Coordinator of Expansion and Growth Seth Melchor, Bowling Green '10 began expansion efforts at Oklahoma State University in the fall semester of 2013; fellow staff member Connor Gau, Chico State '11 provided follow up support later on during the expansion efforts. 41 men went through a Pledge Ceremony in September of 2013. The group was officially colonized by Curtiss Norman, Northwood '12 in November of 2013. 31 men were initiated in February 2014. The group met initial recruitment difficulties in the spring of 2014 semester, but was crowned as OSU Homecoming champion in fall of 2014.

On January 30, 2016 the Eta Alpha Chapter held their chartering ceremony in the Student Union Ballroom. Mike Waters, Oregon State '73 conducted the ceremony with assistance from staff member Scott Rarick, Capital '10. Also in attendance was Jessica Grace, Alpha Sigma Phi Graduate Assistant; Ival Gregory, Manager of Fraternity and Sorority Affairs and Joey Yost (GCA), Ohio Wesleyan '05.





ETA BETA CHAPTER SAN JOSE STATE

FOUNDED ON SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 21, 2015

Coordinator of Expansion and Growth Connor Gau, Chico State '11, began expansion efforts at San Jose State University in the fall semester of 2013. Fellow staff member Seth Melchor, Bowling Green '10, provided follow-up support later on during the expansion efforts. Thirty-five men went through the Pledge Ceremony in September of 2013 and were initiated in December of 2014. The group was officially colonized by Cory Ryan, Wake Forest '10, in November of 2014. Matt Weido, San Jose State '13, was hired to join Fraternity Staff beginning in July of 2015.

The group chartered on November 21, 2015. Hon. Robert Kutz, California '67, gave the Keynote Address and presented the charter. Coordinator of Chapter Development Adam Stahon, Westminster '12, represented Fraternity Staff. Benjamin Galeana, San Jose State '13, was the Founding President.

ETA GAMMA CHAPTER SOUTHERN ILLINOIS

FOUNDED ON SATURDAY, DECEMBER 12, 2015

Coordinator of Expansion and Growth Beau Loendorf, Colorado State '11, began expansion efforts at Southern Illinois University in the fall semester of 2013. Fellow staff member Dylan Dunne, Grand Valley '10, provided follow up support later on during the expansion efforts. Fifteen men went through the Pledge Ceremony in November of 2014. Coordinator of Expansion and Growth Ryan Kolter, UW - Whitewater '12, traveled to campus to provide additional recruitment support and help bolster the group. The men were recognized as a colony in February of 2014.

The men of the Eta Gamma Colony had a cumulative 2.74 GPA in spring 2015. While this was above the required benchmark, the men made improvement in academic performance their top priority in 2015-2016 by developing a detailed plan to raise their GPA to 2.9 by the end of the academic year.

Eta Gamma Chapter was founded on December 12, 2015, in ceremonies in the Auditorium of the Southern Illinois University Library. Undergraduate Grand Councilor Sam Harris, Wayne State '12 and Oakland '13, presented the charter. CJ Graziano represented the Fraternity Staff. Zachary Rheinecker, Southern Indiana '04, gave the Alumni Address. Eric Secrist, Southern Illinois '14, was the Founding President.

The Eta Gamma Chapter has participated in several social and intramural activities since fall 2013. The men have participated in flag football, volleyball and basketball. In the spring of 2016, the men won the prestigious Theta Xi competition with Alpha Gamma Delta Sorority, a 65 year old variety show. In the spring of 2017, Eta Gamma won the Greek League Intramural Volleyball tournament. It is reported that consistently over 90% of their chapter either plays or attends the intramural events. As for social events, the men have hosted social events with several sororities on campus, most notably a Pajama Party with Delta Phi Epsilon in spring 2015.

In the summer of 2018, Eta Gamma secured a chapter facility at 505 West Main Street and is one of the largest on campus. It houses 15 men throughout the year. The home is compiled of nine bedrooms with four bathrooms and two kitchens.

Due to risk management concerns early in the fall of 2014, the provisional chapter was closed and currently stands as inactive.

Nineteen men participated in the Pledge Ceremony in January of 2014 and 16 men were initiated in April of 2014. The group was colonized by Cory Ryan, Wake Forest '10, in March of 2014.

