NEW REFUSE PROVIDER BEGINNING JULY 1

West Hanover Township will have a different trash/recycling provider effective July 1, 2023. Republic Services was the lowest bidder and will provide the trash/recycling services as well as monthly yard waste pickup and bulk pickup. Waste Management will retrieve their containers and recycle them the last week of June. Republic will issue each resident containers that are the same size as what we currently have. There will be the option to receive smaller containers for trash and recycling. The cost of bag tags has almost tripled, so going with the quarterly service will actually be cheaper. 

Items must be in brown compost bags or in up to 36-gallon trash cans, which must have a township-provided sticker for yard waste. Tree trimming can be no longer than 4 feet long and no more than 2 inches in diameter and must be bundled in bundles no more than 12 inches in diameter. Bags, containers or bundles may not weigh more than 50 pounds. All other brush or branches must be taken directly to the Township Drop-off Facility, Public Works, 402 Fairville Avenue.



Pit Stops for Pollinators

The Pollinator Pit Stop Program was designed by West Vincent Township EAC in Chester Springs, PA to establish native plants in the landscape which benefit pollinators, birds and add natural beauty to our surroundings. The name Pit Stop was used to make the point that pollinators move around and that they need food wherever they go.

The project began by demonstrating the easiest way to convert lawn into garden – the 'lasagna' method. Cardboard boxes were placed on the ground and a low fence was installed to form a 12' x 4' garden. Rocks were added to hold the cardboard down and two feet of leaves were placed on top and the garden was allowed to overwinter.



After the soil had warmed at the end of May, the 'lasagna' had worked perfectly and the garden was planted. The grass had died; the cardboard was gone and just enough leaves were left to act as a mulch.

The final step to prep the garden was to make a border of flat rocks with landscape fabric underneath to make it easy for the lawn crew to mow around it.

The garden is located next to a well-used trail so park visitors may enjoy it all summer long. Another demo was

recently added using the same technique to provide space for fall blooming flowers.

A Phoenixville resident who grew up in West Vincent was inspired to create the <u>Phoenixville Pollinator Corridor</u> as a Facebook Group which now has 135 residents who've signed up to establish feeding stations for pollinators in their yards.

West Vincent presently has 180 households participating in the program. Plants for the Pollinator garden include: 5 - Scarlet Bee Balm plants; 4 - Mountain Mints; 4 - Anise Hyssops, 7 - Whorled Coreopsis and 8 Butterfly Milkweed. Zoning Ordinance Modernization

The Zoning Ordinance revision process is complete.

As mentioned in a previous newsletter article the Zoning Ordinance has not had a major update since 1995. Many things have happened since 1995 that makes our ordinance, in several instances, unenforceable or deficient due to Zoning Law changes or relevant court cases. The Supervisor's objective is to take the 1995 Ordinance and bring it into current day standards as well as making it easier to read and understand.

The Proposed Zoning Ordinance has been available for public review on the Townships website, www.westhanover.com since March 8. Comments in writing will be accepted by the Township staff via email, from our website, USPS or dropping them off at the township building until close of business on June 11, 2023.

The Township continues to have an ordinance in the building at 7171 Allentown Blvd, for review if a resident wishes to stop in. If you wish to speak with staff about the ordinance, appointments are recommended and appreciated.

The schedule for public meetings where the ordinance will be discussed and public comment received is below:

Currently staff is recommending the public hearing of the Ordinance be scheduled for September 7 at 6:00 pm

All meetings will be held at the Township Municipal Building at 7171 Allentown Blvd, Harrisburg PA.

Once the public hearing is held, the Supervisors will decide on whether to adopt the ordinance or return it to the Committee or Planning Commission for additional work.

West Hanover Township Authority (Stormwater) Update

The 2023 annual stormwater bills were mailed to parcels on March 15. You have the option to pay in full or use the quarterly payment vouchers. All payments should be made directly to Keystone Collections via online, over the phone, or mail. We cannot accept payments at the Township office. If you need a copy of your bill, call Keystone at 866-539-1100. Please make sure your 2023 stormwater bill is paid by December 31, 2023. As a reminder, credits are not applied to delinquent accounts. If your payment is not received by the end of the year, you may forfeit a credit. It is imperative that all stormwater bills from your parcel from each year are paid. If you are unsure of payments made, Keystone Collections can assist you. There were annual bills in 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023.


The Authority has been diligently working on collecting delinquencies from 2020 and 2021. If you received a letter from The Authority or our solicitor Salzmann Hughes, we highly recommend paying your past due balances immediately. Keystone Collections does offer payment plans, you must call them to work out an agreement. It is important for everyone to understand that not paying stormwater fees burdens your fellow residents. For each property owner that does not pay, the remainder of the community must make up for that deficit. Whether you agree with the fee or not, fairness requires everyone to pay their share. Please understand the Township is mandated by the State and Federal government via our MS4 permit to reduce pollution entering Pennsylvania Waterways which, in West Hanover's case, eventually ends up in the Chesapeake Bay.

