Our Cross Symbolizes Love

"Lift high the Cross, the love of Christ proclaim." When I hear the words of the hymn of our Order, my thoughts go to the cross hanging from a chain around my neck. This cross, which symbolizes Christ's love, is unique to our Order and often elicits comments from strangers about its beauty. How do you respond when someone comments or asks about your cross? Are you able to share the essence of the message engraved on it? Magnanimiter Crucem Sustine... With heart, mind, and spirit uphold and bear the cross. "Then He said to them all," If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me" Luke 9:23.

"Lift the cross, the love of Christ proclaim."

Our cross is described as a Greek fleury cross. The Greek cross has four equal arms, which are said to symbolize the church spreading the gospel to the four compass points: North, South, East, and West. The ends of the arms broaden out into three lobes-fleury or fleurs-de-lis and represent the Holy Trinity.

We wear the cross of The Order as a reminder of our vows promising to obey the two Rules of The Order and to offer support to the clergy for the good of the parish and the extension of Christ's Kingdom.

We welcome new visiting guests to our church on Sunday with a mini loaf of bread made with love. We also make prayer shawls and quilts for babies that are being baptized and to comfort those who are ill. We pray daily for the world, church family, and all that have asked for prayers.
