STEAMBOAT SLOUGH MOORINGS

The replacement mooring anchors and balls have been installed in Steamboat Slough.

Here is a report on the project from Bill Kostich:

Being a part of a yacht club means a lot of things. Friendships, time together, boating, and service, among other things, is what makes the Cathlamet Yacht Club so enjoyable to so many.

Every year, aside from having fun, our club does its best to provide some type of service project to the marina or the surrounding area as a way of contributing to the community we call home. This year, the club completed a wonderful service project by installing two new mooring balls in Steamboat Slough.

The mooring ball "outpost" is a great way to encourage boaters to get out and enjoy the river. The idea behind the project was to offer a safe, reliable system that would provide moorage away from the marina without having to deploy an anchor.

The project included many steps. We began last year with a depth sounding of the area to determine the best location in the slough. Over the last several months, designs for anchors were drawn and revised until we settled on a winner. Then, the construction of the anchors took place to include the cutting, welding, anchor construction, and the chains. The mooring balls were purchased using funds provided by the club.


The installation first involved the removal of two old mooring balls in the slough. No one knew the reliability of these systems, so we thought best to remove them. To do that, CYC member Ross Zeigler and a team dove on the old mooring systems and removed them from the bottom of the river. About a week later, another team of individuals took the new mooring systems out to the designated location in the slough and installed them.

The mooring balls are individually secured by a mushroom style anchor and 3/8 inch chain which passes through a brand-new reflective ball. The end of the chain has a shackle on it too large to drop through the hole in the ball. To moor your boat: You will need a mooring line at least 20 feet long secured to a

cleat on deck. Grab the shackle with your boathook. Lift the shackle and chain up through the ball far enough to pass the free end of the mooring line through the shackle. Pull the mooring line back to your mooring cleat. Ease off the mooring line until the shackle is resting on top of the buoy and your line has some slack in it, cleat it off, and you are safely secured.

As with all the Cathlamet Yacht Club projects, this was a huge team effort led by the Vice Commodore, Bud Radke. Other contributors include: Kopi and Dean Carmine, Fritz Carmine, Dan Glenn, Brett Deaton, Warren Staples, Rich Trachi, Cherry Ann Kolbenschlag, Ross Zeiger and Sophie Park, Jim Bucklin, and Bill Kostich. A very special thanks to Dean and Fritz Carmine for the use of their amazing shops and to Jackie and the Port for letting us use their skiff boat to install the mooring systems.

FINDING THE NEW MOORINGS

The new moorings are located in one of the most protected anchorages in the lower river. To enter Steamboat Slough from the upstream or Cathlamet end, simply line up your boat so you can see down the slough and stay in the middle. When the channel begins to curve to port favor the outboard or northeast side of the slough because a point bar has built up in the turn and it is shallower on the

southwest side. To enter from the downstream end start in the ship channel at marker "33" and head for Skamokawa Landing, the large white building on the north side. Stay on the north side past the Landing and the two story house then go down the middle to the turn. The moorings are in over 20 feet of water.
