The weekend began with a Second-Line Parade that marched us from the event venue to the Kickoff Event at the House of Blues, reserved exclusively for Alpha Sigma Phi. There, brothers and guests enjoyed renewed brotherhood and live music.

The legislative body of Grand Chapter convened as our undergraduate delegates, Alumni Association representatives, past Grand Senior Presidents and Grand Councilors paraded their chapter and school flags in the Opening Ceremonies before discussing business in the Friday morning portion of Plenary.

The afternoon portion of Plenary on Friday heard a State of the Fraternity address from outgoing GSP, Greg Kroencke, Illinois '91, the presentation of a Grant check from the Foundation to the Fraternity and saw the installation of the new Grand Council. ART MILLER // PRESBYTERIAN '09

Brother Miller has been an integral member of the Board of Advisors (BOA), serving as Secretary, Chair-Elect and currently as the Chair. As an executive member of the BOA, he helped restructure the BOA with new committees to better support the Fraternity's 2025 Strategic Plan.

STEPHEN LITTLER // MARIETTA '65

Since Delta's restart in 2012, Brother Littler served as the Scholarship Advisor for four years then Chapter Advisor for the past five years. He played an important role in recruiting younger alumni to fulfill Chapter Council roles to replace an older generation of Delta alumni.

B BERNHEIM // UNC-CHARLOTTE '80

Brother Bernheim has served his beloved Old Gal in numerous ways over the last decade. He excelled in his roles as Brotherhood Advisor for Zeta Beta (Arizona State), Chapter Advisor for Eta Xi (UC-Colorado Springs) and as an executive member of the Board of Advisors.

MATT HUMBERGER // BOWLING GREEN '03

The longest tenured staff member since Ralph Burns and our current CEO, Brother Humberger helped enable our Golden Era and led the growth of CLVEN National Housing Corp. and Founders Day Challenge. He initiated our evolution from 60 chapters to 180 chapters from 2009-22.



KEVIN GARVEY // WESTMINSTER '75

This award, the highest honor an alumnus can receive, was created in 2017 to honor the legacy of Stan G. Thurston, whose mentorship, friendship and loyalty as a donor made immeasurable impacts on Alpha Sigma Phi. This is the first time this award has been given following Brother Thurston's entrance into the Omega Chapter in 2020. This year's winner, Brother Garvey, served with Stan on the Grand Council and Foundation Board. He was the Fraternity's Executive Director from 1978-81 and CEO of the Foundation in 1999-2000. He's served as Grand Councilor, Grand Treasurer, Grand Senior President, Foundation Board Member, Foundation Chairman and just recently stepped down Alpha Nu's Alumni Association President. He is currently the Chairman-Elect of the Foundation Board.





JOHN GIBSON, JR. // INDIANA '85

The Distinguished Merit Award is presented to alumni who is exceptional in their profession or vocation. Brother Gibson began his illustrious career on the Fraternity Staff upon graduation from Indiana University. He is currently the President and COO of Paychex, a company that manages HR, payroll and benefits for over 700,000 clients. Brother Gibson leads daily operations including sales, marketing and product management. Engaged professionally and also within Alpha Sigma Phi, Brother Gibson has held many national volunteer positions, including Past Grand Senior President.

Evin C. Varner Distinguished Service Award JOHN CHANEY // INDIANA '67

Created by the Grand Council in 1959 and renamed to honor Evin C. Varner, Jr. in 1985, the Distinguished Service Award honors one alumnus who is also a previous Delta Beta Xi Award recipient. Brother Chaney is a founding father of the Gamma Chi Chapter at Indiana University. He served the Old Gal as the Fraternity's Executive Vice President from 1990-94. Brother Chaney has volunteered to facilitate at numerous national events, served on the Foundation Board of Directors and was the Chapter Advisor for Eta Kappa (North Carolina). He's also a past Executive Vice President of Alpha Sigma Phi.

to L. Sonder Chapter Advisor of the BOB STRECKER // WASHINGTON 78

This award is given annually to a Chapter Advisor who displays exceptional passion, commitment and drive for a chapter. Brother Strecker has served as the Chapter Advisor for the Mu Chapter at the University of Washington for more than 35 years. He attends every chapter meeting and weekly Prudential Board meeting, and organizes monthly speakers to address leadership, character and career topics. Under his guidance, the Mu Chapter has won three GSP Cups over the years and continues to be one of the most prestigious and exemplary chapters in all of Alpha Sigma Phi.





SPENCER FLICK // MARIETTA '21

The Undergraduate Scholar of the Year is awarded a \$2,500 scholarship provided by the Foundation. Brother Flick earned a 4.0 GPA as he pursues a career in Petroleum Engineering. He held a number of leadership positions during his time as an undergraduate member of the Delta Chapter at Marietta.



DANIEL MINK // MOREHEAD STATE

Named to honor Howard L. Kleinoeder, Washington '35, and his \$6.4 million gift upon his passing in 1990, this scholarship is awarded to a member who is actively pursuing a graduate degree. Brother Mink is currently enrolled in a Doctorate of Medicine Program at the University of Kentucky. He was a 4-time Deans List scholar and 4-time Fraternity Man of the Year at Morehead State.

Delta Upsilon won their chapter's first-ever GSP Cup for scoring the highest on the Annual Report in the Large Campus category. The Chapter recruited 48 new members in 2021-22, increasing their chapter size to 111 men. Their GPA was above the all-men's average and 38% of their membership was on the Deans List. Delta Upsilon also raised more than \$11,000 for RAINN.

Irana Senior Presidents Cup Medium Campus HETA PI CHAPTER // KANSAS

Theta Pi won their chapter's first-ever GSP Cup for scoring the highest on the Annual Report in the Mid-Sized Campus category.
