# NEW MUNICIPAL COMPLEX GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY

Groundbreakings, also known as cutting sod, turning the first sod, or sod turning ceremony, is a traditional ceremony in many cultures that celebrates the first day of construction for a building or other project. Such ceremonies are often attended by dignitaries such as politicians and business people. The actual shovel used during the groundbreaking is often a special ceremonial shovel, sometimes colored gold, meant to be saved for subsequent display and may be engraved.

Groundbreaking ceremonies have been celebrated for centuries in an attempt to begin the construction of a property, thanking those who made it possible. Though adapted to modern times, these ceremonies are still important to the construction industry. Early ceremonies were rooted in religion; by now, their basic foundations have still stood the test of time.

On August 15<sup>th</sup> the Supervisors welcomed the County Commissioners and other dignitaries to celebrate the groundbreaking for the new municipal complex. While it has been obvious for anyone passing by the site the ground was broken many months ago, we wanted to wait until the site was safe and level enough to host a formal groundbreaking.

# Kittatinny Ridge Designated as a National Sentinel Landscape

The peaks of the Kittatinny Ridge stretch across much of Pennsylvania, including here in Dauphin County where it is known as Blue Mountain. The Ridge is home to the Appalachian Trail and is one of the most biodiverse regions in the Eastern U.S. Identified as a Global Important Bird Area, the Ridge is used by many thousands of hawks, eagles and falcons each fall. Other important migrating species include Ruby-throated Hummingbirds and Monarch Butterflies.

Contained within the Ridge are State Game Lands, creeks, lakes, parks and hiking trails, in addition to two major military installations – Fort Indiantown Gap and Letterkenny Army Depot. The Sentinel Landscape designation (one of only 18 in the entire country) was established earlier this year due to the Ridge's key role in both natural resource protection and military readiness. Federal agencies, state and local governments, and non-profit organizations such as Manada Conservancy will work together with willing landowners to advance sustainable, mutually beneficial land use practices.

Along with supporting military readiness, this new designation will strengthen existing conservation efforts to protect not just military training missions but natural habitats as well.

# West Hanover Township Authority (Stormwater) Update

The Township's MS4 permit has officially been extended by DEP for at least 2 years. Approved stormwater fee credits will remain through the permit cycle so there is no need to reapply at this time. If you are interested in applying for a credit; the detailed credit information can be found in our Rates, Rules, and Regulations along with the credit application on our website. There is a \$25 application fee. Approved credits are not retroactive to the year of application and are applied on the following years stormwater bill and will continue until the current MS4 permit expires. Credits are not applied to delinquent accounts. For more information visit our website:

The Authority joined and has been attending monthly meetings of Dauphin County's Water Resource Enhancement Program (WREP). The WREP Program was created by the Dauphin County Conservation District (DCCD), Tri County Regional Planning Commission (TCRPC), and the Dauphin County Community and Economic Development (DCCED). WREP is available to all municipalities in Dauphin County and allows participants to work jointly on stormwater projects, public outreach, etc. and has the potential to generate considerable cost savings. Some of the initial participating municipalities include Lower Paxton, East Hanover, Londonderry, South Hanover, Hummelstown, Lower Swatara, Middletown, Penbrook, Royalton, Steelton, and Swatara.


Our final stream restoration project required under the existing MS4 permit will be at the Unnamed Tributary (UNT) to the Manada Creek, home to the Sewer Authority and the new municipal complex. Rettew was awarded the design of the project through a competitive process. We are currently in the design phase and expect to submit the permit application to DEP this winter. We are also working with the WREP Program on a potential grant to help fund construction of the project. Construction is expected to be completed in the Fall of 2025.

We are continuing to work with our Solicitor, Salzmann Hughes, and Keystone Collections on collecting delinquencies and filing liens on delinquent parcels. Delinquent parcels from 2020 and 2021 have had liens placed on them. Warning letters will be mailed out shortly for parcels that are delinquent for 2022 and 2023. Nonpayment for those parcels will result in filing of a municipal lien. Liens are being placed on all delinquent parcels, no matter how small the amount owed. When paying your annual stormwater bill, please make sure you are paying the full amount, including any penalties that were applied. All 2024 stormwater fee payments are due by December 31st. As a reminder, payments are not accepted at the Township office, they must be made directly to Keystone Collections. Whether or not you agree with the stormwater fee, it is a requirement and by not paying your share, the remainder of the community must make up the deficit.

