May Spring bring new life and energy to us all!

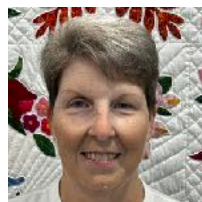

This event is held at Lake Yale Baptist Conference Center which is a full service retreat and ministry center in the heart of Central Florida.

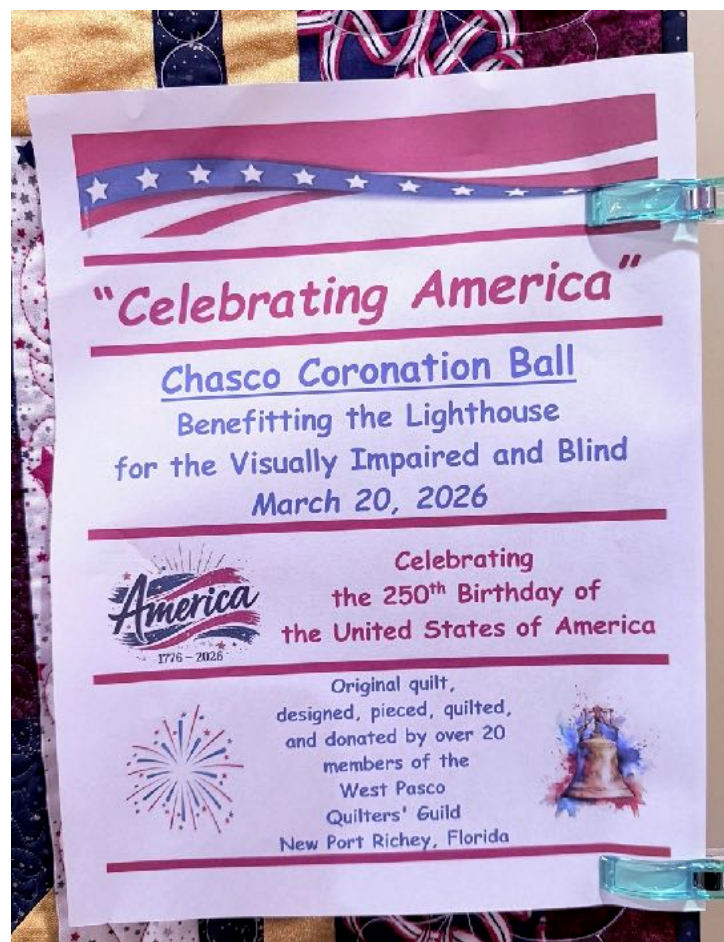

# Block of Month

**WEST PASCO  
QUILTERS' GUILD**

**CELTIC TWIST**

**BLOCK OF THE MONTH  
APRIL 2026**

**Skill Level:  
Easy-Medium**

**Finished Size of block 20-1/2" x 20-1/2"**

**Fabric Requirements:**

Red Patriotic Print: 2-1/2" x WOF

Blue Patriotic Print: 2-1/2" x WOF

White Background: 4-1/2" x WOF

Navy Borders: 2 pcs 2-1/2" x WOF

**All seam allowances are 1/4"**

**For reference:**

Fat Quarter = 18" X 21"

Fat Eighth = 9" x 21"

HST: Half Square Triangle

WOF = Width of Fabric

RST = Right Sides Together

**Fabric Cutting:**

Red Print: 6 pcs 2-1/2" x 2-1/2", 2 pcs 2-1/2" x 4-1/2", 2 pcs 2-1/2" x 6-1/2"

Blue Print: 6 pcs 2-1/2" x 2-1/2", 2 pcs 2-1/2" x 4-1/2", 2 pcs 2-1/2" x 6-1/2"

Solid White: 4 pcs 2-1/2" x 2-1/2", 1 pc 4-1/2" X 4-1/2", 4 pcs 4-1/2" x 8-1/2"

Solid Navy borders: 2 pcs 2-1/2" x 16-1/2", 2 pcs 2-1/2" x 20-1/2"

