worked at Orchid Quest. She was a member of the Batavia Orchid Society for over 30 years, serving as show chairman for over 20. She won awards and ribbons numbering in the thousands,

with some of her plants earning the highest possible Award of Merit from the American Orchid Society. She eventually became an internationally accredited orchid judge, serving at competitions in such exotic places as Hong Kong, New Zealand, Hawaii, Indonesia, and Rio De Janeiro. Even in the dead of winter a walk through her greenhouse was like being in a forest of flowers.

From Wayne King, "I became acquainted with Mary through our many contacts at shows and, at MAOC, where I was present when she was voted "Orchidist of the Year" in 1999. She was always among those setting up the Batavia Orchid Society displays, and their displays, under Mary's leadership, frequently won the AOS show trophy. She tutored John Diehl and Anne Orcutt (the OGG Away Show setup and take down persons) on what judges look for in judging a display. With Mary's help, OGG received one of our few AOS Show Trophies.

"Mary was a delight to know and was a person to pay attention to when she was extolling on one aspect or another of growing and showing orchids. On one occasion, I overheard Mary telling a small,

informal group, "I've never killed an orchid". That stopped me in my tracks and I stopped to hear what else she might say. Her rejoinder was "but I have had a large number commit suicide".

From Arlene King, "I don't remember a OGG show that Mary didn't attend prior to her illness about four years ago. Mary, Loraine and Wilda always put up the display for the Batavia Society, and then Mary was a judge and Wilda and Lorraine would help with clerking. If our society had a Saturday night party she was there. After the AOS judging they usually left and would appear on Sunday playing cards in the hospitality room until tear down."

"During my experiences over the past seven years of attending Orchid-related events, Mary Weiss was always working or doing something. Mary was especially dedicated to the Batavia Orchid Society and worked endlessly on their shows. She was always a gracious host and always helpful to anyone who asked for her expertise. Mary will be greatly missed by all of the Orchid World and especially to the Batavia Orchid Society." Sandy Delamater

OAK HILL ANNUAL PICNIC

The OGG wishes to thank Liese and Greg Butler and Dorothy Pigors of Oak Hill Gardens, Dundee, IL for this year's summer program and their generous hospitality.

Where do things stand at Oak Hill? Due to the downturn in the economy, Oak Hill is no longer selling wholesale to 80 small businesses that have gone out of business. This has resulted in a change in how their operation is handled. They are still growing the orchid varieties listed on their web site; however, they are growing smaller batches of everything thus taking up less bench space in the green house. They have closed a couple greenhouses and plan to close one or more in the near future.

Cymbidiums are not as popular as they once were so these have been reduced. Cattleya crosses are not as popular and shoppers seem to prefer clones. The Phragmipediums sold out but due to popular demand, they may have some available in the near future. Orchids imported from overseas have hurt the American orchid market. A phalaenopsis takes three to four years from seed to bloom at Oak Hill but less time and expense for growers in Taiwan, Hawaii and elsewhere. However, Oak Hill has species orchids that can not be found in the big box stores.

The orchid growing business is challenging not just because of changing market conditions but in addition because growers have to adjust water and feed schedules according to the growing conditions each year. Last year it was cold and Liese saw black spot, root rot and diminished new root growth. Orchids grow best between 60 and 70 degrees and the low 80's. In the 80 to 90's, orchids stop growing. This summer has been hot and humid. For this Liese recommended:

- Watering orchids between fertilizations (with higher nitrogen formula).
- Make sure orchid plants are getting enough shade.
- On cloudy, sticky days no misting. When it is sticky, you may not need to water. Also, cut back a little bit on the fertilizer (skip a week).
- If sunny, mist lightly.
- Make sure orchids dry out before re-watering.
- If you see mildew or mold on the bark, use PHYSAN 20[™]. This compound may be put in your water system or rain barrel using directions on the bottle. Sometimes it is preferable to repot orchids rather than use chemicals. If the roots start turning black it is also wise to get that plant out of the pot and into fresh bark. CAPTAN and PHYTON are systemic fungicides that can be used for this condition.
- In the fall, start using blossom booster unless the weather stays hot and sunny. Stay with the higher nitrogen fertilizer until it starts cooling off and then switch to the blossom booster.

For repotting, she recommended:

- Orchids in flasks are repotted in the spring.
- Soft leaved (phalaenopsis and paphiopedilum) spring and early fall so that roots develop well. Cooler growing plants should be repotted in late fall and winter.
- Cattleyas and dendrobiums with pseudobulbs should be repotted when new growth starts. For dendrobiums without pseudobulbs, plant in the spring and early summer.
