Report from Registration

There were 52 exhibits with 599 plants registered. Twenty-nine plants were pulled for AOS consideration and nine awards were given: four AM, 1 HCC, 3 CCM, 1 CBR and 1 BE. More to come in a future newsletter.

A NOTE FROM THE TREASURER

Thanks to our dedicated OGG volunteers and the detailed planning by our co-chairs, Judy Stevenson and Judith Rapacz, Orchid Quest 2011 went well. The weather and Packer's Superbowl made it less profitable than we hoped. Preliminary results show a profit of \$2,400. In 2010, it was \$6,000. We had 100 more attend on Saturday than in 2010, 1,295 people. BUT Sunday was very quiet. 300 fewer attended, only 364 people.

The greater cost of bringing in a speaker from California and more advertising were other reasons for the reduced profit. This profit will be used up for our general operations. We also increased our membership to 67 OGG. Fortunately, we will not have to make any cuts to our bargaining rights (excuse the editorial) in order to balance our budget. We would like to have a good plant sale on April 23 at Olbrich. Thanks all!