In September of 2018, the Fraternity made the decision to close the Eta Epsilon Provisional Chapter due to declining membership and low morale.

ETA ZETA CHAPTER CENTRAL ARKANSAS

FOUNDED ON SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 8, 2018

Coordinator of Expansion and Growth Dylan Dunne, Grand Valley '10, led expansion efforts at the University of Central Arkansas in the spring semester of 2014. Fellow staff member Beau Loendorf, Colorado State '11, provided follow-up support later on during the expansion efforts. After a turbulent expansion effort, where several founding fathers found themselves at odds with each other over social issues, 15 men participated in the Initiation Ceremony in April of 2014 and the group was colonized that same month.

In April of 2016, Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity Headquarters halted the operations and sent a suspension notice to the Eta Zeta Colony. Under direction and guidance of Fraternity Headquarters, the colony was re-organized in the fall of 2016.

*The term "colony" was replaced by "provisional chapter" at the 2016 Grand Chapter in Norfolk, Virginia.

During the fall 2016 semester, Coordinator of Expansion and Growth Josh Dusing, South Florida '13, led re-organization efforts at the University. Following the recruitment efforts, Coordinator of Chapter Development Logan Ishimine, Arizona '14, provided developmental support to the interest group at the University of Central Arkansas. Twenty-three men were initiated, joining the three remaining men in the interest group. The men were initiated on November 26, 2016 and the Provisional Chapter Ceremony was held. Members from the Delta Tau Chapter at Murray State University assisted in the execution of the Initiation Ceremony.

At the 55th Grand Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi in Indianapolis, Indiana, Eta Zeta was awarded a Bronze Cup as well as the Victor B. Scott award, given to chapters with the highest GPA on their campus.

The Chartering Ceremony occurred on September 8, 2018 at McCastlain Hall in the McCastlain East Commons Ballroom in Conway, Arkansas. Keynote speakers included Grand Councilor Aaron Bullock, Wake Forest '09, and Chapter President Carl Ratliff, Central Arkansas '16. Logan Ishimine, Arizona '14, represented Fraternity Staff.

