

Stand up Tool Holder

Supplies:

Plastic Standup Frame – 5x7 (\$1 @ dollar tree)

Frame Cover: Fabric 2 pieces – 8" x 16"

Batting 8" x 16"

(Or if pre-quilted fabric – 6" x 15")

Large Front Pocket: Fabric - 6 ½" x 11"

Small Front Pocket: Fabric – 6 ½" x 8 ¼"

Back Pocket: Fabric – 6 ½" x 11"



Directions:

1. Quilt the Frame Cover pieces together and trim to 6 x 15.
2. Fold and press the pockets in half. (Should end up with two 6 ½" x 5", 6 ½" x 4 1/8")
3. Lay the small front pocket on top of the large front and stitch around the raw edges at 1/8". (Do no attach to frame cover.)
4. Stitch around the back pocket at 1/8". (Do not attach to frame cover.)
5. Mark a line where you are going to put channels in your pockets – apx 1 ½" in from sides on the front pockets, and maybe one channel on the back pocket.
6. Adjust your stitch length to the largest it will go on your machine and stitch across the bottom of the pockets making sure to leave a tail on the beginning and the ending of your stitch lines to gather. Tie one tail and gather the bottom of your pockets until they will lay flat on the frame cover.
7. Once your pockets are the same width as your frame cover (15") pin with right sides together onto the **BACK** of the frame cover. One on each end of the frame cover.
8. Adjust your machine back to your normal stitch length and stitch the bottom of the pockets onto the back of the frame cover at a ¼".
9. Flip your pockets to the front of the frame cover and press.
10. Adjust your fabric so that neither of the pockets will be pulled tight but that they have a little wiggle room in each for your tools and then stitch down your channels. (Do not sew the sides of pockets yet)
11. Fold the frame cover in half so that right sides of pockets are together – adjust so that you are catching the sides of your pockets – stitch down each side – back stitch for additional support on ends. Flip it and slide it onto your frame. Enjoy!!
