The summer is half over already. Its hard to believe. Our orchids are loving their out door exposure under the pergola and a couple of have decided its already time to bloom. The members who gathered for the Guild picnic had a wonderful time and some great food. If you weren't able to attend we hope you are able to do so next summer.

Gary and I spent a long weekend in Minnesota. Our goal was to see some native orchids near Brainard, but they had already passed. However, we were lucky enough to spot several native plants in a nature preserve in the middle of the Twin cities! They were great. We also had the privilege of attending a meeting of the Minnesota Orchid Society.

The Minnesota society regularly flies in speakers from other parts of the country, being able to budget more for one speaker than we can afford for an entire year! Gary was asked to help with the ribbon judging as well. They judge plants in categories as we do with the addition of a general category for first year growers and a best plant of the month. They only award one ribbon per category and only if they feel the plants deserve it. They then explain why a particular plant was awarded. Rather than awarding a door prize to a member in attendance, they give a door prize to one of the visitors who attend. At this meeting the society chose the logo they will use for the MAOC that they will host in 2005. Gary and I were asked to participate in the selection process. It was great fun and educational to attend another group's meeting. I hope that you will take the opportunity to do so as well.

Away Show Expenses

The Board of Directors continues to struggle with the cost of our participation in away shows and our limited financial resources as a non-profit organization. This summer the Board has developed a schedule for reimbursement that includes both mileage and lodging where appropriate. Based on the advice of an attorney and accountant we will continue to pay the IRS charitable rate. However, please remember that if you can document costs in excess of reimbursement for your travel and lodging on behalf of the guild, you may be able to deduct these on your taxes as a contribution to the Guild.

The Board has established a standard mileage reimbursement for each show based on a uniform distance to Ackers and the show and the IRS charitable rate. Additionally, where necessary, \$75 for the cost of a motel room has been allowed for. However, the expectation is that if more than one person must drive our exhibit, they will share a room. We can only pay the mileage reimbursement for vehicles that are actually transporting the exhibit.

A detailed chart of reimbursements for the various shows will be available at the September Guild meeting, if you would care to view it. If you have questions about it please discuss them with Doug Dowling, Cleo Kiergaard or Steven Thimling.

Leadership Positions
