
#### **Women's Fellowship Meeting**

## 2, 448 EGGS

It's a quiet Friday morning, breakfast is over, we discuss our events for the day, and my cell phone rings. Its Hugo Hughes, an employee at Ingles Supermarket and a staunch food pantry volunteer. "We've got eight and a half cases of eggs that expire in five days. There are 24 cartons per case. You have to pick them up by 3:30 pm. Would you like them?" My reply is always the same when any grocer offers us food, "Sure." (This has not always been a successful strategy in the past, but that is another story.)

We hang up, then it sinks in... 8 cases of 24 cartons plus 12 other cartons times 12 eggs per carton. I dig out the paper and pencil (yeah, I still do it the hard way).  $8 \times 24 + 12 \times 12 = 2448$  eggs. Uh-oh, "Norris, we have a problem." The eggs will expire on the Tuesday before we issue food to our patrons. As I've written in a past article, whenever we have perishable goods that we can't issue we take them to Loves Kitchen. However, past experience has taught us that the most eggs they can handle is 60 dozen. That only leaves 144 dozen eggs to find a home for, and they expire in five days.

Boil them or save them for Easter? The look from my wife says, "not a good idea." Hmm...must be some organization out there. There is, Knox Area Rescue Ministry (KARM). In desperation we gave them a call and are handed off to the kitchen supervisor. The lady says they process 60 DOZEN EGGS A DAY! Off we go.

KARM is located in the heart of downtown Knoxville on Broadway Street. Visiting the area is a truly humbling experience. There were at least 100 people outside, mostly homeless, all bundled up in layers of clothes and trying to fend off the cold. They were lying on the sidewalks, sitting in doorways, and just trying to make it through another day. Without KARM some of them probably wouldn't.

KARM is open 24 hours a day and make food available even when they aren't serving formal meals. We met the Kitchen Supervisor and she told us that they serve 30 dozen eggs a day at this facility and they have another facility that shelters women and mothers with children. They too use 30 dozen eggs a day. She took all 144 dozen remaining eggs.

We see the advertisements and the billboards for KARM. We shop at their stores. We know what they do, but to see first-hand... the care they provide to those truly in need... is a total heartwarming enlightenment. At times I ask myself why we do this, why work so hard? The realization is that in Norris, at Loves Kitchen, and at KARM we feed the hungry and provide aid those who truly, truly need our help.

#### **Executive Committee Meeting Highlights**

January 7th & January 14th.

All EC members were present via zoom. Bill Ireland opened the meeting with prayer.

- Minutes from the December EC Meeting were approved
- Joan hughes gave the financial report. Rent from the parsonage will cover the funds borrowed from the endowment fund in early 2020. She suggested we continue to look at the budget month to month. An audit on the treasury books are being sought out before the books are handed over from Susan to Joan. The EC is searching for an auditor.
- The contract for the Alarm/security system was discussed. Should it be renewed or cancelled? It was decided that more information was needed before a decision was made, and it will be tabled until the next meeting.
- The minister reported that we exceeded our goal of the Heifer International Project of buying two mated cows. Virtual bible study will begin Wednesday, January 13 at 7pm. Ginny and he are in the process of moving to Norris. There is still no plan to physically come back to church due to Covid.
- Voting on the budget was discussed. Bill said he could send a letter or email to the congregation allowing them to vote on the budget. Jocelyn said she will review the bylaws to ensure we are not breaking any of the rules via letters/email.
- Bob Gregory wants to step down as Good Neighbors chair. A meeting with all those most involved in good neighbors will be scheduled to decide the direction that GN is heading.
- The EC still has no contract for the new minister, Dr. Bill Ireland. We have search for past contracts to no avail. It was suggested speaking to Joe Mawhinney, who was the previous church treasurer for years, if he has information on previous minister contracts. He was able to provide this information. Joan said she will find this information and use it as a template to create the contract for the minister.


