Housing Update -

The Alpha Nu Alumni Association and the Alpha Nu House Corporation are pleased to formally announce a new partnership between Alpha Nu and CLVEN LLC. (Alpha Sigma Phi's National Housing Corporation). While the Alpha Nu House Corporation still owns the property at 129 Waugh Avenue, CLVEN has taken over the general management of the property including upkeep and individual lease agreements with each brother living in the house. CLVEN currently oversees over 40 Alpha Sigma Phi properties and are much better equipped to manage the property than our team of volunteers. Because of other national relationships, CLVEN can even provide discounts on supplies, repairs, and even a meal plan. This new partnership also allows active Alpha Nu alumni to focus on supporting the Chapter rather than expending large amounts of time and energy on the continued upkeep of the house. This initial agreement took effect this past June and will run at least 3 years. After the initial 3 years, a decision will be made whether to continue the relationship.

Founders Day Challenge 2020 -

Soon you will be receiving the opportunity to donate to the **Alpha Nu Chapter Endowment** through the Annual Headquarters Founders Day Challenge Campaign. Each year, Alpha Sigma Phi HQ organizes a Fraternity wide competition putting chapters of similar sizes against each other to see which Chapter can raise the most and to see who has the most individual donors. The top scoring Chapters in each division will receive an extra \$1,000 to their endowment.

This year we have a special challenge for all Alpha Nu brothers. The Alumni Association is happy to announce a **matching campaign** for every gift made between now and December 6th, 2020 up to **\$4,000!** This match program has been generously sponsored by brother Kevin Garvey, so let's all make sure Kevin has to put up the full \$4,000! Gifts can be made either on the Fraternity's website, or by mail to Fraternity Headquarters.

The Alpha Nu Chapter Endowment was founded to help ensure the long-term success of the Chapter. The Endowment is maintained under the Alpha Sigma Phi National Endowment. Funds in the endowment go directly to Alpha Nu brothers strictly for leadership/educational purposes. This includes travel to and from educational programs, attendance at leadership programs, Chapter retreats, and the Chapter's Scholarship Program.

Scholarship Program Update

Perhaps the biggest update that we have to report on is the continued success of the Alpha Nu undergraduate scholarship program. Founded a couple of years ago by Brother Rob Sheehan, the scholarship program looks to reward brothers and new members by incentivizing strong academic performances.

All undergraduate Brothers and potential new members receive \$50 per semester if they have a 3-3.25 grade point average. For undergraduates and potential new members who have above 3.25 receive \$100 per semester. We are the only chapter on campus that has such a program and has helped us recruit new members and retain existing members.
