Executive Committee Meeting Highlights

Executive Committee Meeting Minutes April 8, 2021 All EC members were present along with guest members Lee Borgers and Susan Gawarwecki. Dr. Bill Ireland, minister, opened the meeting with prayer. The March EC Minutes were approved.

- Financial Report: Susan Gawarwecki Jocelyn Borgers, chair, announced the 2021 Budget was approved with a Quorum. Susan stated we received \$1730.00 in donations. Income was up. It cost \$2,526.00 for the Minister's move to Norris plus 2 nights stay at a hotel during the move. We gave a love offering of \$600.00 to Buddy Rogers' family. \$1300.00 was given to Heifer International to buy a pair of cattle and alpacas to help families in another country. We are in the process of ending our Security contract with ADT. Michelle Queener is the church's point of contact on the contract and the passcode she recalled was not accepted by ADT. Michelle will check her files for another passcode, which will be needed to make changes to the contract. Susan said Joan Hughes is sufficiently trained as treasurer and will hand the books over to her. Susan said she hasn't had time to update and reconcile the books. Susan explained she is having problems with Quicken to make the transition and hasn't been able to download information to hard drive. Susan made the suggestion that Joan use Quick Books for Nonprofits instead of paying for an Audit. Susan also suggested we put money into a training course for Joan instead of an Audit. All the EC members believe we should proceed with the soft audit, but also explore software options as Susan suggested. Bill said the next step is to get the money to pay for the Audit. A check was written and forwarded to the Benevolence Committee for their annual donation to Community Action for the Green Thumb Project. Jocelyn suggests we have a meeting with the Benevolence Committee, Susan Miller, chair. Bill asked the EC to approve moving salary money to Housing Allowance. All voted and it was approved. Bill asked Dave Hughes to host food for the family of Janie Miller after her Memorial Service. Bill was unaware that the Women's Fellowship normally provided that service.
- Minister's Report: Dr. Bill Ireland Bill said he's been in touch with the Music Committee members, Wendy
 Hall and Mary Shelton to search for an organist/pianist and a choir director. Susan suggested contacting Lloyd
 Farrar.
- **Community Vacation Bible School:** Emily Ott said we haven't had one for at least 5 years. We were unable to get enough people to volunteer.
- ICCC Annual Conference: The question was brought up about supporting and continuing being members of the ICCC. Lee Borgers said we wrote a letter asking for assistance with our current minister at that time, Karen Neeley. Lee said the ICCC wouldn't offer any help. Bill said they did provide mediating. Bill said we need to support ICCC for advocacy. Jocelyn announced the ICCC Annual Meeting will be in July at Dublin Ohio. We need to fill out a form for delegates to vote. Bill said he will be attending.
- Parsonage: We will have a Congregational meeting May 16, and one agenda item will be options for the future of the parsonage and how the membership feels about various possibilities. We are working on getting information for the congregation so we can vote. Loy Johnson recommends we get an appraisal. Bill said his niece is a real estate agent and will give a ballpark figure of it's worth. Ashley will send a letter and email to the congregation regarding this information. The meeting will be held after church service on May 16 along with a potluck dinner.

Bill concluded the meeting with prayer

The next monthly EC meeting will be May 6 at 7pm.
