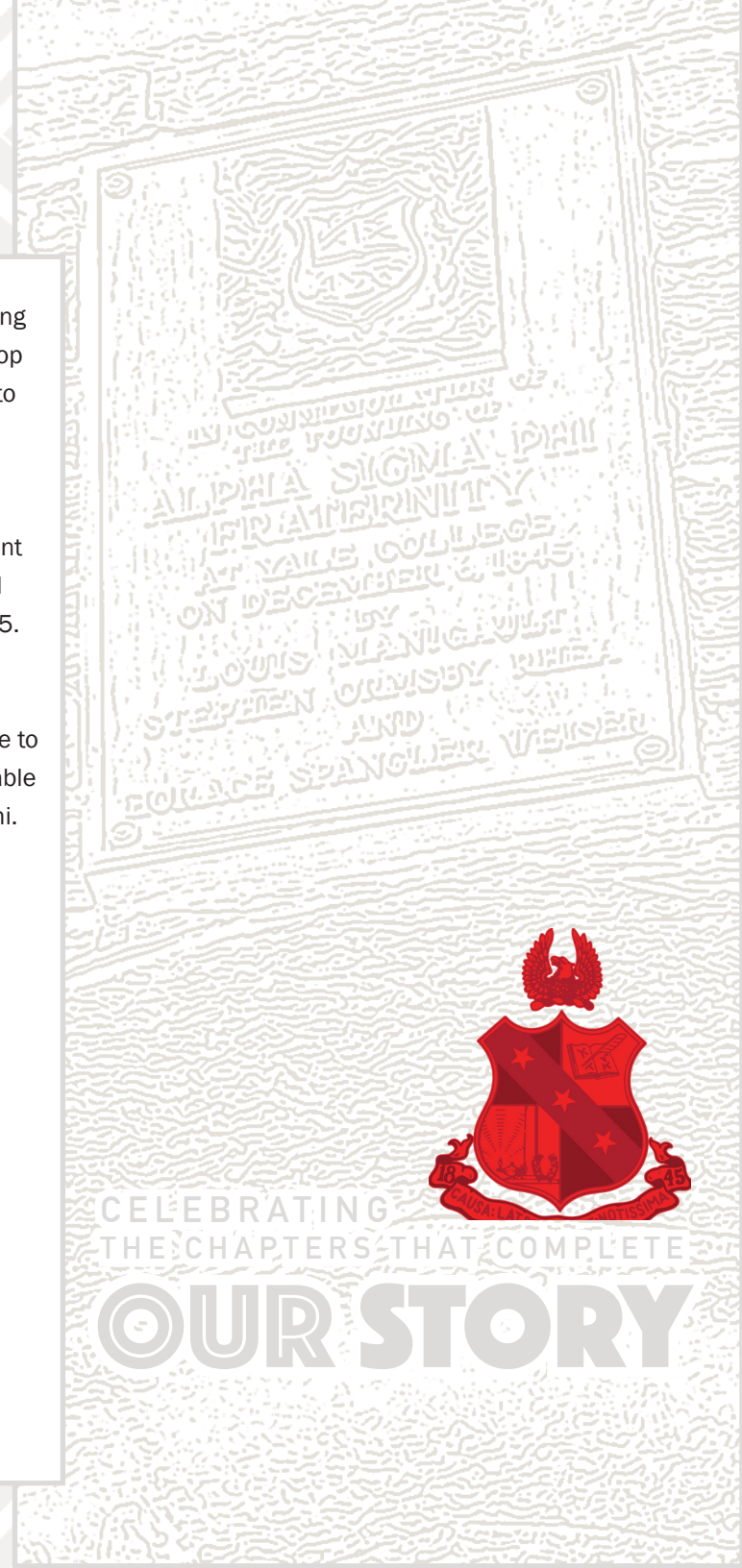

An Interest Group at the University of Stirling began in the fall of 2014 when Marcus Deniz-Heyer, Stirling '15 contacted Fraternity Headquarters. Deniz-Heyer was the best friend of Omar El-Sharawy, McGill '14, the founding President of the Eta Nu Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi at McGill University. The Interest Group continued to develop throughout the late fall of 2014 and early spring of 2015. Four men from the Provisional Chapter were invited to attend international leadership programs in St. Louis, MO in January of 2015.

