# FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN



<sup>14</sup>Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires. Romans 13:14

While my wife would probably disagree, I do care about my wardrobe and how I look; well, at least, most of the time. When I get up in the morning, I try to match colors (sometimes unsuccessfully) and give consideration to the day that ahead and what outfit will accommodate the tasks ahead. The right outfit not only enables me to get my work done but, perhaps equally important, communicates how I want to be seen by others.

Paul is writing to the church reminding them that the Lord's return is near and that they should be careful about how they "dress" each morning. As well as making

sure their clothing is appropriate and tasteful, they need to make sure when other see them, they should see Jesus. So, the question I have for us is this: How are we "putting on Christ Jesus" when we set out each day?

Some people "wear" Christ like a necklace or WWJD bracelet - a decorative accessory. Christ is there to remind themselves or others that, at some level, they are religious. Whether in the form of a beautifully adorned crucifix or jewel studded object of devotion, Christ must meet their expectations and agenda; what Paul calls the provision for the flesh – their self-indulgence.

Others "wear" Christ in their pocket or purse; like an amulet, key chain, or rabbit's foot. He's secretly hidden away, but readily available in unlikely case anything should arise that the wearer might not be able to "handle themselves."

For others, Christ is not a normal part of their wardrobe at all! He stays tucked safely away in their closet where He won't interfere with their day - "reserved" or imprisoned like a tuxedo or formal gown used only on special occasions. They feel no need to get overly "religious" except on Sunday perhaps, if they don't have other plans and certainly not with their friends who might think they are fanatic about "spiritual stuff."

But for the faithful, the best place to wear Christ, is in their heart. They are totally aware of their need for Him on a constant basis, and, like a credit card, they wouldn't think of "leaving home without him." They have nurtured a relationship with Him and have worn him daily over time. He gives them stability in an everchanging world and is such a part of them, when others see them, they see Christ living in and through them. They realize a sermon seen in the life of a true disciple is a hundred times more convincing than the most theologically based and entertaining oration ever delivered.

Well, how about you? Is Christ dangled around your neck – merely an ostentatious accessory? Is He tucked away in your pocket, safely out of the way but available in case you think you need him? Or have you left Him at home because you're not planning on doing anything "church-y" today? May I give you a friendly word of warning? Don't be like to foolish lamp attendants in Jesus' story of the coming bridegroom who waited until his return to trim their lamps and hurried away to purchase the oil they should have gotten ahead of time. They rushed back only to the door had been closed and locked. Let's "put on Christ" today – in our hearts and in our lives.