In addition to street sweeping, inlet installation, cleaning and repairs, pipe repairs, storm clean up, etc. by the Township's Public Works department, the Authority is also in the near construction stages of two stream restoration projects. The Beaver Creek and the Unnamed Tributary to the Beaver Creek (UNT) will start construction end of summer or early fall when the water levels will be at their lowest. The Beaver Creek is across from Central Dauphin High School and the UNT is between Lenker Park and Mountain View Swim Club. The construction bid was awarded to Flyaway Excavating for both projects, which was the lowest bidder. A third project will take place on Manor Drive sometime in 2024, which will complete the project requirements of our MS4 permit. More information will be provided when available.

The Stormwater Authority's treasurer, Tom Stewart, submitted his resignation to the board at the April 12 monthly meeting. The board vacancy was posted to the Township website on April 13. We'd like to thank Mr. Stewart for his service and time on the Stormwater and all Township boards over the last decade. Don Holmes will replace Mr. Stewart for the remainder of his term expiring December 31, 2025.

The Authority hosts their monthly meeting the second Wednesday of the month at 6 p.m. at the West Hanover Township Administration building or via Zoom. Public comment is welcome for those that attend in person. If you would like to submit a comment but cannot attend in person, comments can be submitted in writing by 12 p.m. the day prior to the meeting. All residents are encouraged to attend the public monthly Stormwater meetings.

STORMWATER FAOS

- 1. What is stormwater and polluted runoff? Stormwater runoff is much like it sounds: The accumulated precipitation resulting from a storm event that is conveyed over land, rather than absorbed into the ground. Runoff can come from either rain or melted snow and ice. Polluted runoff is often contaminated with litter, oil, chemicals, or other impurities that can be detrimental to the environment.
- 2. Where does stormwater runoff eventually end up? Most stormwater runs into small bodies of water like creeks and streams. Eventually, stormwater travels to larger bodies of water, like rivers, lakes, or oceans.
- 3. What causes stormwater runoff to become polluted? Stormwater runoff becomes polluted when it picks up pollutants on the ground. Common sources of pollution are weed killers, pesticides, and fertilizers. Stormwater can also cause erosion and sedimentation issues in the receiving waters.
- 4. Does stormwater pollution only affect small bodies of water, like streams? Stormwater pollution extends beyond our local streams and creeks. It affects larger bodies of water those streams and creeks flow into, such as the Chesapeake Bay. Sediment and nutrients from upstream watersheds have drastically impaired the health of the Chesapeake Bay.

TIPS TO REDUCE STORMWATER POLLUTION

- Wash vehicles in vegetated areas to avoid contaminants from reaching the storm sewer system or local waterways.
- Pick up pet waste and dispose of it properly. Never dispose of pet waste in a storm inlet or near a waterway.
- Sweep up grass clippings and fertilizer from driveways, sidewalks and streets and remove leaves from your gutters, ditches, driveways, sidewalks, and streets. Also, do not dump grass clippings along streambanks or drainage ways. Grass clippings contain nutrients that promote algae growth and pollutants that can be harmful to aquatic
- Apply lawn fertilizers only when necessary and apply only the amount directed by the manufacturer. Also, avoid fertilizing on rainy or windy days and immediately sweep up and dispose of residual fertilizer granules left on driveways, sidewalks, and roadways. Be phosphorus conscious!
- Consider using alternative lawn-care techniques in addition to, or even instead of pesticides. Try pulling weeds by hand, or spot-treating weedy greas instead of the entire yard.









Any discharge to the Township's storm sewer system that is not composed entirely of stormwater, or a PADEP approved non-stormwater discharge, shall be considered an illicit discharge.



BUILDING PERMITS Residents are reminded that ALL building permits require a FINAL INSPECTION to closeout the permit. It is the homeowner's responsibility to make sure a final inspection is scheduled and completed. **If you are opening your pool for the season, be sure you had a final inspection completed to be sure it is up to code.**

BURN PERMITS A Burn Permit is necessary anytime you want to burn on your property. The permits are only valid for one burn. Each individual burn requires a new, signed permit. Burn permits are available at the Township Building and on the Township website. If caught burning without a permit, or burning items that are not allowed, you will be subject to legal action.

COMPLAINTS All complaints must be submitted to the Township in writing on a Township issued Complaint Form. Forms may be picked up at the Township Office, or downloaded from the website at www.westhanover.com. All complaint forms must be filled out completely and signed by the resident. The Township will not investigate any anonymous complaints.

FRIENDLY REMINDER All properties with on-lot septic systems must have their systems pumped every four (4) years. A report from the pumper/hauler must be sent to West Hanover Township. Please call the Township at 717-652-4841 for a complete list of licensed pumper/haulers.


