
COMMODORE'S BALL

ELOCHOMON MARINA DOCK PROJECT

The marina has moved all the boats from D dock in preparation for replacing the finger piers. The electrical wiring, plumbing, and most of the cleats have been removed. The new docks should come next week and work will start as soon as the permits are finalized.

NEW DREDGE

Port District one has purchased a small suction dredge from the Rose City Yacht Club. The dredge did not come with hose or any other equipment, but given the amount of time dredging permits take there should be plenty of time to get set up. The City of Cathlamet and Port One both own sections of the old sewer ponds, and the City council recently put allowing the Port to use the ponds for dredged material disposal on their agenda.

AROUND THE RIVER

FERRY OSCAR B BREAKDOWN

The ferry OSCAR B was out of service from the middle of December until the end of January. When the winter freshet began in the Willamette a great deal of floating debris came down the river. This debris

got sucked into the cooling water intakes, clogging them up and causing the generators to overheat. When the gensets shut down the ferry lost steering. This happened in the middle of the channel more than once, and was very difficult to fix. The ferry had to be hauled out in Vancouver for conversion from sea chest cooling to keel coolers. When this work was done and the boat came back down to Puget Island it was discovered that the shaft seals had failed and were leaking. This meant that the boat had to wait for parts to be delivered for repairs. Hopefully there won't be any more problems from now on.

SMELT RUN

A fairly good smelt return again this year allowed the fisheries department to open a brief six hour season in the Cowlitz river where 16,700 dip netters caught about 140,000 pounds of fish. There are eagles, sea lions and seagulls all along the river after them as well. An opening in the Sandy river is being considered by the ODFW.

PORT WESTWARD/ BEAVER TERMINAL

North Dakota Crude Oil is no longer being loaded from trains at the terminal near the Portland General Electric power plant. The owners of the facility have announced that they may start shipping ethanol instead. There is a lot of construction going on at the pier, and it looks like when the work is completed very large ships would be able to tie up there. No announcement has been made as to why such a long mooring facility is being constructed.
