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Note: Due to the limitations of the quilt racks, quilts longer than 95 inches may be folded and pinned. Quilts wider than 100" will not be accepted. Quilts do NOT need to be completely finished by the October 16th deadline.

The quilt categories are listed below (how the quilt top was constructed.) The sub-categories (how the quilting was done) are listed after the quilt categories.

Appliqué Wall: Quilt top should be predominantly constructed using any appliqué technique. Length plus width must be no more than 120 inches.

Appliqué Large: Quilt top should be predominantly constructed using any appliqué technique. Length plus width must be greater than 120 inches.

Art: Quilt top with substantial deviation from traditional patterns and sets. Emphasis should be on color/design and originality.

Group All Techniques: Quilt top has been constructed by more than one person. Examples: antique blocks, round robin, block of the month, mother/daughter, healing hearts.

Junior: Quilt top using any type of construction and any quilting method. Quilt was totally made by a Junior Member of WPQG.

Machine Embroidery: The quilt top must incorporate machine executed embroidered blocks or machine embroidered appliqués or motifs as a significant design element that represents 60% of the quilt. Hand embroidery is not allowed in this category.

Miniature: All aspects of the quilt must be reduced in scale – blocks (must not exceed 4 inches), borders, and binding. The overall maximum size is 24" by 24".

Miscellaneous Techniques: Any style quilt top that does not obviously fall into any other category—such as yo-yo, whole cloth, photo, crazy quilt, hand embroidery, stenciled/crayon/painted, boutis, panels used as part of a quilt comprising NO MORE than 40% of the quilt top with the remaining 60% comprised of blocks. See below.

Miscellaneous Techniques—Panels 40%-60% Rule: The panel cannot be more than 40% of the entire quilt with the remaining 60% comprised of pieced blocks.

1. Measure the width and length of the quilt. Multiply the two figures, width x length equals total measurement.
2. Measure the width and length of the panel. Multiply the two figures, width x length—this is the total panel measurement. This number must be no more than 40% of the total quilt measurement.
3. For example: width of quilt is 50 inches, length of quilt is 75 inches. $50 \times 75 = 3750$ inches. 40% of this total is 1500 inches which means the total of the panel width x length cannot be 1500 inches. If the panel is 38 x 39 inches, the total would be 1482 inches and would be acceptable.
4. If you cut up a panel, you need to measure the width and length of each piece of the panel. Multiply the width and length of each piece of the panel separately. Add all the totals of each piece of the panel. The total cannot be more than 40% of the total quilt measurement.

Pieced Wall: Quilt top should be constructed using 100% any piecing technique (no appliqué). Length plus width must be no more than 120 inches.

Pieced Large: Quilt top should be constructed using 100% any piecing technique (no appliqué). Length plus width must be greater than 120 inches.

Pieced Wall with Appliqué: Quilt top pieced with the addition of any appliqué. Length plus width must be no more than 120 inches.

Pieced Large with Appliqué: Quilt top pieced with the addition of any appliqué. Length plus width must be greater than 120 inches.

The sub-categories (how the quilt top, batting and backing are sewn together into a finished quilt), are listed below.

Hand Quilted: 100% of the quilting is done by hand.

Stationary Sewing Machine: includes use of any sewing machine that allows the quilter to move the fabric rather than the machine and machine sits on or is mounted on a table. The stitching must predominantly use this method.

Movable Quilting Machine (not available for Pieced Large): includes any sewing machine that allows the quilter to either program the computer to move the machine head rather than the fabric or allows the quilter to move the machine head rather than the fabric and the machine is mounted on a frame. The stitching must predominantly use this method.

Movable Computerized Quilting Machine (only applies to Pieced Large): includes any sewing machine that allows the quilter to program the computer to move the machine head rather than the fabric and machine is mounted on a frame. The machine controls the quilting design not the quilter. The stitching must predominantly use this method.

Movable Free Motion Quilting Machine (only applies to Pieced Large): includes any sewing machine that allows the quilter to move the machine head rather than the fabric and the machine is mounted on a frame. The quilter controls the quilting design not the machine. The stitching must predominantly use this method.

The registration forms requires you to select one of the following: Totally Original, Pattern Used, or Design Inspired by Another Source. The definitions are:

Totally Original: The criteria for totally original is your quilt top is NOT based on anyone else's pattern, photograph or artwork. If your quilt top doesn't meet this criteria, you should select Design Inspired by Another Source.

Pattern Used: You must include in your description of your quilt the name of the pattern and the pattern maker.

Design Inspired by Another Source: You used some else's pattern, photograph or artwork. For example, you saw a quilt on Pinterest, used a photograph from a friend, saw a painting you liked. Include the source in your description.

Quilt Criteria

1. Quilts must have been finished within the last two years and may not have been previously exhibited at one of WPQG's past quilt shows.
2. More than one quilt may be entered in a category but only one may be judged.
3. All quilts must have three layers—top, batting, and back; quilted by hand or machine. No tied quilts.
4. Quilts must be in excellent condition—no odors (cigarette smoke), pet hairs, stains, loose threads, or pins.
5. Any quilt using a pre-printed panel in its whole form without the inclusion of other design elements will **not** be accepted (see Miscellaneous Techniques category for details).
6. Any quilt in a commercial frame or decorative hanger will **not** be accepted due to insurance regulations.
7. Quilts with an estimated value of \$1,000 or greater require a written appraisal. A copy of the appraisal must be included with the registration form.
8. The Registration Committee may move a quilt into a different category.
9. On the registration form, be sure to complete the box to designate your 1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc. choices. We hope to be able to hang every quilt you submit—the only limitation is space.
10. All quilts must have a 4" sleeve for hanging and must be sewn or basted on the quilt. No pins will be accepted.
11. All quilts must have a quilt label attached to the lower left-hand corner of the back of the quilt with the name of the quilt owner, quilt name, etc. See diagram below.