FOUNDED ON SATURDAY, AUGUST 29, 2015

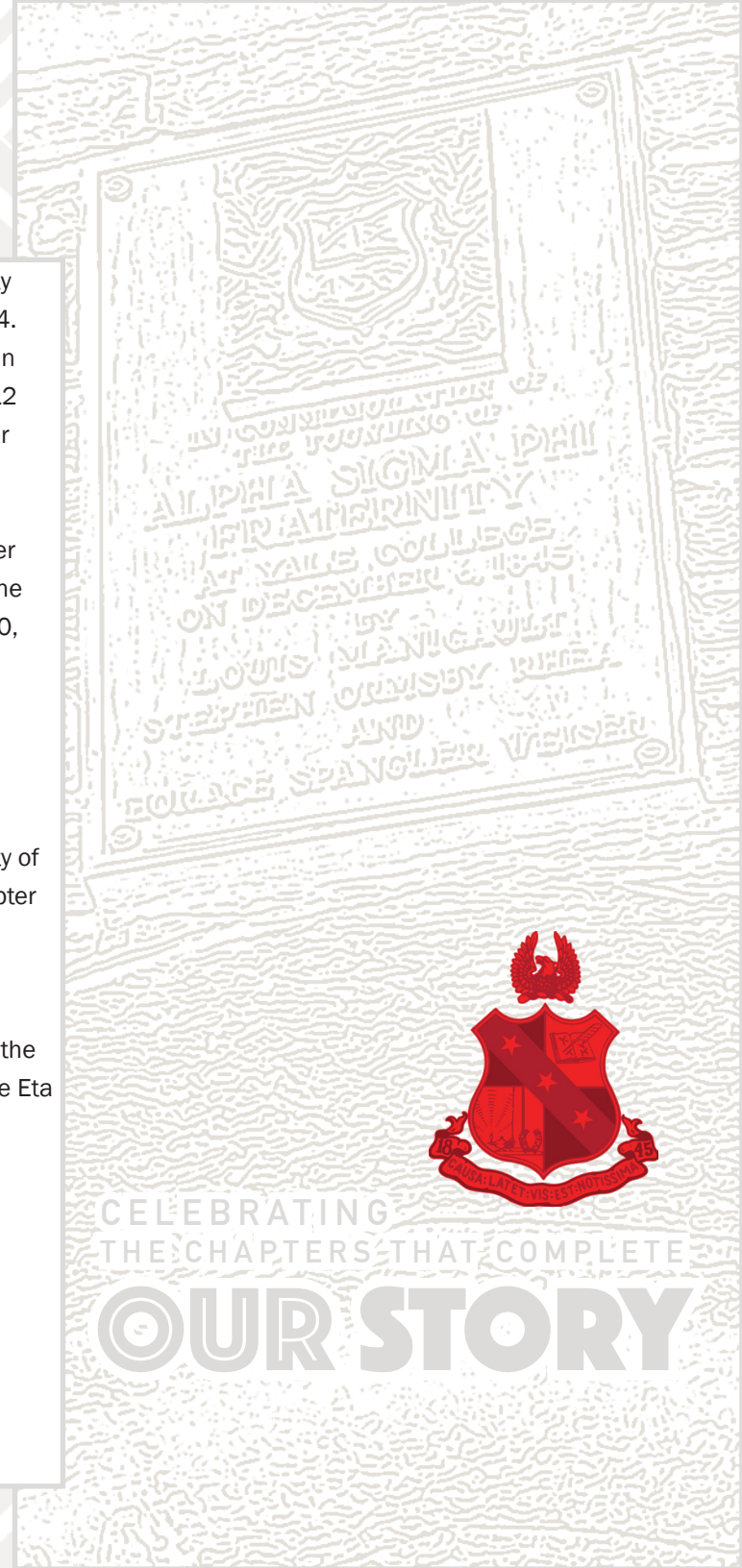
Coordinator of Expansion and Growth Beau Loendorf, Colorado State '11 led expansion efforts at the University of Texas at Austin in the spring semester of 2014. 29 men participated in a Pledge Ceremony in March of 2014. Director of Chapter Development Danny Miller arrived on campus shortly after to host officer elections and train provisional chapter leadership. Staff members Curtiss Norman, Northwood '12 and Ryan Kolter, Whitewater '12 initiated 26 men and colonized the group in April of 2014. In the spring 2015 semester, the provisional chapter secured chapter housing at 1909 San Gabriel Street and was approved to charter as the Eta Eta chapter.

Eta Eta officially chartered on Saturday, August 29, 2015. The Ceremony was held at the Student Activity Center in the South Ballroom. Grand Councilor Mark Still, Washington '75, gave the Keynote Address and presented the group with their charter. Steven Zizzo, Illinois '84, gave the Alumni Address. Carlton Matthews, Murray State '10, represented Fraternity Staff. Benjamin Tuggle, Texas '14, was the founding president.

In April of 2018, the Eta Eta Chapter was suspended due to continued brotherhood, recruitment, financial and housing concerns.

In the fall of 2018, Coordinator of Expansion Danny Thiakos, Arizona '15, led expansion efforts at the University of Texas to revitalize the Eta Eta Chapter. By the end of the semester, 12 men were initiated into the Eta Eta Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity.

The Eta Eta Chapter did not meet the constitutional requirement to have representation at the 2019 Elevate educational program. The Chapter was suspended and appealed the decision. The appeal was successful but the undergraduates made the decision to not accept the terms of the appeal and decided to cease operations. The Eta Eta Chapter will return to Texas in fall 2023.