**BLOCK ASSEMBLY**

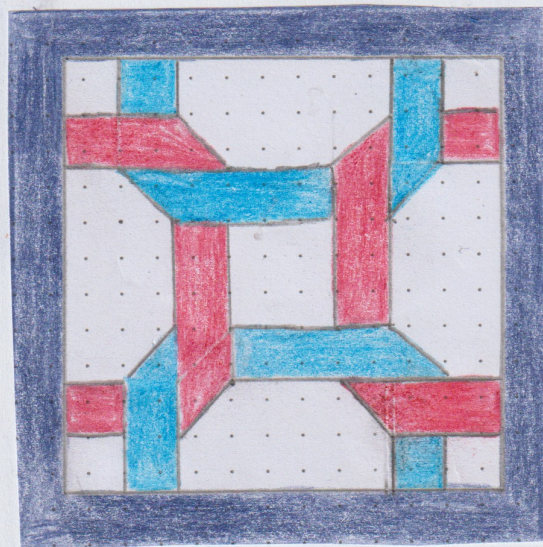
Referring to **Diagram 2**, sew together 1 Red Print 2-1/2" sq., 1 White 2-1/2" sq., and 1 Blue Print 2-1/2" x 4-1/2". Make 2 of these. Next sew together 1 Blue Print 2-1/2" sq., 1 White 2-1/2" sq., and 1 Red Print 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" as shown in diagram 2. Make 2 of these.

Set these 4 pcs. aside.

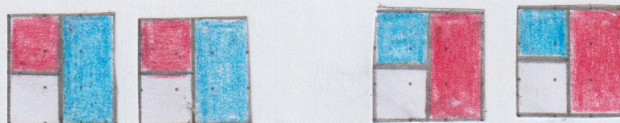
Referring to **Diagram 3**, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 4 of the Red Print 2 1/2" squares and 4 of the Blue Print 2 1/2" squares. Place the 4 Red Print Squares on the bottom corners of two white 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangles, right side together. Place the 4 Blue Print Squares on the bottom corners of two white 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangles, right side together. You'll have 4 of these rectangles. Make sure the diagonal lines are going in the directions shown in **Diagram 3**.

Stitch on the drawn lines. Trim away excess fabric on the bottom side of the stitching line leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Fold the print block down, opening the seam, and press the seam to the dark side.

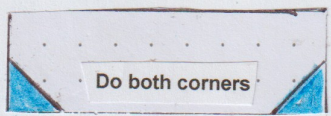
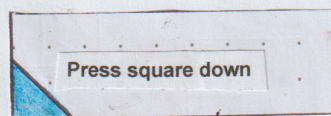
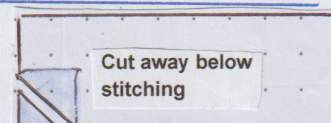
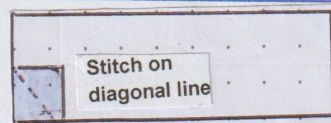
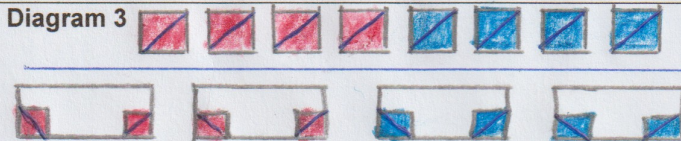
**Diagram 1 – The Celtic Twist Block**

Do this to all 4 white rectangles; 2 with blue corners and 2 with red corners

Referring to **Diagrams 4a and 4b** for fabric placement, lay out 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" strips around the white 4-1/2" square as shown. Stitch first seam as shown, the blue on the left to the white. Start at the top of the seam and sew down, stopping approximately 2" (dot) from top left corner of central square. Open the strip and press the partial seam. Following clockwise, add remaining strips. So add the top red strip next, then the blue on the right side, then the bottom red. Lastly complete the partial seam to make the block center.

