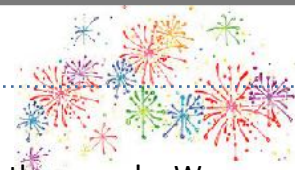

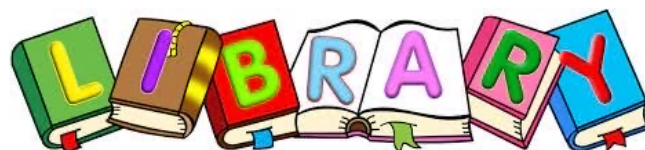

2026 QUILT SHOW QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q: When do I bring in my quilt for the show?

A: Monday, February 9th, 2026 is D Day, (delivery day) 9:00 am-12:00 pm. All show quilts, Guild challenge quilts, Youth challenge quilts, Bed turning quilts, and Boutique consignments are to be brought in that day. Also quilts for sale need to be turned in this day.

Q: What about my quilts I want to sell?

A: This is the first year we are trying this. Quilts that are hanging on the show floor can be sold if you wish. We need to know though so we can designate that on the info attached to the quilt. Other quilts not hanging will be in the demo and lecture room. All for sale quilts will need go through the Boutique consignment process. Michele Crary is the person to contact for this information. See [page 10](#) for more info.

Q: I cannot bring my quilts in on Monday, February 9th. What do I do?

A: You need to make arrangements for someone else to bring them in. There are no exceptions to this time.

Q: What is the Small Quilt Shoppe?

A: This is a Buy It Now shoppe for small art quilts. Perimeter of these quilts need to be 100 inches or less total. All money raised will go to the youth program at the New Port Richey Recreation & Aquatic Center. The quilts can be given to Pam King at any time.

Q: Why do I have to bring my quilt in to have a picture taken? You already have my picture on the registration form?

A: The picture on the registration form is for the Layout Committee so they can properly place the quilts. The picture Rhonda Koning will be taking of your quilt is for our Show Program. Our Show Program is the only one in the state that has pictures of show quilts. We are really proud of our Show Program.

Q: Can I withdraw my quilt from the show after I have registered it?

A: Yes, However, advance notice must be given. See policy below.

No-Show Penalty: In order to avoid a \$25 penalty on each quilt registered then withdrawn, you must give written notice to the Quilt Show Registrar, Shirley Zerbe, 7510 Handley Dr., Port Richey, FL 34668 postmarked no later than December 31, 2025 or emailed no later than December 31, 2025 to roscoezerbe@gmail.com. Written notice postmarked prior to December 31, 2025 will not be penalized. NOTE: Guild privileges (library, class discounts, membership renewal, etc.) are suspended until the penalty is paid.

Q: Does my quilt need a sleeve?

A: Yes, a four inch sleeve is required. The sleeve must be stitched down on both the top and the bottom of the sleeve. The quilt is hung on a rod, not pinned, so a sleeve is the only way to hang the quilt.

Q: How do I label my quilt?

A: All quilts must have a quilt label attached to the lower left hand corner of the back of the quilt with the name of the quilt owner, quilt name, etc.

What else do you have a question about? Contact Rhonda Koning, Susanna Brannon or Pam King.

2026 QUILT SHOW BASKET WALK

Currently, we have approximately 25 baskets for the basket walk, so a big thank you to everyone who has already signed up to provide one!! However, we still need more baskets!!

The last time to submit them will be at our guild meeting on **January 15th**. If you are unfamiliar with how to wrap them, we will do it for you! We just ask that you submit the basket or container with all of the items that you have gathered along with a list of each item in the basket. **Don't forget to do so by the January 15th meeting!**

Also, I appreciate those members who have already signed up to help with the basket walk on the days of the show! However, I still need some assistance on each of those days! For each time frame of 2 hours, I need 3 volunteers; 2 will help with tickets and the other volunteer will greet people, monitor the baskets, and explain the ticket process to people. The hours for Friday and Saturday are: 9:00-11:00, 11:00-1:00, 1:00-3:00 and 3:00-5:00. On Sunday, the hours are 10:00-12:00 and 12:00-2:00. We will identify the winners around 2:00 pm and I will need at least 3 people to help distribute the baskets. Please sign up if you can help!!

QUILT CONSIGNMENT

CONSIGNMENT FOR ALL SHOW QUILTS AND LARGE QUILTS – ANY Show Quilts for sale on the floor and Large Quilts to be sold in the Bed Turning Room

If you will be selling your any size Show Quilt or a LARGE quilt (length plus width greater than 120") you will need to process your quilt as a consignment quilt. Pick up a SHOW/LARGE QUILT CONSIGNMENT PACKAGE from Michele Crary BEFORE you submit your quilt to the show take-in on Monday, February 9. You can pick one up at the January Membership Meeting or contact Michele. You will receive a form to complete and a green tag to attach to your quilt prior to submitting it. Return the form to the CONSIGNMENT TABLE – upstairs in front of the boutique. The Consignment committee will label your quilt once it is hung up on Thursday before the opening reception.

If your quilt will not be in the show but you want to sell it, bring it to the CONSIGNMENT TABLE with your completed form and we will put it with the other large quilts to be sold in the Bed Turning Room.

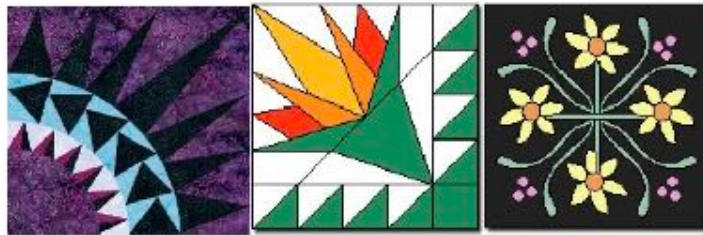
Block Party Silent Auction

Get with your small group, a friend or two and come up with a theme and/or a color scheme and make a set of blocks. It's that easy.

Show attendees will be bidding on packages of completed quilt blocks that they can put together by adding blank blocks, sashing, borders, etc.



Keep these guidelines in mind:

- Sets should have a standard amount of blocks to make a balanced quilt, wall hanging, or table runner (i.e., 4 - 12 blocks depending on the size and purpose).
- Blocks should be uniform in size and include seam allowances (8.5" not 8" blocks)
- Showcase your special skill – embroidery, paper piecing, applique, etc.

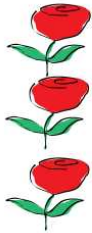