In April of 2015, Assistant Director of Undergraduate Engagement, Cory Ryan, Wake Forest '10 and Assistant Director of Expansion & Growth LT Piver, Chico State '11 visited the University of Stirling to continue recruitment efforts and development of the Interest Group. The group was officially installed as the Theta Alpha Provisional Chapter on April 9th, 2015 and twenty-two members went through the initiation ceremony on April 10-11, 2015. The Theta Alpha Provisional Chapter is the first expansion for Alpha Sigma Phi outside of North America.

In November of 2017, the undergraduate men of the Theta Alpha Provisional Chapter and Fraternity Staff came to a mutual agreement to cut ties with the Provisional Chapter as the Alpha Sigma Phi experience was not replicable in Scotland. The thirty-three men who were initiated into Theta Alpha will always be brothers of Alpha Sigma Phi.

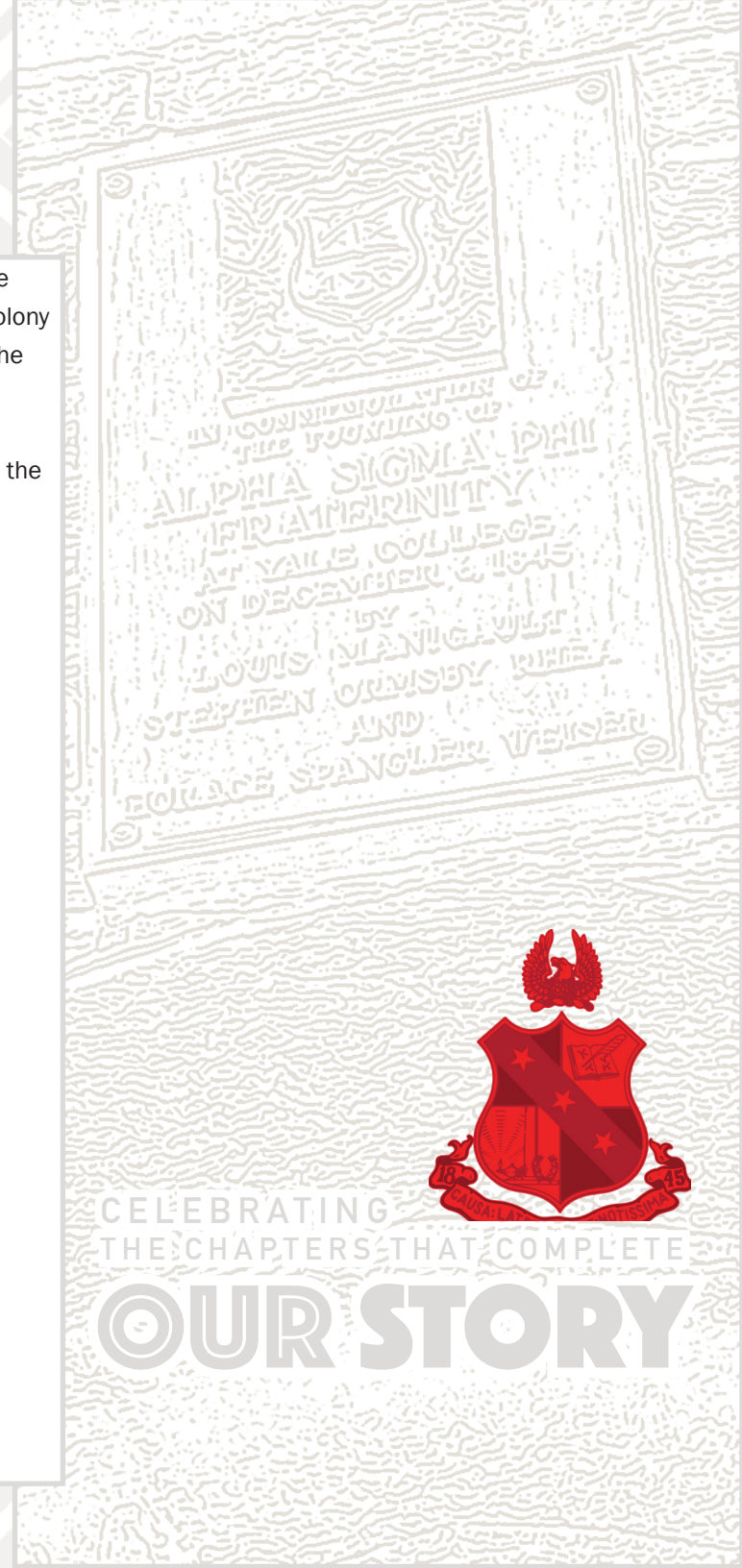
THETA BETA CHAPTER

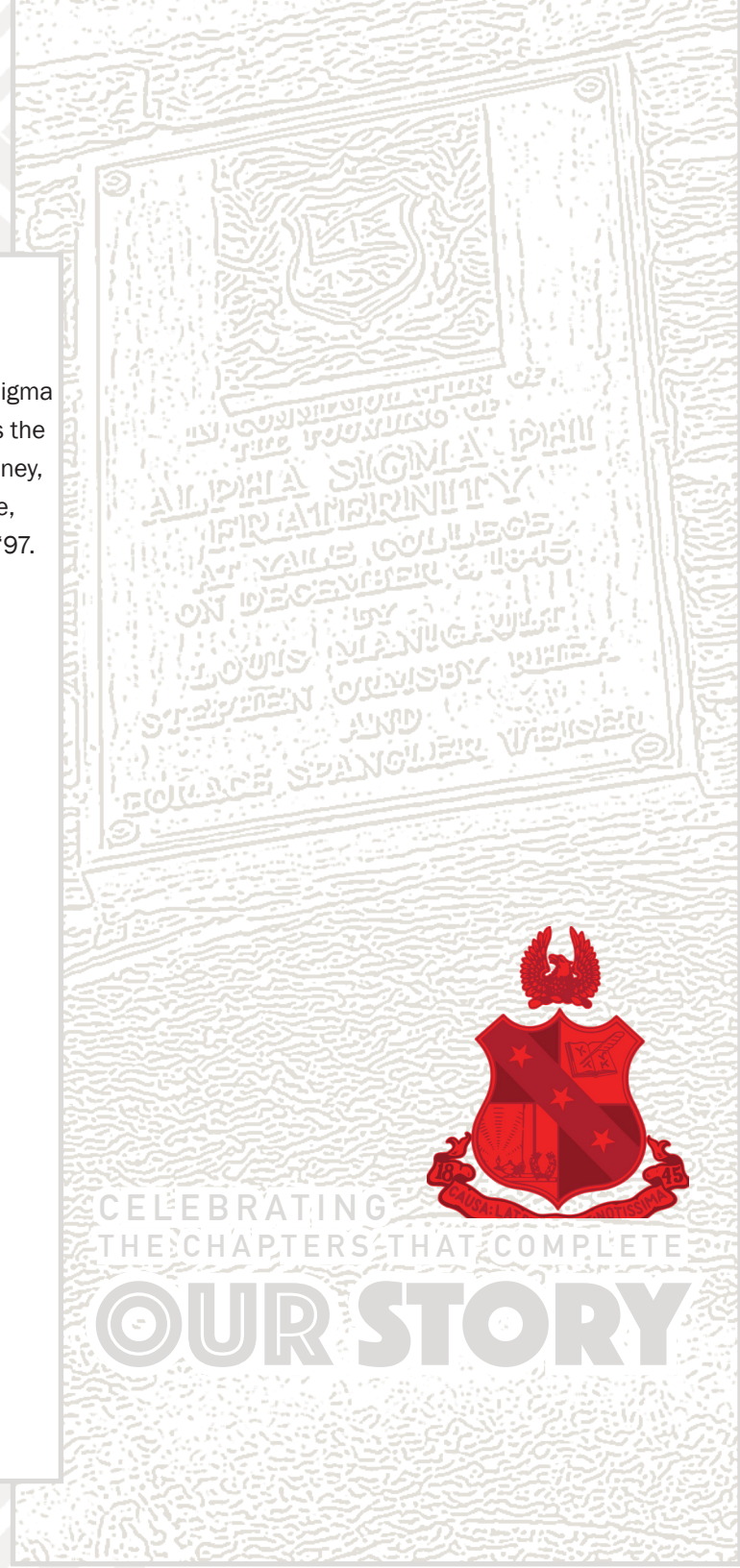


THETA KAPPA CHAPTER UNC - WILMINGTON

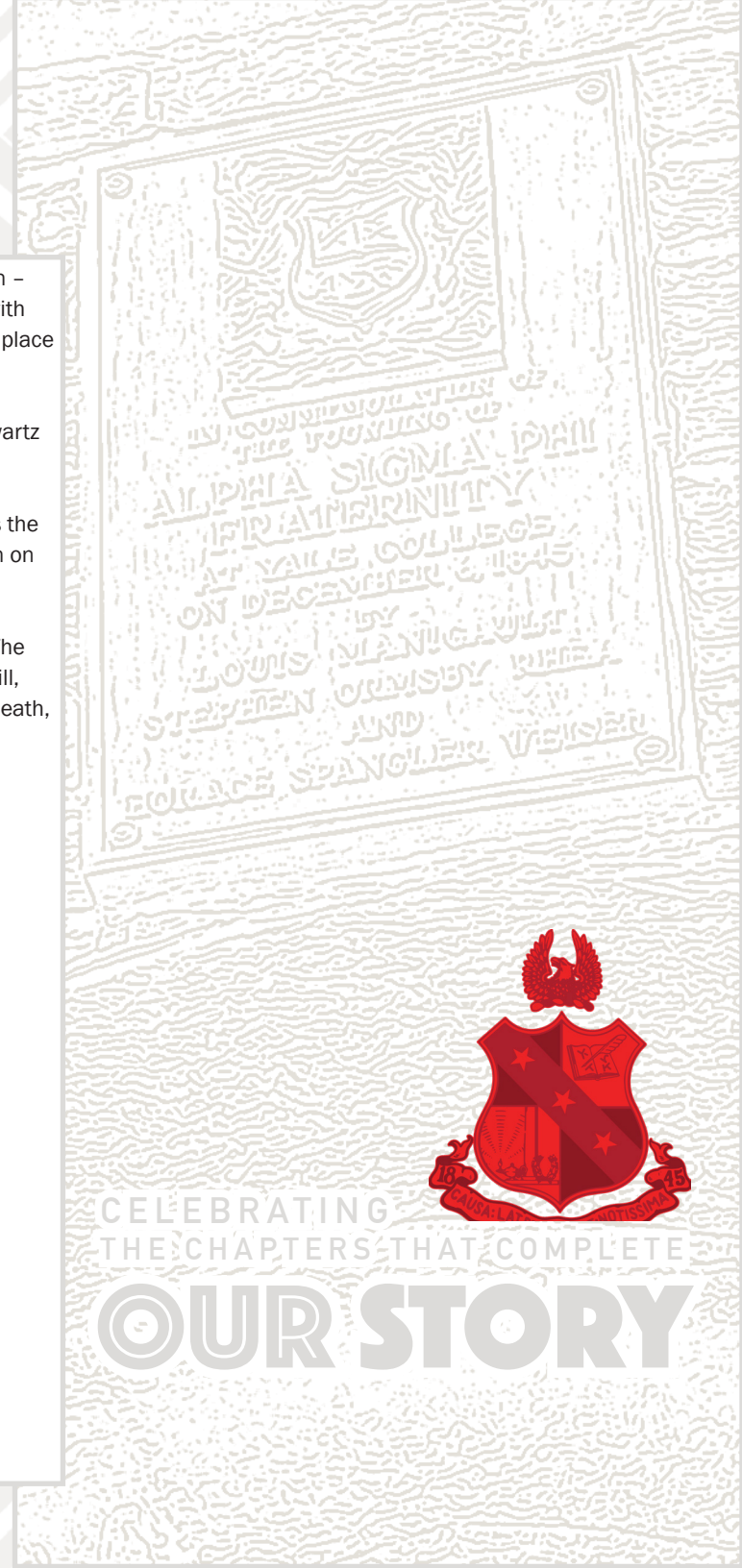

THETA RHO CHAPTER

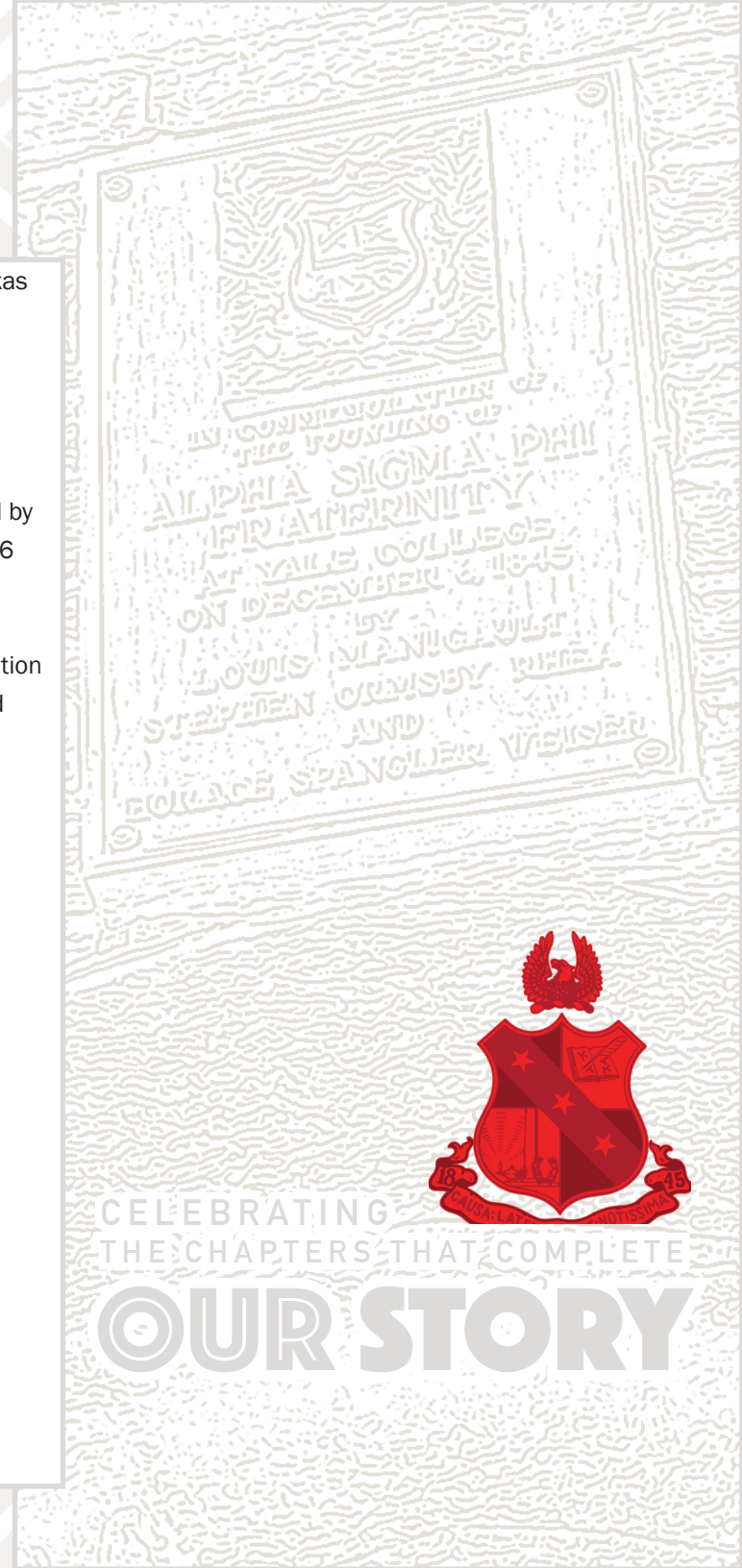
TEXAS A&M

THETA SIGMA CHAPTER BRIDGEPORT

The University of Bridgeport was founded in 1927 and was the first chartered junior college in New England. Upper division course work and degrees were authorized and the name changed to University of Bridgeport in 1947. Theta Sigma, founded on October 4, 1947, was the first local fraternity established at the University of Bridgeport.

