As part of Toronto's ongoing work to build on the City's Cycling Network Plan, City Council will be deciding on how to prioritize the 2025-2027 bikeway projects to study, build, and upgrade. Councillor Stephen Holyday would like to hear your input before these decisions are made.

The consultation will review the City-wide and local Etobicoke Centre specific plans:

- Candidate Routes for 2025-2027 study or installations
- Long-Term Cycling Network Vision
- Major City-Wide Cycling Routes
- Current Near-Term Implementation Program

The purpose of this meeting is to provide information and gather community feedback on candidate cycling project locations that are being considered for study and installation in 2025 to 2027. City staff are currently reviewing the locations before advancing a report to Council for approval consideration.

There will also be an opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback about local existing cycling infrastructure and projects that are recently installed, underway, or planned for installation in 2024.

Residents are invited to review the City's cycling plans online prior to the meeting. A brief summary of local cycling plan information is printed on the back of this page.

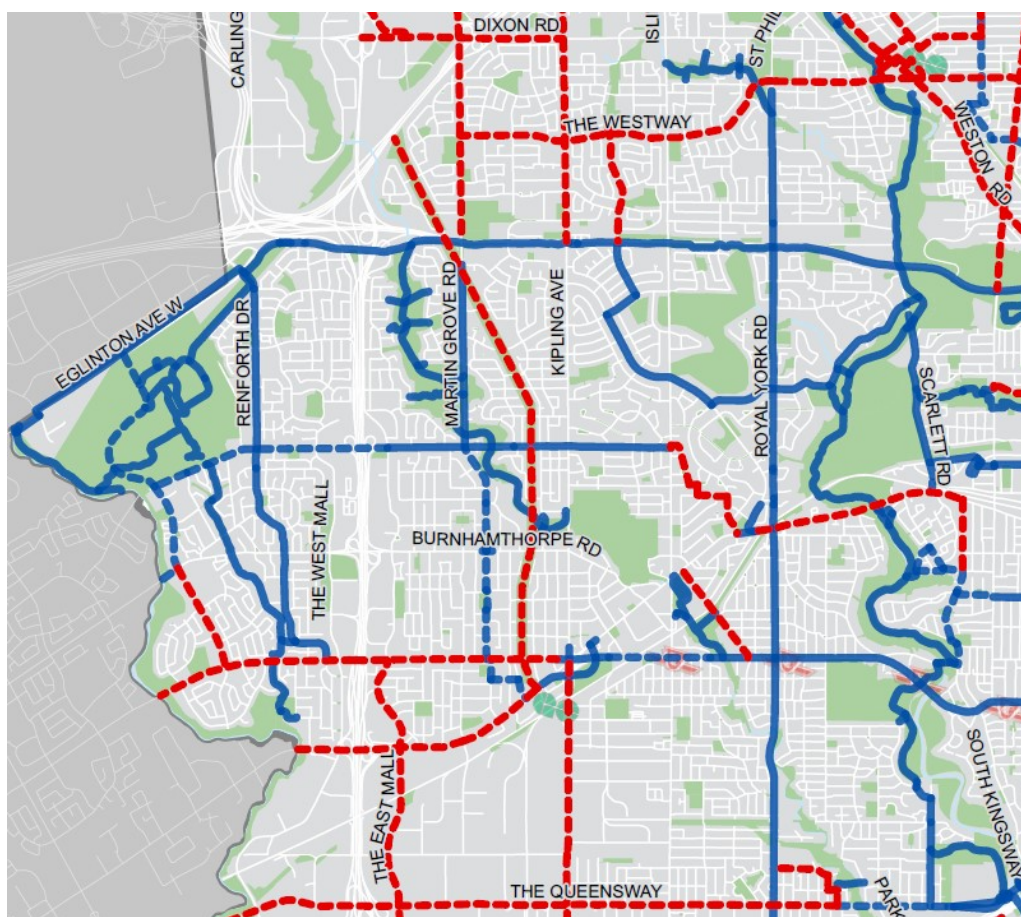

The following locations are currently under discussion as potential candidates to undergo study or to receive new bike infrastructure in 2025 to 2027. Bike infrastructure can be a variety of types ranging from separated lanes, painted lanes, signed routes or off-street trails. The type of installations or changes to the roads have not been determined.
