Treasurer's Report: Steven T. reported the balance. Members have been renewing memberships as well as paying for holiday party.

Changes to Policy Manual: Discussion of changes and impact. MSC to remove "Most Improved Grower" category.

Exhibit Display Policy: Discussion regarding interpretation of policy and point assignment. Two-way tie for first will result in splitting points.
