Mexipedium xerophyticum—Tips for Growing this Beautiful and Bizarre Lady Slipper

Heidi Whetmore is one of the newer members to the OGG, but she has quickly cultivated an intense interest in orchids. Within two years of bringing home her first orchid, she has accumulated over 30 more and will soon be receiving her first set of flasks from her successful pollination of Mexipediums. Living in Madison with her fiancé and two cats, Heidi's affinity for collecting orchids is tempered by the practical constraints imposed by living in a small apartment. She keeps her collection happy with artificial lighting, a reverse osmosis water filter, and a database to track watering schedules and growth. Heidi's talk will feature her experience growing and pollinating Mexipediums, as well as her strategies for learning to care for a plant that relatively few people have grown.

Andrew Berna, of Paradigm Gardens was the speaker at our September meeting which was held at their warehouse. He presented different high-tech lighting options relevant to growing plants indoors, especially orchids. The T-5 is a relatively new fluorescent light available in full spectrum, which is smaller, more efficient and offers more light output per unit space than standard fluorescent lights. At 24 watts and 2000 lumens, it is three times more efficient. It can be mounted in variety of ways and there are kits available. Fixtures come in 2' and 4' versions and replacement bulbs are available. He recommends changing bulbs yearly for maximum performance.

In addition to lighting, Paradigm Gardens had a variety of in-door grow set-ups on display.

OGG Members Explaim.....

Returning OGG member Gary Lensmeyer told us about two of his orchids. The first, a Cochleanthes (River's Edge x amazonica) was purchased last year at Chicagoland. [top left] "I don't like to fuss a lot with my orchids. I keep them in white plastic trays in front of large windows in the basement. I buy my fertilizer from Chuck Acker and use 20-20-20 almost exclusively. The Cochleanthes likes to be on the wet side although I let the plant go completely dry at times. When I water it I let it sit in water which eventually evaporates....this process takes about 2-3 weeks." The second orchid, a Cattleya (Lc Acker's Madison x C Acker's Angel) [at left] was purchased at Orchids Garden Centre & Nursery last year. Since its initial purchase, the plant has re-bloomed three more times. He keeps it in a south window during the winter and during the summer it was outside under a pergola. A couple of weeks ago it started to bloom.



Rich Narf bought this miniature *Dendrobium oligophyllum* (above) 10 months ago from Chuck Acker. It is kept in an orchidarium where it nestles into the sediment. It is kept wet and watered from below. The humidity is 80% or better in the orchidarium. It has just started to bloom for him. He fertilizes with Michigan once a

Epiphytic Life in the Canopy: Sitting Pretty or High and Dry?

Orchids and bromeliads that live perched high upon or within trees, are called epiphytes. These plants appear to enjoy several advantages, most obviously, not having to grow for years to get tall enough to gain access to sunlight. But life as an epiphyte presents special challenges, including obtaining scarce water and nutrients without soil and being exposed to the wind.

Explore epiphytes with Dr. Don Waller, Professor of Botany and Environmental Studies at the UW-Madison, as he discusses how these plants have become successful plant groups within tropical rainforest canopies. This presentation includes a guided tour of the tropical Bolz Conservatory by Don Waller and John Wirth, Olbrich's Conservatory Curator.
