PROJECT UPDATES

WOW! Tough to believe it's time for the Fall newsletter already! The Township has been very busy with several projects and initiatives. We are close to modernizing the new zoning ordinance. Our current zoning ordinance hasn't been updated since 1995 and as you can imagine is in need of catching up with current times. While the new zoning ordinance won't look much like the old it will be easier to navigate and understand. There aren't many significant changes, but I guess it all relies on your perspective. Next up for modernizing will be the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance.

Also, the new municipal complex continues to come to life on paper. We are close to completing the land development plan that will hopefully be presented to the Planning Commission in September. We are also in the process of getting to do a cost check to see where we are regarding constructability within our proposed budget parameters. Inflation and the increased cost of site work continue to be an area that requires close monitoring. This new complex has been discussed by many previous boards and is finally looking like we will have final design in the very near future.

I know that the Supervisors continue to appreciate feedback, and suggestions from the West Hanover residents. While we do monitor the Township social media pages and website for feedback, it continues to be best if you pick up the phone and give the Township a call with comments or questions.

I would like to also remind residents that there are several Facebook pages out there that continue to provide misleading or inaccurate information. It is not Township policy to respond to comments or questions on these sites. Many of these comments that reflect negatively on the Township supervisors or its staff are opinion/agenda driven and have little to do with the continued well-being of the Township.



BATTERY RECYCLING

West Hanover Township has three battery recycling containers. One right inside the door at the Administration Building; one inside the rear door of the Community Center; and one at the Public Works Department. Alkaline, Dry Nickel Cadmium (NiCd), Lithium-ion, Mercury Batteries, Button Cells, Zinc Carbon, Nickel-Metal Hydride (NiMH), Lithium Primary/Metal,

Silver Oxide, Non-Spillable Lead Acid, can all be recycled by placing them in the container. Rechargeable batteries can be recycled at Home Depot.

The bins are near the Customer Service Center.

West Hanover Township Authority (Stormwater) Update

The first stream restoration projects are anticipated to start around beginning of October, weather permitting. The projects are at the Beaver Creek across from Central Dauphin High School and at the Unnamed Tributary to the Beaver Creek (UNT) between Lenker Park and Mountain View Swim Club. Construction was awarded to Flyaway Excavating LLC, who was the lowest bidder. These projects will go towards project requirements of our MS4 permit. We will post photos on the website and Facebook pages as we receive them!

We are continuing to work with Keystone Collections and our solicitor Salzmann Hughes, on collecting delinquent stormwater fees. If you received a letter from the Authority or Salzmann Hughes, we highly encourage you to take care of your past due balance(s) immediately as further action will be taken. If you are unsure if your stormwater fees are paid in full, please call Keystone Collections directly at 866-539-1100. We recommend checking on all years there was a stormwater fee: 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023. Payments are not accepted at the Township office. If you are buying or selling a home in West Hanover Township, please make sure all stormwater bills from all years are paid. The fee stays with the parcel and not the owner. It is important for everyone to understand that not paying stormwater fees burdens your fellow residents. For each property owner that does not pay, the remainder of the community must make up for that deficit. Whether you agree with the fee or not, fairness requires everyone to pay their share. Please understand the Township is mandated by the State and Federal government via our MS4 permit.

The Authority and Dauphin County Conservation District will be hosting a rain barrel workshop (see flyer) for West Hanover Township residents on Monday October 16th at 6 pm at Parks and Recreation. The workshop is free, and attendees will receive a free rain barrel to take home. Registration is limited to 43 participants and is first come first serve so register soon! The Authority would like to welcome our newest board member, Don Holmes. Mr. Holmes has replaced Tom Stewart for the remainder of his term, expiring December 31, 2025. The Authority hosts their monthly meeting the second Wednesday of the month at 6 pm at the West Hanover Township Administration building or via Zoom. Public comment is welcome for those that attend in person. If you would like to submit a comment but cannot attend in person, comments can be submitted in writing by 12 pm the day prior to the meeting. All residents are encouraged to attend the monthly Stormwater meetings.

IMPORTANT MS4 REMINDERS

The MS4, or Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System, is a network of curbs, gutters, swales, inlets, and pipes that carries stormwater to our creeks and rivers. It is important that we understand that precipitation falls onto our property as clean water. It is everyone's responsibility to keep that water managed and free from contaminants like eroded soil, excess salt, oil, chlorine from swimming pools, nutrients from fertilizers, and harmful bacteria from pet and farm animal wastes. As it makes its way through the MS4, stormwater runoff from West Hanover Township eventually flows into the Susquehanna River and Chesapeake Bay where millions of people depend on clean water for drinking, fishing, recreation, and even their livelihoods.

In 2020, the Township implemented a stormwater utility fee to help fund stormwater related projects and programs throughout the Township. The stormwater utility fee is a user fee collected from businesses, churches, schools and homeowners to help subsidize the substantial cost of operation, maintenance and improvements to the existing storm sewer system and facilities, implementation of PADEP required MS4 projects, and other stormwater program activities aimed at educating the public about stormwater.

