The next meeting will take place inn the Atrium at Olbrich. This meeting coincides with the Batavia Orchid Society Show, so blooming orchids ought to be sent there. There is be a debriefing about Orchid Quest as well as a talk by Jeff Baylis on orchid mating systems.

Orchids have long held a special fascination for humans, and biologists are no exception. Besides being one of the most widespread and diverse

families of seed plants, orchids have a very special relationship with their insect pollinators. Plants have mating systems just like animals have mating systems, and orchids appear to have evolved sophisticated mechanisms to insure sexual reproduction and out crossing.

ABOUT OGG ANNUAL AWARDS By Nancy Thomas

The Guild's annual awards are given to "promote and reward participation in Guild activities" by recognizing excellence in orchid growing, showing and related artistic endeavors.

The Guild Exhibiter of the Year recognizes participation in orchid shows. Guild members earn exhibiter points by setting up and/or taking down a display at Orchid Quest and away shows, and for any ribbons or awards earned by those displays. The Milo Gilbertson Guild Grower of the Year is named for a Charter member of the Guild well known as the foremost amateur orchid grower in Dane County and winner of numerous orchid awards. Milo was a cymbidium and cattleya grower par excellence, but also grew a wide range of orchids to perfection and, up until his death in 1991, was investigating new and better ways to grow them.

Special award Meeting ribbon plants at Orchid Quest and away shows, and winning ribbons during ribbon judging at OGG meetings. The Guild awards the Milo Gilbertson award to the top grower of the year (December through November), in either the Beginner's Class (less than 3 years' experience growing orchids) or Experienced Class (3 years or more experience). A second grower's award is given to the best grower in whatever experience class didn't receive the Milo Gilbertson Award (if there is one). The OGG annual awards are accompanied by a monetary prize of \$35 for the Milo Gilbertson Award, and \$25 each for the second grower and Exhibiter of the Year.

Needless to say, these awards are a tribute to sustained effort and excellence, and we owe hearty applause to all who earn them. (For details on the awards and points policy, see the OGG website under Membership for the OGG Points System and the Orchid Guild Handbook).
