GRASS & WEEDS REMINDER

In the Code of the Township of West Hanover, Chapter 75, Brush, Grass and Weeds states:

§75-3 Restrictions on Weed Growth

No weeds or grass shall be permitted to grow to a height in excess of 12 inches on any premises or property within the Township of West Hanover and, regardless of height, no weeds growing on said premises or property shall be permitted to go to seed. This prohibition shall not be applicable to premises or property which constitute an agricultural area.






STORMWATER FAOS

1. What is stormwater and polluted runoff?

Stormwater runoff is much like it sounds: The accumulated precipitation resulting from a storm event that is conveyed over land, rather than absorbed into the ground. Runoff can come from either rain or melted snow and ice. Polluted runoff is often contaminated with litter, oil, chemicals, or other impurities that can be detrimental to the environment.

Where does stormwater runoff eventually end up?
 Most stormwater runs into small bodies of water like creeks and streams. Eventually, stormwater travels to larger bodies of water, like rivers, lakes, or oceans.

3. What causes stormwater runoff to become polluted? Stormwater runoff becomes polluted when it picks up pollutants on the ground. Common sources of pollution are weed killers, pesticides, and fertilizers. Stormwater can also cause erosion and sedimentation issues in the receiving waters.

4. Does stormwater pollution only affect small bodies of water, like streams?

Stormwater pollution extends beyond our local streams and creeks. It affects larger bodies of water those streams and creeks flow into, such as the Chesapeake Bay. Sediment and nutrients from upstream watersheds have drastically impaired the health of the Chesapeake Bay.

TIPS TO REDUCE STORMWATER POLLUTION

- Wash vehicles in vegetated areas to avoid contaminants from reaching the storm sewer system or local waterways.
- Pick up pet waste and dispose of it properly. Never dispose of pet waste in a storm inlet or near a waterway.
- Sweep up grass clippings and fertilizer from driveways, sidewalks and streets and remove leaves from your gutters, ditches, driveways, sidewalks and streets. Also, do not dump grass clippings along streambanks or drainage ways. Grass clippings contain nutrients that promote algae growth and pollutants that can be harmful to aquatic life.
- Apply lawn fertilizers only when necessary and apply only the amount directed by the manufacturer. Also, avoid fertilizing on rainy or windy days and immediately sweep up and dispose of residual fertilizer granules left on driveways, sidewalks, and roadways. Be phosphorus conscious!
- ♦ Consider using alternative lawn-care techniques in addition to, or even instead of pesticides. Try pulling weeds by hand, or spot-treating weedy areas instead of the entire yard.



ILLICIT DISCHARGE

Any discharge to the Township's storm sewer system that is not composed entirel of stormwater, or a PADEP approved non-stormwater discharge, shall be considered an illicit discharge.



Narrative:

Station 36-1 received a phone call, from a resident, that a large group of baby ducks were stuck in a storm drain. Rescue 36-1 advised the County of the incident, AOS, and met with the calling party. The ducklings were in a storm drain, approx. 4 - 5 feet down, with 3 pipes running in and out of it. Air monitoring was used to check conditions of the storm drain prior to any entry or work conducted, no adverse readings noted. Air monitoring continued during the operations. Crews used several confined space boards to block the entry of the pipes, so the ducklings could not go into them. A closet ladder was used to get down to the ducklings, by FF Kwasnoski. He was able to get 1 or 2 of them at a time and hand them up to the Crew. The mother was close by and the ducklings were released into the yard. 15 ducklings were recovered. After all ducklings were cleared, crews pulled equipment and went in service. No injuries reported and no equipment damaged. Chief H S Smedley

TOWNSHIP ENGINEER GIVES BACK



Emma, a West Hanover resident, is ranked 7th in a class of 433 and is deciding whether to attend Lehigh University, Carnegie Mellon University, or the Pitt Honors program majoring in environmental engineering. Emma is a track and field athlete as well as a cross country runner. Among her many school activities are Editor-in-Chief of the yearbook and calculus tutor. Emma is also a volunteer for her church's pancake breakfast and the West Hanover Mini-THON; and she is a Bible School assistant at summer camp.

The vision and environmental scholarships will again be available in the 2021-2022 school year.

