- A. Monday, November 28, 9 am; meet at NRF (Norris Religious Fellowship). Deliver Food-Drive Milk Crates to 4 Area Schools. Four helpers and 2 pickup trucks. Light work.
- B. Thursday, December 8, about 10 am; meet at NRF. Unload Second Harvest Food Trailer and store in Fellowship Hall. One hour. Heavy lifting. Six helpers with hand trucks.
- C. **Friday, December 9; meet behind Archers about 10 am.** *Move groceries from Archers to NRF.* About 2 hours. Heavy lifting. Six or more helpers. Four pick-up trucks, hand trucks
- D. <u>Friday, December 9</u>; <u>meet at NRF at 1 pm.</u> Collect food-drive crates from area schools and store in NRF. Eight helpers, 4 pickup trucks, hand trucks. Heavy lifting. Two hours.
- E. **Friday, December 9, from about 1 pm to 3 pm, NRF.** Up to four helpers 2 hours to *Prepare NRF for Sorting* the next morning. Mostly light work.
- F. Saturday, December 10, in the interval between 7 am to 1 pm, NRF. Many helpers to work about 2 hours each, *Sorting Donated Food*. Mostly light, some heavy work.
- G. Sunday, December 11, 3 pm to 5, NRF. Prep for Filling Boxes. Four helpers. Light work.
- H. Monday, December 12 in the interval from about 7 am to 1 pm, NRF. Many helpers to work about 2 hours each, *Filling Food Boxes*. Mix of light and heavier work.
- I. <u>Tuesday, December 13, about 2 hours between about 7 am to 1 pm, NRF.</u> Distribute Food Boxes in drive through fashion. Some light jobs; mostly heavy lifting. Pick-up trucks.

Clothing Closet Needs:

The Norris Area Clothing Closet needs blankets. quilts, and comforters (queen and king sizes, new or gently used); small floor heaters (new or good used condition); men's clothing (specifically jeans, long-sleeved tshirts, flannel shirts, and socks in all sizes); men's athletic shoes and boots (new or used, all sizes). Men's clothing and shoes are highly requested and difficult to keep in stock. These are the only items needed at this time. Currently they have plenty of women's and children's clothing. The volunteers ask that you please put donations in plastic bags (especially during this rainy weather) and don't overstuff or make them too heavy as they have to be carried upstairs. Drop them off at Norris United Methodist Church (62 Ridgeway Road) in the middle door alcove of the Education Building.

Executive Committee Minutes

EC Members present were Jocelyn Borgers, Susan Bowling, Joan Hughes, Emily Ott, Tracy Crouch-Hubbs, and Bill Ireland. Others attending were Lee Borgers and Susan Gawarecki.

- Bill opened the meeting with prayer.
- The August Minutes were approved after a change was made regarding the month the budget would be voted on by the Congregation in December instead of September.
- Financial Report: There is a rent increase for the parsonage beginning September from \$1,000.00 per month to \$1,500.00. If the Budget is approved by the Congregation, beginning in October, 10% of general operating income will be allocated to the benevolence fund. Raises for employees will be effective in October as well. As of September, income for 2022 has been more than our expenses. Susan G. asked about any plans for a special drive to raise money for replacing the HVAC system in the office. Funds are also needed to perform maintenance and repairs on HVAC systems in the church building. It was voted to continue operating under the present budget until the new budget is accepted.
- Minister Report: Theology on tap is going well and will continue on most Fridays at CRB from 4:00-5:30 PM. Regarding the English Language Class, Bill is meeting the lady leading the class very soon to tour our church and decide which night a week is best to meet. Bob Gregory is working hard with Good Neighbors in coordinating with the other churches in Norris with Benevolence. Susan G. asked if we are helping people with utilities. Bill said we are beginning to help with that. Bill said more kids are becoming youth and will start connecting with other churches for building a strong youth group.
- Other Business: After worship service Sunday September 18, there will be a vote for the nominated people for the EC. Afterwards, there will be a PotLuck Lunch and a continued discussion of where our church is heading. Lee volunteered to take charge of the Pot Luck.
- Parsonage: The EC will put together an Information Package on the Parsonage for the Congregation. For example, cost of area houses on the market as compared to the parsonage; Rental agreement and possible raising of rent; Cost of upkeep; Cost differences between selling and renting; List of repairs; Estimate return of investment up to 5 years; Risk of putting money in the Market versus renting. Joan and Bill will work on getting projections about the selling the Parsonage for information purposes. Susan G. said that the Congregation voted August 21 to get another appraisal on the Parsonage. However, the EC decided that because there was another vote open on the floor, we could not vote on another issue at that time.
- It was decided that Emily will contact Terry Queener and the Grounds and Building Committee to take a look and see what needs to be repaired. The EC will get information together and send it to the Congregation and set a meeting with the Congregation to discuss and vote.
- Other Business: The EC voted to have the Community Thanksgiving Dinner.
- Christmas Party will be December 18. Susan Bowling has found a Santa. Lee volunteered to be in charge of the Christmas Party.
- Bill will contact Michelle Queener and Kathy Smart regarding Hanging of the Greens.
- Susan B. believes she has found someone for child care.