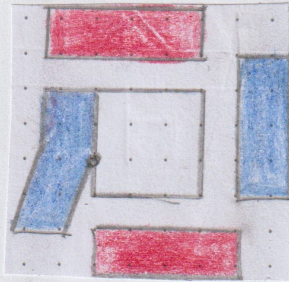
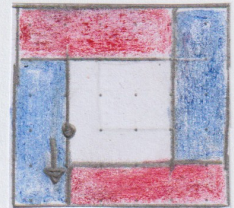
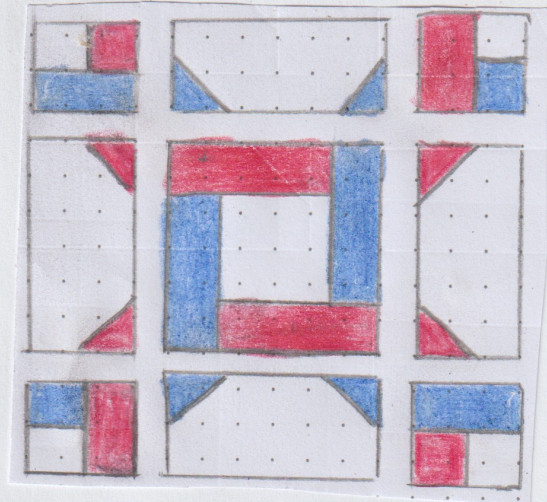

Arrange pieced squares, pieced rectangles, and block center as shown (**Diagram 5**). Check placement to make sure that links appear to interlock. Sew 3 rows, and then sew rows together to make Celtic Twist quilt block.

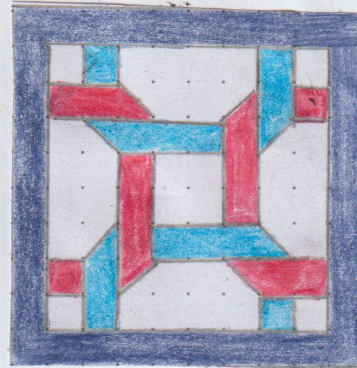


#### FINISH THE BLOCK

Lastly, add a 2-1/2" Navy border. Add the border to the sides of the block first, then to the top and bottom.

(**Diagram 6**)

The block you make will be combined with 8 others to make a QOV quilt top. The blocks get joined by a quilter using provided sashing strips. Then she, or another quilter, will add the provided borders. Once this is all done the top gets returned to Barbara Manning. She prepares the batting and backing, and a quilter will take it home and quilt it. This can be done on a long arm, done free motion, stitch in the ditch, using rulers and more. We never tie the corners, but always do a full job of quilting the quilt. Once again its returned to Barbara, gets squared up and gets a binding put with it. Another quilter will take it and sew the binding on and ... voila! We have a finished QUILT OF VALOR!

### TEAM WORK

Feel free to use our monthly patterns and your own fabric to make additional blocks. Anytime you want to make 9 of the same size, they can be made into a top.

Or make a top of any pattern you choose using patriotic colors. The suggested size is approximately 60" x 80". You can quilt it or turn it in to be quilted.

Friendly reminder we try to match up each quilt to each child. These kids love to cuddle with them and drag them around. Remember those days!!!!!! So please, please, do not make them too big. I believe our example will really help you a lot.

#### Example of Quilt sizes:

**Toddler size for daycare, preschool**  
**44 X 44, 44 X 46, 46 X 48, 50 X 50**

**Average size early elementary school**  
**50 X 50, 52 X 52, 54 X 54, 54 X 56**

**upper elementary, lower high school**  
**54 X 56, 54 X 58, 54 X 60, 54 X 62**  
**56 X 60, 56 X 62**

**Upper high school 54 X 64, 54 X 66, 54 X 68**  
**56 X 66, 56 X 68**

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## TIPS, TRICKS, AND QUILTER'S HACKS

How do you dispose of your dull rotary cutter blades? I've done several different things with mine in the past. But this month I came up with a new method I think will work very well. Many of us have health insurance plans that offer OTC (over the counter) benefits, primarily for use in the pharmacy. My plan allows me to spend \$70 a month on items from their catalog and most months I don't use it all. I noticed a Sharps Container, like this. Diabetics use them for their insulin syringes. That's just one example. I got three for free. They are puncture proof, I'll tape it shut when it's 3/4 full, and drop it off at the nearest ER. Easy and safe! (If you can't get them free, they're 2 for \$8 at Walmart.)