In addition to the annual scholarships, the West Hanover Lions continue to support local youth athletic teams and facilities, the West Hanover Senior Van service and the Central Dauphin Vision and Autism Support Programs. Notes from the Zoning & Planning Administrator, Janet Hardman

With the upcoming building season, please contact the Zoning and Planning Office to see if a zoning permit is required. In some cases, a zoning permit may be required but a building permit will not be required. For example, a zoning permit is required for a fence, but a building permit is not required. It may also be possible that a building permit is required but a zoning permit will not be required. For example, a building permit is required for a basement finish or remodeling involving structural changes, but a zoning permit is not required.


You can email applications and plot plans to the Zoning & Planning Department at <u>zoning@westhanover.com</u>. All applications forms are on the Township website at <u>www.westhanover.com</u>; on the home page under Helpful Resources.

Projects requiring a zoning permit may also required a storm water permit, an erosion and sedimentation control permit, a driveway permit, a change of use permit, a sign permit. Storm water and erosion and sedimentation control is required for earth disturbance or impervious coverage of 1,000 square feet or more.

Most applications will require a plot plan:

A plot plan will need to indicate the lot dimensions, size and location of all structures on the lot (house, deck, driveway, sheds, pool, fence, etc.), size, location and distance from the property line for the new project. If you have environmental features on your property such as wetlands, stream, lakes, ponds, or steep slopes, you will also need to show their location.

CODES CORNER

BUILDING PERMITS Residents are reminded that ALL building permits require a FINAL INSPECTION to closeout the permit. It is the homeowner's responsibility to make sure a final inspection is scheduled and completed.

BURN PERMITS A Burn Permit is necessary anytime you want to burn on your property. The permits are only valid for one burn. Each individual burn requires a new, signed permit. Burn permits are available at the Township Building and on the Township website. If caught burning without a permit, or burning items that are not allowed, you will be subject to legal action.

COMPLAINTS All complaints must be submitted to the Township in writing on a Township issued Complaint Form. Forms may be picked up at the Township Office, or downloaded from the website at www.westhanover.com. All complaint forms must be filled out completely and signed by the resident. The Township will not investigate any anonymous complaints.

FRIENDLY REMINDER All properties with on-lot septic systems must have their systems pumped every four (4) years. A report from the pumper/hauler must be sent to West Hanover Township. Please call the Township at 717-652-4841 for a complete list of licensed pumper/haulers.



SEVEN WAYS TO HELP KEEP YOUR HOUSE COOL THIS SUMMER


As summer arrives, many people think, "Thank goodness for air conditioning." That is, until the bill for cranking the A/C arrives.

Fortunately, there are many energy-efficient ways to keep your house cool. Beat the heat this summer with these home cooling tips.

- 1. Choose an energy-efficient system If you're buying a cooling system, choose one that's ENERGY STAR rated. If you already have A/C, get your system professionally inspected and cleaned according to the manufacturer's instructions to keep it operating at its best.
- 2. Change your filters Furnace filters should be changed every month or two. Have your air ducts checked for leaks, and make sure vents aren't blocked by furniture, appliances or other objects. A bit of maintenance can make a big difference.
- 3. Insulate your home Adding attic insulation is one of the easiest, least expensive ways to cool your home. Consider adding insulation to your walls, too, if needed.
- 4. Keep the sun out Close window draperies or shades on the east, south and west windows during the day. Outdoors, consider adding overhangs, awnings, shade screens, bushes and trees, which filter out sunlight.
- 5. Open the windows Weather, allergies and security permitting, turn off the A/C and open windows for cross-ventilation when it's not as hot, especially at night.
- 6. Use the ceiling fan Keep your house cool with a breeze from your ceiling fans. However, avoid using ventilating fans, like those in kitchens and bathrooms, very often. Running them for just an hour can pull all the cool air out of the house.
- 7. Adjust your thermostats Set thermostats at 76° F or higher during the day, if people are home, and a few degrees higher at night or when you're away from home. Every degree you dial up can save energy—and money.

Bonus: It's a myth—don't crank the AC - It's a common misconception, but setting the temperature lower than normal will not cool down the room faster. But it will make the unit work harder so it will use more energy.

To save money, try to keep consistent temperatures throughout your home.







- Run opposite oncoming traffic
- Wear reflective gear and bright clothing
- Display movement with reflective shoes,
 a flashlight or other safety lights
- Run on roads with shoulders when possible
- Wear ID and carry a cell phone
