

COMET NEOWISE

The Comet Neowise has been visible in the northern sky after sunset this month, and should be visible through the end of July. Look for it in the northern sky just below the Big Dipper. Use binoculars or telescope if you want to see the tail, or if you have a telephoto camera take a picture of that part of the sky, experimenting with different optical zooms. We have a new moon coming up so the nights will be nice and dark for a while.

AROUND THE RIVER

FISHING

The Columbia River above Tongue point is open for hatchery Chinook and Steelhead at least until July 31.

WESTPORT FERRY

The Puget Island to Westport, Oregon ferry OSCAR B is back to running the full schedule. The first run is at 5:00am from Puget Island and the last run is at 10:15 from Westport. The ferry leaves hourly from Puget Island on the hour and leaves Westport 15 minutes after the hour.

FUEL DOCKS

The Martha Rose is heated by diesel heat in the winter time so each summer we have to call around to the fuel docks to check on price and availability. The most economical choice is different each year, depending on how much the docks are charging, how much fuel we need and how much have to burn up to get there. This will redirect you to our page at "Yacht Destinations". The "details" tab will be selected and you will see a list of the yacht clubs that welcome our members. Clicking the name of the club will bring up that clubs website. "INFO" will bring up what that club offers in the way of facilities, guest moorage and much more. If you click the map icon you will get a google earth picture of exactly where that club is. If you choose the "Map" tab you will bring up a google earth satellite picture showing the location of all the clubs we have on our list. This is a cool feature if you are cruising in your boat and want to find a nearby yacht club to visit.