On November 14, 1970, Theta Sigma was chartered as the Theta Sigma Chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi by Grand Senior President Robert E. Miller, Connecticut '49. Difficulties of the Vietnam War era, and the problems that led the locals to seek national affiliation, prevented the Chapter from obtaining a firm footing and it closed in 1974. The roster contains 35 names.

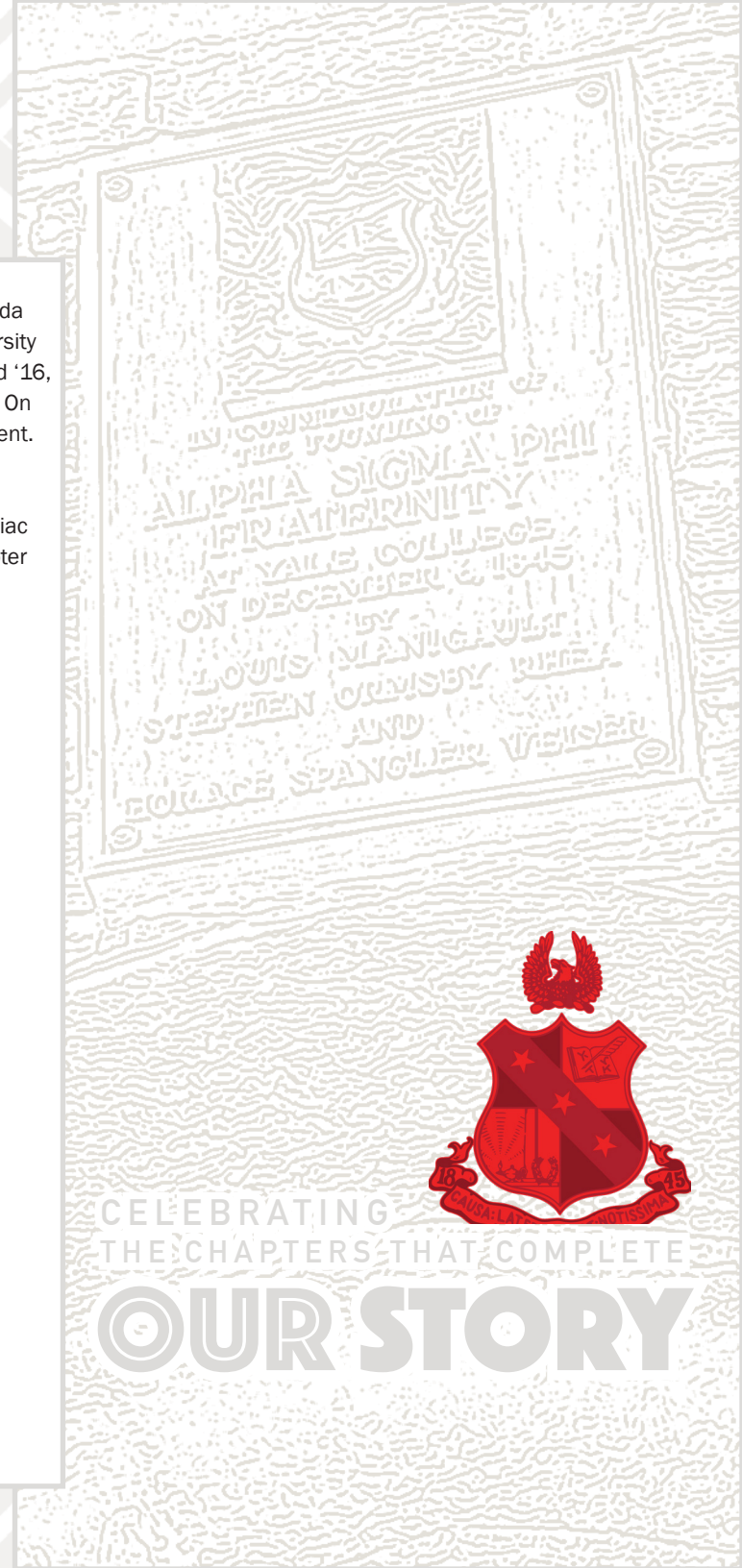


THETA TAU CHAPTER QUINNIPIAC

