AROUND THE RIVER

MARINA DREDGING

The Elochoman marina has completed repairs to their dredging equipment and is ready to begin dredging. However, by the time they got all the permits together the allowable dredging months were over and they will have to wait until November to begin work. So we will have one more summer of the shallow spot between the fuel dock and the end of "F" Dock.

SHIPPING GLUT

You may have noticed that recently there have been as many as 12 empty ships at anchor in Astoria, with many more all along the river to Portland. This is because there has been a "shipping bubble" which has burst. In 2006, at the same time that banks were loaning huge amounts of money to home buyers and real estate developers, Big Banks, mostly European, especially German, were lending billions of dollars to shipping lines to build ships, including the container ships and bulk carriers we see on the river. Since it takes years to design and build ships, many brand new ships are still being launched. However, the amount of cargo to be shipped has not increased to meet the new capacity available. This has resulted in shipping lines having to wait weeks or months for cargo for their ships, and even the bankruptcy of Hanjin Shipping, the seventh largest container shipping company in the world.