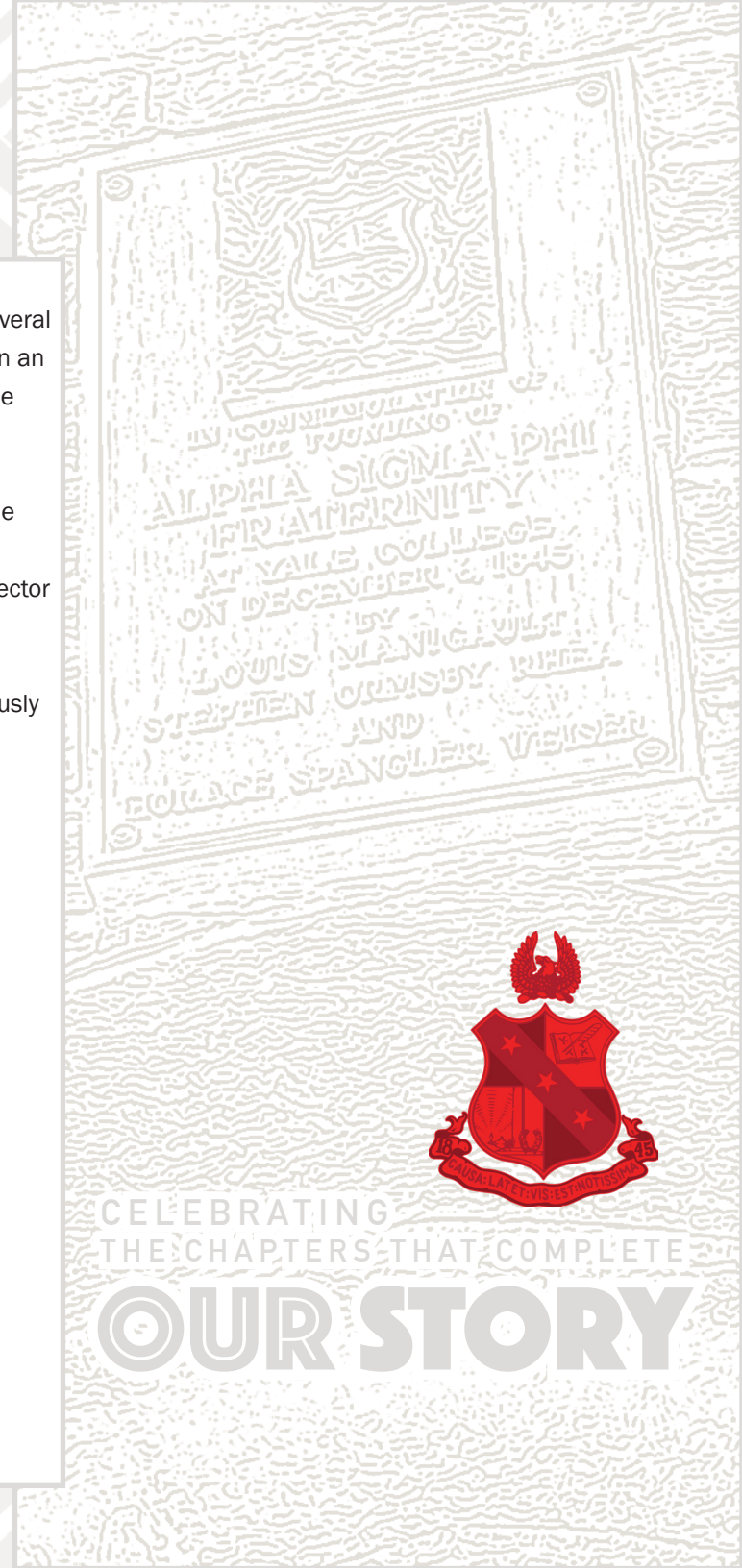
ETA THETA CHAPTER UT-SAN ANTONIO

Coordinator of Expansion and Growth member Seth Melchor, Bowling Green '10 led expansion efforts at the University of Texas at San Antonio in the spring semester of 2014. After a turbulent expansion effort, where several founding fathers found themselves at odds with each other over fraternity vision issues, 12 men participated in an initiation ceremony, led by staff members Curtiss Norman and Ryan Kolter, Whitewater '12 in April of 2014. The group was colonized in April of 2014.

The group officially chartered on November 4, 2017 and became the Eta Theta Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi. The ceremony was held at the Tribute at the Rim Sky Lounge in San Antonio, TX. Keynote speakers included Grand Councilor Scott Grissom, Oklahoma '78, and Founding President, Jose Allende, UT San Antonio '15. Senior Director of Alumni Engagement, Danny Miller, was also in attendance.

The Eta Theta Chapter was closed on November 4, 2019 due to financial delinquency. The Chapter was previously on the Charter review status but did not meet multiple deadlines for payments. The Eta Theta Chapter will be tentatively re-started in fall 2023.

