#### **COMMUNITY YARD SALE**

The annual yard sale will on Saturday September 10, 2016 from 7AM to Noon. This will involve a high traffic level throughout our community. If you are not participating in the yard sale, please keep your garage door closed.

#### **NEIGHBORHOOD TREES**

Some trees in the community have begun to turn yellow, drop leaves, or exhibit brown to black spots. These symptoms are caused by a fungus. Trees exhibiting brown, distorted leaves are affected Anthracnose. This is caused by a wet Spring followed by dry/hot temperatures in the Summer. Anthracnose is rarely fatal to the tree and is corrected by the dropping of leaves and cool temperatures in the fall and winter. The tree will drop and regrow new leaves. Do not spray anything on the leaves of the tree. Lightly watering the tree at the base of the trunk during dry weather can help the tree through recovery. Another fungus present on some of the trees is known as Tar Spot. These trees may show brown to black spots on their leaves. Tar Spot is not harmful and only creates an aesthetic problem. Both conditions can be helped along with light watering, fertilizing with a 10-10-10 fertilizer, and or the products shown below. These products can be found at Home Depot or Stauffers (SKH). They can be mixed with water and poured at the base of the trunk to feed the tree and provide anti-fungal and insect protection.





#### TREES OVERHANGING SIDEWALKS

Some trees along sidewalks have grown to the point that they overhang the sidewalk and require walkers to duck around the growth. If a tree on your property has branches that overhang the sidewalk, please trim the growth to a reasonable height. If you can't do the trimming, please contact Tom Butler and he'll arrange for the tree to be trimmed.