TIPS TO REDUCE STORMWATER POLLUTION

- Wash vehicles at a commercial carwash or in vegetated areas of your lawn to avoid contaminants from reaching the storm sewer system or local waterways.
- Apply lawn fertilizers only when necessary and apply only the amount directed by the manufacturer. Avoid fertilizing on rainy or windy days and immediately sweep up and dispose of residual fertilizer granules left on driveways, sidewalks, and roadways.
- Avoid discharging grass clippings onto streets and roadways. Also, do not dump grass clippings along stream banks or drainage ways. Grass clippings contain nutrients that promote algae growth and pollutants that can be harmful to aquatic life.
- Pick up pet waste and dispose of it properly. Never dispose of pet waste in a storm inlet or near a waterway.
- Properly dispose of unwanted or unused hazardous chemicals, such as fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, paints, oils, and cleaning products. Release of these chemicals to the storm sewer system or waterway is illegal and detrimental to the environment.
- Never discharge swimming pool or hot tub water to a street or stream. Plan ahead to de-chlorinate and slowly drain to a vegetated area of your yard, without running off onto neighboring properties.









ILLICIT DISCHARGES

Any discharge to the Township's storm sewer system that is not composed entirely of stormwater, or a PADEP approved non-stormwater discharge shall be considered an illicit discharge. The above photos were submitted by Diane Allen. Diane and her husband, Phil, shared this information about the Monarch Butterfly: they find the Monarch Caterpillars on their milkweed and have an enclosure to raise the caterpillars in and also feed them milkweed. They watch them go into a chrysalis and then emerge 10-14 days later into a beautiful butterfly. The real reward is releasing them. Diane said you can tell the male from the female by the two dark spots on either side of the hind wing; they are only on the male. Also, the male has a visible thinner black veins running through his wings, whereas, the female has much thicker black veins in her wings.

HELP CONTROL THE CAT POPULATION

West Hanover Township no longer has the voucher TNR program, as mentioned in the last newsletter. However, we did find out about a very good, affordable program (thank you Jan Galloway). Nobody's Cats Foundation at 3909 Hartzdale Drive in Camp Hill offers spay/neuter surgery, rabies vaccine, distemper vaccine, parasite treatments, post-operative antibiotic, subcutaneous fluids/pain medication (when appropriate) and ear tipping for only \$40. They perform the surgeries on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays and you must have an appointment. You can schedule online. These services are for feral cats only and you are responsible for trapping and then releasing in the same area once the surgery is complete. If you have cats on your property, please consider this type of program to help with the cat population.

CODES CORNER

BUILDING PERMITS

Residents are reminded that ALL building permits require a FINAL INSPECTION to closeout the permit. It is the homeowner's responsibility to make sure a final inspection is scheduled and completed. If you sell your home, buyers may want to see any Certificates of Occupancy that you have for any additions or structural changes you made while owning the home, before you go to close on the home.

Anyone buying or selling a home in West Hanover Township will need to provide a copy of the stormwater fee to the settlement company. PLEASE CONTACT KEYSTONE COLLECTIONS DIRECTLY FOR THIS INFORMATION AT 724-978-0300.

BURN PERMITS

A Burn Permit is necessary anytime you want to burn on your property. The permits are only valid for one burn. Each individual burn requires a new, signed permit. Burn permits are available at the Township Building and on the Township website. If caught burning without a permit, or burning items that are not allowed, you will be subject to legal action.

COMPLAINTS

All complaints must be submitted to the Township in writing on a Township issued Complaint Form. Forms may be picked up at the Township Office or downloaded from the website at www.westhanover.com. All Complaint Forms must be filled out completely and signed by the resident. The Township will not investigate any anonymous complaints.

FRIENDLY REMINDER All properties with on-lot septic systems must have their systems pumped every four (4) years. The pumping deadline is based on precincts. There are 4 precincts. If you are unsure of which precinct you are located in, or have any questions, please contact Sharmaine at 717-652-4841 ext. 103. A report from the pumper/hauler must be sent to West Hanover Township. Please call the Township at 717-652-4841 for a complete list of licensed pumper/haulers.

ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE

It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog, cat, or domestic pet, to run at large either upon the public streets or highways of the Township, private property of any other person or upon any other property not belonging to, or in the possession of, the owner of such animals or to persons under whose supervision or control such animals are being kept.



STEPHEN MILLARD OBITUARY

Steve served in the U.S Navy from 1957 to 1961. For most of his career he was a software and computer engineer. After retiring from that vocation, he spent many years as a professional woodworker specializing in cabinet and furniture making.

Steve was in every sense a renaissance man. He lived life with a passionate curiosity that knew no bounds. He was a lifelong learner. He studied everything. He learned most everything firsthand and would spend days dismantling Volvos and rebuilding them.

He was an avid cyclist, and often would ride over 75 miles a day.

He was an enthusiastic gardener and spent time each day caring for his fruit trees and gardens.

He was interested in local politics and became dissatisfied with the township administration and sought to make changes. In the style of Thomas Paine, he began publishing and distributing a weekly newsletter that listed his grievances with the township and his proposed changes. When the opportunity occurred, he ran for township office and was elected a Township Supervisor and then served on the Water and Sewer Authority. He became an expert in the innovative use of worms in sewage treatment and was instrumental in developing an experimental field in the township to test those ideas.

He loved work, any kind, and had an intuitive sense that a life well lived was one spent fully engaged. He found value in everyday existence and did not worry about any larger meaning. He was grounded in a commonsense philosophy, committed to those he loved and did the best he could with the life he was given, a challenge to all of us who survive him to live up to.




