TRASH CONTRACT EXTENDED

Republic Services is responsible for all trash, recycling, bulk/large items and yard waste collection for West Hanover Township. To learn more about this service including pickup dates and what is permitted to be placed curbside please download the 2025/2026 Republic Collection Guide (or call Republic Services at 800-210-9675).

A 2026/2027 Collection Guide will be mailed to residents in June.

July 1, 2026 starts a 2-year extension with Republic Services. The Board of Supervisors achieved a rate hold for 2 years until the contract expires on June 30, 2028. The Board also helped add a low-volume service option for senior citizens or homes that don't generate much trash. That service is for a 35-gallon cart for trash, which is about 1/3 of the size of your current 95-gallon trash cart, at a reduced quarterly fee.

If you want to switch to that service, please call Republic at 800-210-9675 **after June 22nd** to schedule the service change and your cart will be exchanged around July 1st. Warning: if you typically fill up your current 95-gallon trash cart at least half-full, **DO NOT** switch to this service. They only collect what is in the cart, so this smaller cart won't accommodate your needs.

If you are new to West Hanover Township please visit <http://RepublicServices.com/Account/Signup> to create your trash collection account. Existing customers are also encouraged to setup online accounts to assist with billing and services provided.

For any billing issues, missed pickup of trash, recycling or yard waste, to schedule a bulk/large items pickup, or general issues please call 800-210-9675. For missed pickups, once notified by the resident, Republic Services has 24-hours to collect missed locations. Please note that late placement of trash is not considered a missed pickup, so place your trash, recycling and yard waste no later than the evening before pickup. Bulk/large items will not be picked up that are not scheduled in advance. For any unresolved complaints after proper notification has been made to Republic Services, please call West Hanover Township at 717-652-4841, Ext 108.

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PIPE REPLACEMENT AT 1213 PIKETOWN ROAD UPDATE

Public Works is on track to cross over Piketown Rd. on June 2-4 at the property (1213) to the north of Fairville Ave. and to the south of Glendale Ln. This will have major impact on resident travel times, possibly 10-15 minute wait times. West Hanover Township Authority (Stormwater) Update

The 2026 annual stormwater bills were mailed to parcels from Keystone Collection around March 15th. We were excited to offer a 33 1/3% discount on this year's billing! If you haven't already, make sure your stormwater bill is paid by December 31st. Payments cannot be accepted at the Township office; they must be made directly to Keystone Collections via mail, online or over the phone. As always, we are continuing to work with Keystone Collections and our Solicitor, Salzmann Hughes on collecting delinquencies. As a reminder, when paying your invoice, you must pay the balance in full, including any penalties that have been applied. If you have any questions on balances or penalties, please call Keystone Collections directly at 724-978-0300.

The Board approved having our engineering consultant, HRG, conduct a rate study that will evaluate various rate structures including a flat rate for single residential properties in the future. We are anticipating having the draft in the coming weeks. We will navigate the process by continuing our commitment to finding ways to keep the stormwater fee affordable and fair.

Public Works is continuing street sweeping throughout the Township. They are also working on repairing, inspecting and clearing out inlet boxes. Our larger project of replacing 5 existing culverts on Sleepy Hollow and Moyer Roads is moving along. Permits have been approved; we are working on securing easements with several parcels and hoping the project can go to bid in the coming months.

We are continuing to host our bimonthly meetings at 6 PM at the new Administration building at 7925 Jonestown Road. Meetings are held in person and are now being streamed on YouTube. You can now watch the meeting at any time. Please follow the Township's YouTube channel [West Hanover Township - YouTube](#) to watch the Stormwater, Board of Supervisors and Planning Commission meetings. We encourage all residents to get involved and be informed.

Pervious Pavement

Pervious pavements provide a valuable stormwater management benefit to help offset the costs of constructing and maintaining traditional Stormwater Control Measures. The cost to install pervious pavement is slightly more expensive than traditional pavement. However, by following natural land contours and the use of strategically placed French drains, the benefits of pervious pavement can outweigh the costs.

Pervious pavement is an eco-friendly paving alternative that allows rainwater and snowmelt to pass through its surface and soak into the ground. Unlike traditional sealed asphalt that causes rapid water runoff, it acts like a sponge - infiltrating and returning water to local aquifers while naturally filtering out pollutants.

How It Works:

Instead of being a solid mass, permeable pavement is engineered with tiny, interconnected voids or intentional gaps.

1. **The Surface:** Water seeps through the porous material or between spaced pavers.
2. **The Base:** Water collects in a crushed stone or gravel bed situated just beneath the pavement
3. **The Ground:** The stored water slowly infiltrates into the underlying soil or is carried away by an underdrain.