The monthly Authority meetings are held on the second Wednesday of the month at 6:00 pm. We encourage all to attend in person or on Zoom, you can email <a href="mailto:stormwater@westhanover.com">stormwater@westhanover.com</a> to be added to the Zoom list.

# **CODES CORNER**

# **BUILDING PERMITS**

Residents are reminded that ALL building permits require a FINAL INSPECTION to closeout the permit. It is the homeowner's responsibility to make sure a final inspection is scheduled and completed.

# **ZONING PERMITS**

**Residential:** Zoning permits are required for new construction such as a new dwelling, addition, deck, shed, attached garage, detached garage, barn, swimming pool - above ground or inground, fence, carport, home occupation, earth disturbance, temporary construction, dumpsters or other projects specifically addressed in the zoning ordinance. Please note: Projects over 1,000 square feet will require a storm water permit and an erosion and sedimentation control permit with plans designed by an engineer.

Commercial: Zoning permits are required for new construction (commercial or multifamily dwellings), signs (temporary or permanent), parking lot, expansion of parking lot, additions, change of use or change in business ownership, temporary office, temporary construction trailer or other projects specifically addressed in the zoning ordinance. Please note: A land development plan reviewed by the Planning Commission, approved by the Board of Supervisors and recorded at the courthouse must be completed prior to the issuance of a permit for new construction (commercial or multifamily dwellings), additions, parking lots and expansion of parking lots. Please note: Projects over 1,000 square feet will require a storm water permit and an erosion and sedimentation control permit with plans designed by an engineer.

Applications can be found on the Township website, at the Township building or by contacting the zoning and planning office at 717-540-6075 or <u>zoning@westhanover.com</u>. We can mail, email or fax you the necessary forms. The zoning ordinance can be found on the website (<u>www.westhanover.com</u>); Home page; Helpful Resources, Codes Online. Zoning – Section 195.

Please contact the Planning and Zoning department if you have any questions. The Township staff is available to assist you with any questions, completion of forms or plot plans upon request by appointment only.

**BURN PERMITS** A Burn Permit is necessary anytime you want to burn on your property. The permits are only valid for one burn. Each individual burn requires a new, signed permit. Burn permits are available at the Township Building and on the Township website. If caught burning without a permit, or burning items that are not allowed, you will be subject to legal action.

**COMPLAINTS** All complaints must be submitted to the Township in writing on a Township issued Complaint Form. Forms may be picked up at the Township Office, or downloaded from the website at www.westhanover.com. All complaint forms must be filled out completely and signed by the resident. The Township will not investigate any anonymous complaints.

**FRIENDLY REMINDER** All properties with on-lot septic systems must have their systems pumped every four (4) years. The pumping deadline is based on precincts. There are 4 precincts. If you are unsure of which precinct you are located in, or have any questions, please contact Sharmaine at 717-652-4841 ext. 103. A report from the pumper/hauler must be sent to West Hanover Township. Please call the Township at 717-652-4841, ext. 103 for a complete list of licensed pumper/haulers.

**ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE** It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog, cat, or domestic pet, to run at large either upon the public streets or highways of the Township, private property of any other person or upon any other property not belonging to, or in the possession of, the owner of such animals or to persons under whose supervision or control such animals are being kept.



It seems that the dog days of summer are now behind us. It was a hot one! We had a full house for our Summer Camp programs this year. The campers enjoyed weekly field trips to fun places like Lake Tobias, Mt. Gretna Lake, Lancaster Science Factory, and Cherry Crest Farms. We also took weekly trips to Mt. View Pool to stay cool! We have been doing a lot of behind-the-scenes work at Mt. Laurel Park. A Master Park Plan is currently being developed. This plan will guide the overall development of the park through the years. Bear with us as we look forward to reopening the park sometime in 2025.
