In 1967 you were settled in and became more serious about your majors. Your Junior year was shaken by the killing of three on campus in February and the assasination of MLK in April. Your lives took a great turn. Your Senior year saw Maceo Nance become your President and you were anxious for May and beginning your careers. I am still here fifty years later giving the "BULLDOG SPIRIT" to another generation ready to face a very different world than you did in 1969. Lamar's is no longer in existance, Alice's has gone, the ROTC unit is smaller, Lowman Hall is no longer a residential hall and "everybody" has a car. Sometines I long for the good old days but I must look ahead. Thank you for your loyalty and love for SCSU and I hope to still be here in 2024, your 55th or 2029, your 60th.