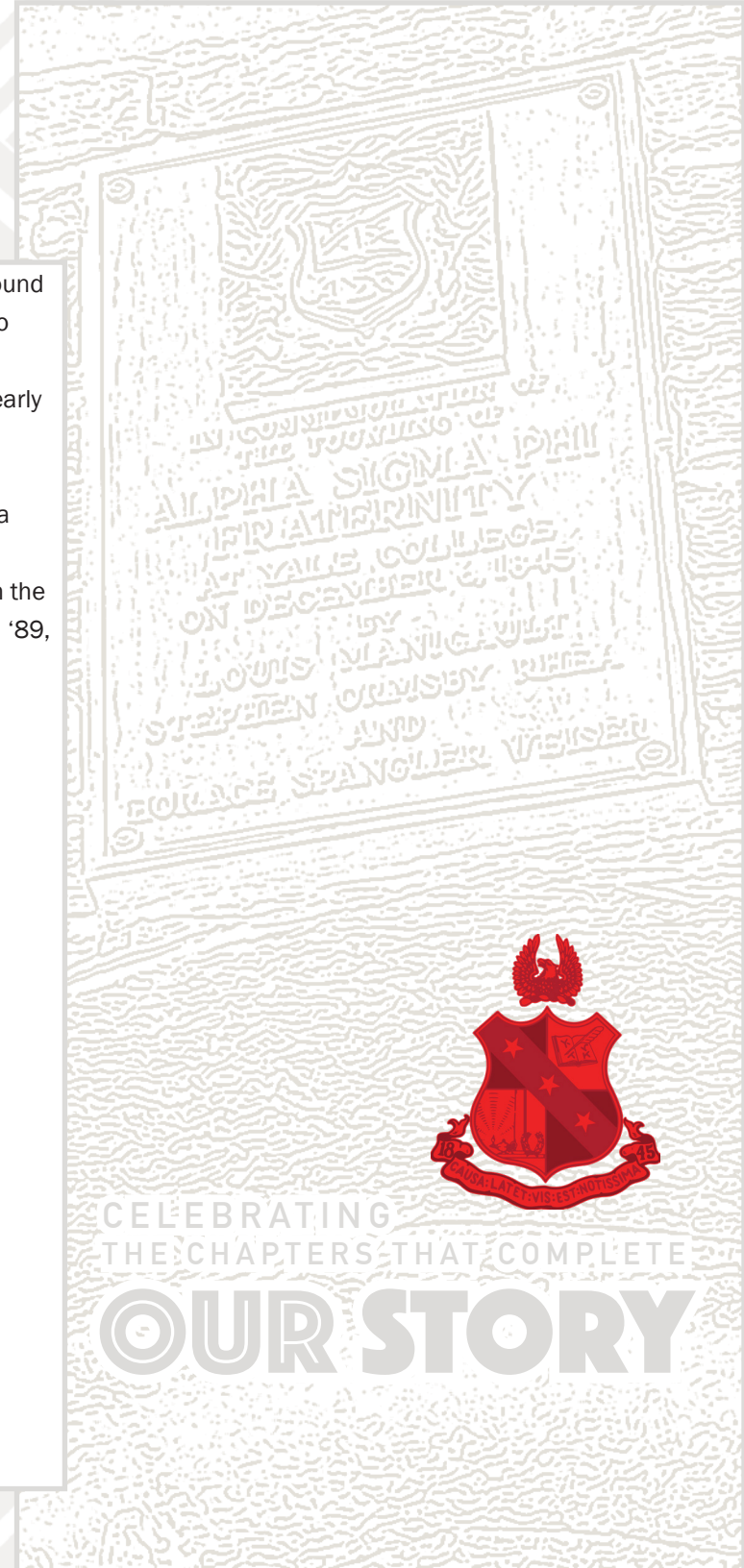
ETA KAPPA CHAPTER NORTH CAROLINA

FOUNDED ON SATURDAY, APRIL 25, 2015

In the spring of 2014, a sizable interest group at UNC-Chapel Hill approached Alpha Sigma Phi with intent to found a colony on their campus. Fraternity staff members Connor Gau, Chico State '11 and Robbie Layman, Colorado State '11 traveled to UNC-Chapel Hill, leading expansion efforts and recruiting a total of 67 men as founding fathers. The group was colonized in April of 2014 by Doug Jones, Cornell '07. The colony found great success early on during its history and was soon approved to charter.

