on the right side, pressing the seams to the red side. The white rectangles are a bit long. They will be trimmed after they are sewn on. Trim the piece to 4-1/2" x 8-1/2"							
Next add a 2-3/4" X 10" white rectangle to the top and bottom of the red square. Press those seams to the red square as well. You should now have a block that measures 8½" X 8½", is red in the center with white borders. Trim as needed to have the correct size and the red is centered.							
Make 4 sets of 2 blue and white HSTs as shown. Use the 7-3/4" blue square and the 7-3/4" white square to make 4 blue & white HSTs. REPEAT TRIM the HSTs to 4-1/2" x 4-1/2". Refer to the directions on page 2 for instructions on making 4 HSTs at a time Press your seams open if you prefer.							
Sew one set of blue and white HSTs to the left and right sides of the red and white squares as shown. Press your seams to hst blocks.							

Next sew the bottom row of the block to the red and white square row. Press your seams to the hst side.

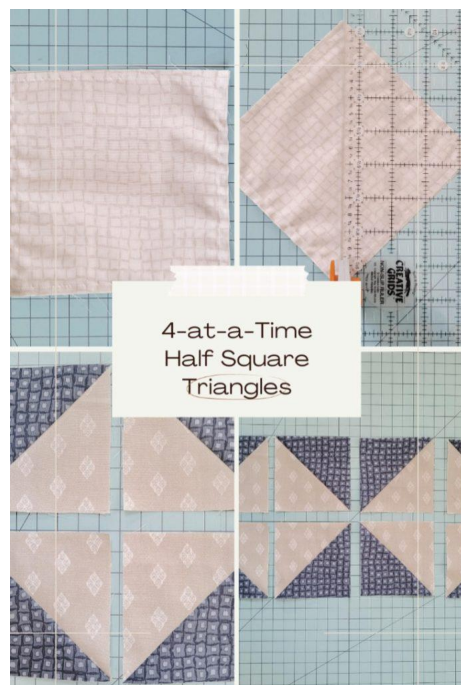
Repeat with the top row.

Please press your block and turn it in as it is. It will get squared up when it is matched up with other like blocks.



HOW TO MAKE 4 HSTs AT A TIME.

1. Place (2) fabrics RST. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam going around all four edges of the fabric.
 2. Draw diagonal lines from corner to corner. Cut on the drawn lines. You will now have (4) HST.
 3. Trim to the size specified in the pattern and press open. (This pattern is 4-1/2" x 4-1/2")
4. Place (2) fabrics RST. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam going around all four edges of the fabric.
 5. Draw diagonal lines from corner to corner. Cut on the drawn lines. You will now have (4) HST.
 6. Trim to the size specified in the pattern and press open

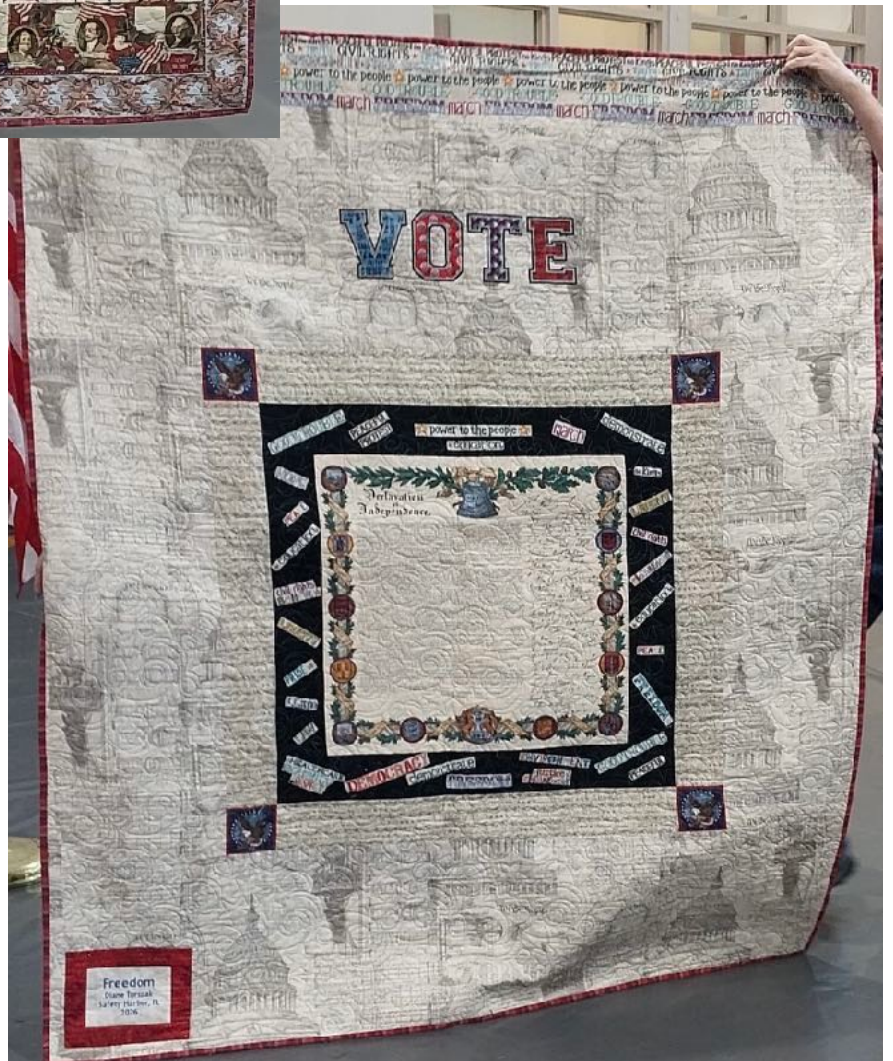