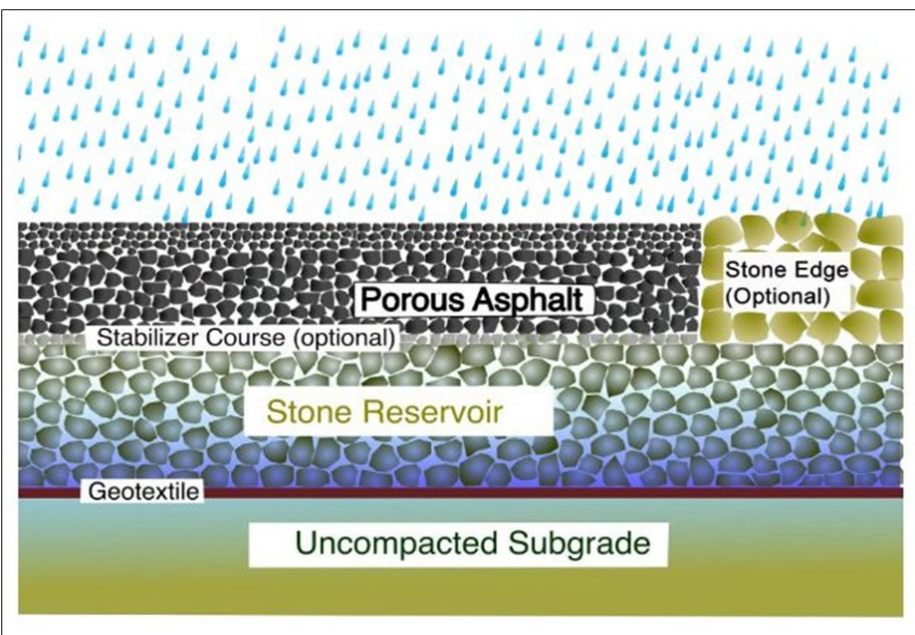
Common Types:

Pervious Asphalt & Pervious Concrete: Similar in appearance to traditional pavement but mixed without fine sand particles, which creates small gaps for water to flow through.

Main Benefits:

- **Reduces Flooding:** Mitigates the runoff volume that overwhelms local storm drains during heavy storms.
- **Recharges Aquifers:** Allows the natural water cycle to continue by hydrating the soil rather than directing it into concrete water channels.
- **Improves Water Quality:** Acts as a physical, chemical, and biological filter, catching harmful runoff pollutants like heavy metals and motor oils before they reach local waterways.

Pervious asphalt pavements with stone reservoirs are a multi-functional, low impact development (LID) technology, which integrates ecological and environmental goals for a site with land development goals, reducing the net environmental impact. Not only do they provide a strong pavement surface for parking, biking, walkways and trails, they are designed to manage and treat stormwater runoff. With proper design, installation, and maintenance, porous asphalt pavements can provide a cost-effective solution for stormwater management in an environmentally friendly way. As a result they are recognized as a “best practice” by EPA, PA DOT and many other state agencies within the USA.

NOTICE OF RATE INCREASE

April 22, 2026

Dear Resident,

We are writing to inform you of an upcoming adjustment to the rates for your wastewater services. Effective July 1, 2026 — the beginning of the third quarter billing cycle — a 5% rate increase will be applied to all residential and commercial wastewater accounts. We understand that any increase in utility costs affects your household budget, and we want to be fully transparent about the reasons behind this necessary change.

Why a Rate Increase Is Necessary

Our wastewater system has not seen a rate adjustment in over 15 years. During that time, we have worked diligently to absorb rising costs and maintain reliable, high-quality service without passing additional expenses on to our customers. However, the cumulative impact of inflation, increased regulatory compliance requirements, aging infrastructure, and the rising costs of chemicals, energy, and labor have made it no longer feasible to maintain current rates without compromising the integrity and safety of our operations.

The current cost of operating and maintaining our wastewater treatment facilities has significantly outpaced the revenue generated at existing rate levels. Without this adjustment, we would be unable to continue meeting state and federal environmental standards, fund critical infrastructure repairs, and ensure the long-term reliability of the system that serves our entire community.

Effective Date and Billing Information

The rate increase will take effect on July 1, 2026, coinciding with the start of the third quarter billing period. Your first bill reflecting the updated rates will be issued in accordance with your normal billing schedule following that date. The specific rate adjustments applicable to your account type will be detailed in a separate rate schedule.

Our Commitment to You

We do not take this decision lightly. Our team has carefully evaluated all available options to minimize the impact on residents while ensuring the continued safe and efficient operation of your wastewater system. The funds generated through this rate adjustment will be dedicated exclusively to operational costs, infrastructure improvements, and compliance with environmental regulations — investments that protect public health and the quality of our local waterways for generations to come.

BUILDING PERMITS

Residents are reminded that **ALL** building permits require a **FINAL INSPECTION** to closeout the permit. It is the homeowner's responsibility to make sure a final inspection is scheduled and completed. **If you are opening your pool for the season, be sure you had a final inspection completed to be sure it is up to code.**

ZONING PERMITS

Residential: Zoning permits are required for new construction such as a new dwelling, addition, deck, shed, attached garage, detached garage, barn, swimming pool - above ground or inground, fence, carport, home occupation, earth disturbance, temporary construction, dumpsters or other projects specifically addressed in the zoning ordinance. **Please note:** Projects over 1,000 square feet will require a storm water permit and an erosion and sedimentation control permit with plans designed by an engineer.