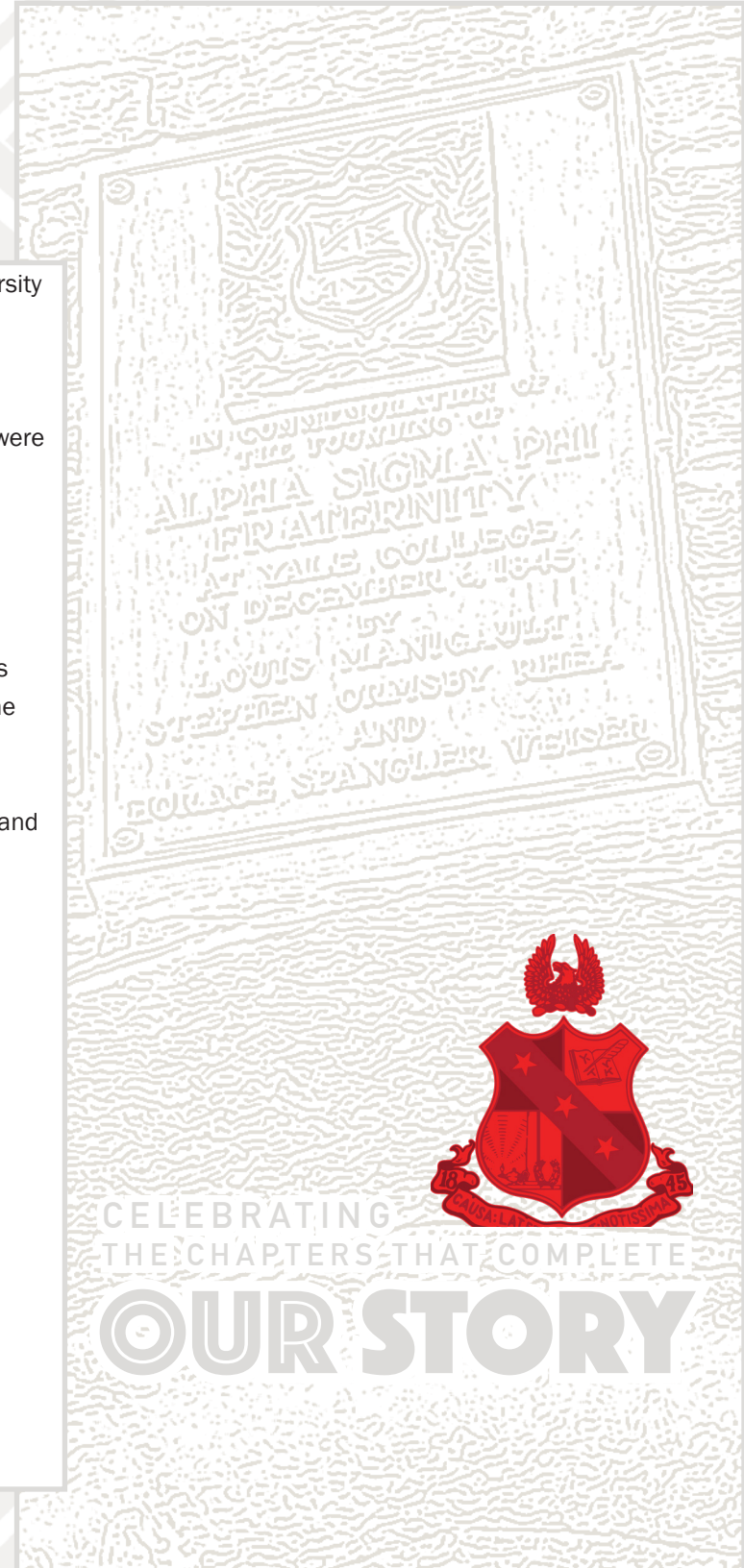

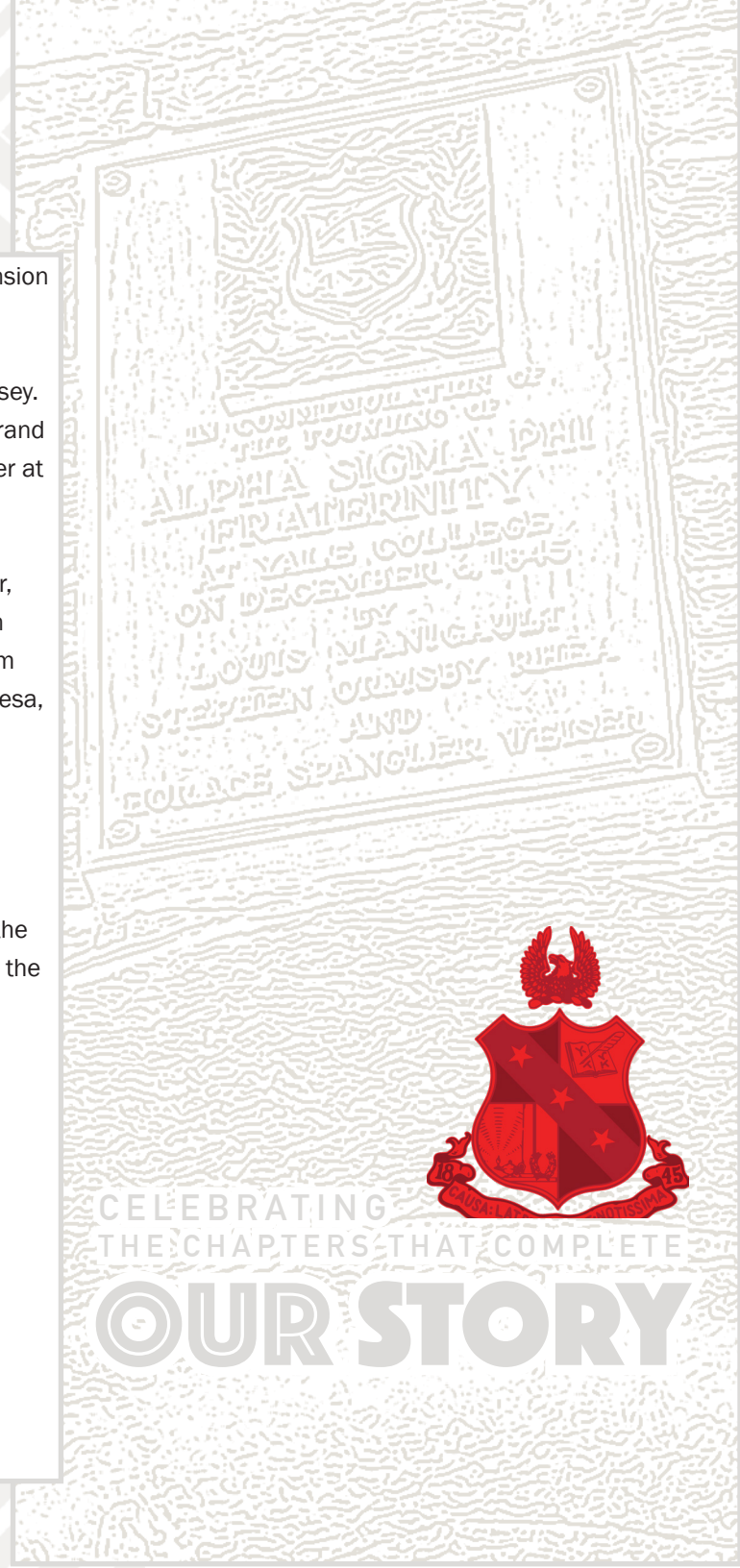
Expansion efforts at Ramapo College began during the spring 2017 semester and was led by Director of Expansion and Growth L.T. Piver, Chico State '11.