The Eta Kappa Colony at the University of North Carolina chartered on April 25, 2015, becoming the Eta Kappa Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi. The ceremony was held at Top of the Hill Restaurant. The keynote speaker was Grand Councilor Jeff Hoffman, Member-at-Large '76. Staff member Connor Gau, Chico State '11, assisted with the ceremony. President and CEO Gordy Heminger, Bowling Green '96, and Grand Councilor Bernie Schulz, Radford '89, were in attendance. Alums from Western Carolina, East Carolina, Indiana and Colorado were also present. Eta Kappa's President at the time was Connor DeHaven, North Carolina '14.

The Chapter closed in fall 2021 due to University code of conduct violations.

With the five members unable to build momentum, Fraternity Staff member Jason H. Nolen-Doerr, Murray State '05, visited campus to reinvigorate the group. Moderate success was had and the group conducted its first Initiation Ceremony on April 30, 2012.

On January 15, 2015, the group officially chartered. The Ceremony was held at the Oakland Center. Grand Councilor Bryan Proctor, Grand Valley '96, gave the Keynote Address and presented the group with their charter. Scott Woodfill, Grand Valley '08, represented Fraternity Staff. Andrew Makar, Central Michigan '93, gave the Alumni Address. Sam Harris, Wayne State '12 and Oakland '13, was the Founding President.

The chartering brought with it even more historical significance, as Alpha Sigma Phi reached 100 active chapters for the first time in the Fraternity's long and storied history.

Jeremy Horne, Ohio Wesleyan, '08 launched the initial expansion effort at Cameron University in August, 2011. Alpha Sigma Phi was the second NIC fraternity on-campus which threatened the other fraternity, Sigma Tau Gamma, causing some tensions between the two groups. Three men went through the first Pledge Ceremony on August 28, 2011. The group was officially colonized on December 3, 2011 and the first Initiation Ceremony was conducted on February 2, 2012 for six members. The colony enters fall of 2012 with 10 Initiated members.

The Eta Rho Provisional Chapter was chartered on April 19, 2015, becoming the Eta Rho Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi. The ceremony took place at Cameron University's McCasland Ballroom. The keynote speaker was Grand Councilor Sam Harris, Wayne State '12, Oakland '14. Staff member Ryan Kolter, Whitewater '12, assisted with the ceremony. Eta Rho's President at the time was T.C. ETA CHI CHAPTER MOREHEAD STATE

FOUNDED ON SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 6, 2016

Morehead State University began as a “normal school” (an institution created to train high school graduates to be teachers) in 1887 before transitioning to a public school in 1923. It became a general college in 1948 and a full university in 1966. It is the easternmost public university in Kentucky and serves one of the most disadvantaged regions in the United States.

Assistant Director of Expansion and Growth L.T. Piver, Chico State '11, led expansion efforts at Morehead State University during the 2015 spring semester. Twenty-nine men participated in a Pledge Ceremony in March of 2015 and the group was colonized in April of 2015. The Colony President was JD Cook, Morehead State '15.

On February 6, 2016, the Eta Chi Chapter held their chartering ceremony in the Carl D. Perkins Community Center. Undergraduate Grand Councilor Sam Harris, Wayne State '12 and Oakland '13, conducted the Ceremony with assistance from staff member L.T. Piver, Chico State '11. Eta Chi Grand Chapter Advisor Douglas Triplett, Marshall '96, and Faculty Advisor Paul Hicks, were also in attendance.

Eta Chi had a number of satellite houses - “The Circle” at 209 McClure Circle; “The Pink House”, a long time Gamma Phi Beta house, at 306 N Wilson Drive; and “The Green House” at 1311 E Main Street - before settling on an official, CLVEN rented property at 1100 US 60 W, a former Pi Kappa Alpha house.