Commercial: Zoning permits are required for new construction (commercial or multifamily dwellings), signs (temporary or permanent), parking lot, expansion of parking lot, additions, change of use or change in business ownership, temporary office, temporary construction trailer or other projects specifically addressed in the zoning ordinance. **Please note:** A land development plan reviewed by the Planning Commission, approved by the Board of Supervisors and recorded at the courthouse must be completed prior to the issuance of a permit for new construction (commercial or multifamily dwellings), additions, parking lots and expansion of parking lots. **Please note:** Projects over 1,000 square feet will require a storm water permit and an erosion and sedimentation control permit with plans designed by an engineer.

Applications can be found on the Township website, at the Township building or by contacting the zoning and planning office at 717-540-6075 or zoning@westhanover.com. We can mail, email or fax you the necessary forms. The zoning ordinance can be found on the website (www.westhanover.com); Home page; Helpful Resources, Codes Online. Zoning – Section 195. Please contact the Planning and Zoning department if you have any questions. The Township staff is available to assist you with any questions, completion of forms or plot plans upon request by appointment only.

BURN PERMITS A Burn Permit is necessary anytime you want to burn on your property. The permits are only valid for one burn. Each individual burn requires a new, signed permit. Burn permits are available at the Township Building and on the Township website. If caught burning without a permit, or burning items that are not allowed, you will be subject to legal action.

COMPLAINTS All complaints must be submitted to the Township in writing on a Township issued Complaint Form. Forms may be picked up at the Township Office, or downloaded from the website at www.westhanover.com. All complaint forms must be filled out completely and signed by the resident. The Township will not investigate any anonymous complaints.

FRIENDLY REMINDER All properties with on-lot septic systems must have their systems pumped every four (4) years. The pumping deadline is based on precincts. There are 4 precincts. If you are unsure of which precinct you are located in, or have any questions, please contact Linda at 717-652-4841 ext. 104. A report from the pumper/hauler must be sent to West Hanover Township. Please call the Township at 717-652-4841, ext. 104 for a complete list of licensed pumper/haulers.

Reminder: Precinct Two is now due for On-lot Septic Pumping.

E-BIKE & ELECTRIC SCOOTER LAWS IN PA: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

With the growing popularity of electric bikes and scooters, West Hanover Township has received many questions regarding their legality and proper use. As we head into the spring and summer months, when outdoor activity naturally increases, we felt this was an appropriate time to share the current laws, rules, and safety guidelines. Our primary goal is to keep everyone in our community safe. We encourage parents and guardians to take time to review these regulations with their children to help prevent accidents, reduce injuries, and ensure that everyone can enjoy the warmer months responsibly. Safety begins with awareness, and a few simple conversations at home can make a significant difference.

Electric Bicycles (E-Bikes): In Pennsylvania, certain e-bikes are legal and are treated the same as traditional bicycles — if they meet the state definition of a “pedalcycle with electric assist.” **To qualify, an e-bike must:** Have fully operable pedals; have a motor of 750 watts or less ; weigh less than 100 pounds; and not exceed 20 mph on motor power alone. **When an e-bike meets these requirements:** It may be ridden on public roads; it may use bike lanes; it generally follows the same rules as a bicycle; and it does not require registration, insurance, or a driver’s license. Riders must obey all traffic laws, ride in the direction of traffic, and signal turns. **Age & Helmet Requirements:** Riders must be at least 16 years old to operate an e-bike; helmets are required for riders under 12 and strongly recommended for everyone. If an electric bike exceeds these specifications (more powerful or faster), it may be classified differently under the vehicle code and could require registration and licensing.

Electric Scooters: Under current Pennsylvania law, **most electric scooters are not legal for use on public roads or sidewalks.** Why? Electric scooters are generally classified as motor-driven cycles under the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code. To be street-legal, a vehicle in this category must be: Titled; insured; registered; inspected; and operated by a licensed driver. Most consumer-grade electric scooters do not meet these equipment and inspection requirements. As a result: They cannot be legally operated on public streets; they cannot be legally ridden on sidewalks; they may be used on private property with permission. **Safety First:** Regardless of the type of device: wear a helmet ; use lights and reflective gear at night; obey traffic laws; avoid distracted riding; ride defensively; and be mindful of pedestrians.

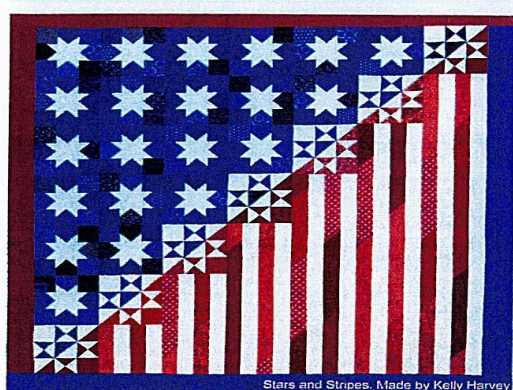

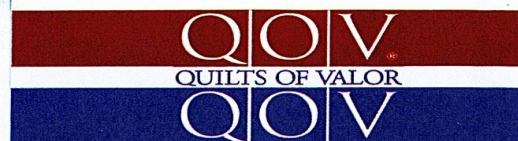
