THE HINGE WITH HARRELL



"Where do you find your worth?"

What a simple question! Where do you find your worth? All of us deal with this question whether we think so or not. We look for our worth in what we do, such as a job or hobby. I grew up collecting basketball cards. I really enjoyed it, but stopped collecting cards two years ago! Today it's difficult to find any basketball cards because of the pandemic. Collectors wait

outside Walmart and Target all night just to have a chance to get a few boxes of cards. That's wild! Sometimes they wait all night and get nothing... nothing. Recently, Target stopped selling trading cards entirely because of an incident at a Wisconsin store. A man was attacked by four other men over the cards he had bought. The fight only stopped after he pulled the gun that he was concealed carrying. The men were arrested on battery and strangulation charges. They almost strangled someone over cards. That's how much worth they put in pieces of laminated paper! They put their worth in a hobby, when their true worth could be found elsewhere.

Often, we look for our worth in other people. Romans 3:23 states that "*All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.*" Throughout the 2010s there was a famous pastor from Hillsong Church. He would go around the world and speak at the largest Christian events. He was loved by millions for his hip new age approach to the Gospel. I saw him in person in 2015. He preached a great sermon that no doubt helped many people! Last year he was relieved of his pastoral position after failing to stay faithful to his wife. It was headline news. Most Christian circles were talking about it. The people it hurt the most were those that were under his preaching. They had put so much worth in how strong this man's faith was, only to be let down. Many of them stepped away from the faith because of the unfaithfulness of one man. They put their worth in other people, when their true worth could be found elsewhere.

Dear friends, as followers of Jesus Christ we should find all our worth in Him. As thousands of angels say in Revelation 5, "*Worthy is the lamb that was slain.*" We are not worthy. Jesus Christ is worthy. He took on our sin, died on the cross, and rose from the dead. He is worthy, we are not. He is the potter; we are only clay. Normally this point is expanded on by going to Matthew 27-28, Mark 15-16, Luke 23-24, John 19-20, one of the 13 or 14 epistles of Paul, or sometimes Malachi. I recommend each of those passages, but I'm going to use Isaiah 52:13 to 53:9 to make this point. In these twelve verses we see the illustration of the suffering servant, Isaiah's allusion to Christ. Isaiah 53:5 says, "But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace; and with his wounds we are healed." (ESV) All our sins were killed along with Jesus, and because of his wounds we are washed clean and healed. Amen! Hallelujah! Because he was worthy, we now have worth. It's important we recognize that our worth is from Christ and not from this world. Do not be deceived, "Worthy is the lamb!" Where do you find your worth? The Service Coordinator must be able to successfully engage with staff, musicians, church members and guests of various age groups and perspectives inside and outside of the church.