After rebounding from a post-charter lull in fraternity spirits with pushes for increased recruitment, GPA, and campus involvement, the chapter won the Fraternity & Sorority Life Most Improved Chapter award in 2018. The chapter’s newsletter is “The Eta Chi Eagle.”

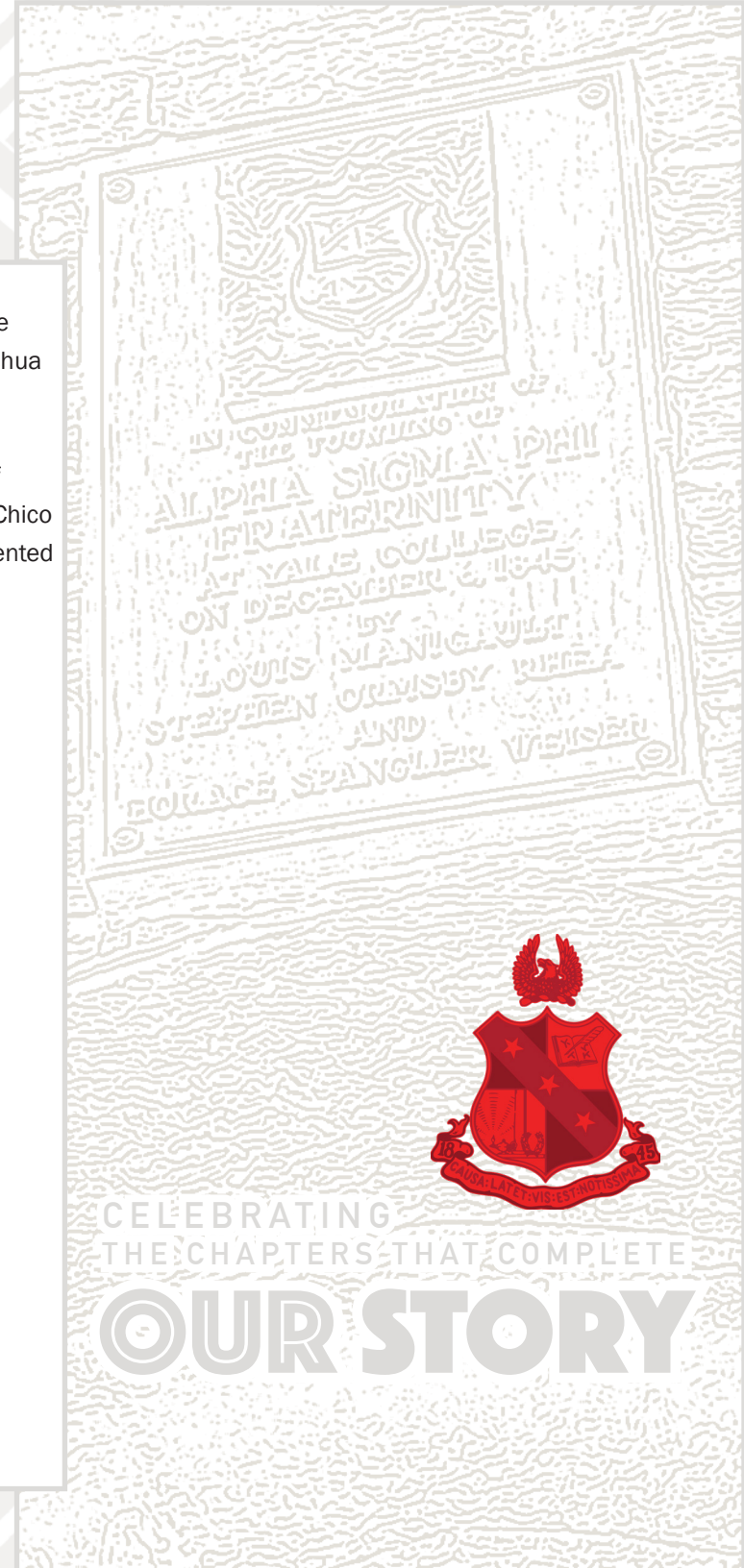


ETA PSI CHAPTER WRIGHT STATE

Undergraduate Grand Councilor Logan Dunnigan, Salem State '13, presented the group with their charter. Joshua Schoeff, Wright State '15, was the founding president.
