

### **MAY MEETING SUMMARY**

The May meeting is important because it includes the selection of open Orchid Growers Guild Board positions by member vote. The open slots were president, vice president, secretary, and one member at large. Members who attended the meeting via Zoom were considered to be present and a mechanism which allowed Zoom participants to vote anonymously was set up by Ken. In person attendance was 43 members and nine members attended via Zoom. Congratulations to Meg Graham, Chuck Acker, Lynn West, and Ted Ceplina who will start the new term on June 1, 2025. A gigantic thank you to the retiring board members for their extraordinary service.

Since the meeting was held in the smaller meeting room, it was decided to postpone the members' plant auction until the June picnic. Watch your email for information about the picnic and the auction. Auction forms will be attached to an email. Printed forms will also be available at the picnic. There will also be ribbon judging at the picnic and there will be extra forms available for ribbon judging.

The May meeting featured an in-person speaker, Dr. Robert-Jan Quené, who is a longtime friend of Chuck Acker. Dr. Quené is the owner of Clearwater Orchid Laboratory in Superior, WI. His talk was titled "Lab Propagation: From Seed Pod, Flask, Compot & Beyond". Dr. Quené described his process for making media and preparing green pods (preferred) for flasking. Most of the species that he works with will germinate in about two weeks. Then 20 protocorms are replated to a second flask after about two or three months where they remain for an additional five months. Plants are then removed from the flask and placed in a community pot with an appropriate orchid-type medium. Plants remain in the compot for two to three years. Some will flower in one to two years. Even though he prepares flasks for his clientele, he has created many awarded hybrids of his own which the members were awed by. Dr. Quené brought a selection of flasks for members to purchase and he donated a flask of Epidendrum for the door prize that was won by Jeff Metcalf.

Some members were so inspired by his talk that a new project was started by Terri Jozwiak to share pollen and learn how to pollinate orchids and create new hybrids. If you missed Terri's email contact her at <a href="mailto:lodijoz@charter.net">lodijoz@charter.net</a>

### Sex on a Kitchen Table

Our May speaker, Robert Jan Quené, owner of Clearwater Orchid Laboratory in Superior, WI inspired me. I really want to work on fertilizing some orchids. As I looked at my small greenhouse I had a stunning *Bulbophyllym annamense* blooming with several clusters with 10-14 flowers on each. I also had one I bought at the Mother's Day Sale, a *Paphiopedelum* Macabre Allure with a very large maroon lower pouch, many maroon dots on the 2 side petals and a white and green striped dorsal sepal. I also had a *Phragmipedium caudatum* that was light greenish with a huge lip and side petals that were about 12 inches long and still growing.

So, if you note, I had 3 flowers that could not be

bred with each other; Bulbophyllum, Paphiopedilum and a Phragmipedium. So how could I do the deed of fertilization? I got the idea to ask other guild members if they had matches for my blooming plants. In order to entice someone else to share their plant, they would have to see mine, so I put out a notice

with pictures. Of course I knew that I would have to tap into Chuck Acker's expertise because I didn't know how to fertilize two orchids. I



knew you needed pollen and ovaries but where those are on a Paph or Bulbo, I had no idea. Chuck had me use a magnifying glass now because the next parts were so small. Looking from the side, behind the staminode, I could now see the two anthers which had the pollen inside, on the upper right and the upper left side behind that staminode. By touching each anther, I could knock off the anther "capsule" that held the pollen. After it landed on the table, I could get at it and scrape out the pollen from inside with a toothpick. Now the pollen was on the toothpick. Next I had to rub that pollen on the stigma, which was also behind that staminode, but in the center. This was crazy, exacting and very interesting work.

Next, I practiced on the Bulbophyllym. Now all these same parts were super tiny. Putting the magnifier on and adding extra light helped. The Bulbophyllym annamenses, had an extra tiny piece of a petal in front of the staminode. We determined that that small petal was in the way and removed it with a tweezer. Now that tiny staminode with the pollen behind it was available. After removing the anthers with the pollen inside, it revealed the teeny tiny depression that was the stigmata, that the pollen would be put into. Touching into the stigmata depression puts a little sticky substance on the tip of the toothpick, enough to pickup the pollen capsule. Then the pollen capsule is placed directly into the stigmata area. I practiced quite a bit with fertilizing each flower on the Bulbophyllum annamense.

Now I was ready to start on the Phragmipedium



caudata. Meredyth Graham was there and provided her *Phragmipedium* Rosalie Dixler. Rosalie was a Bessie hybrid and had a medium flower with rounded lateral petals especially compared to the giant caudata flower. In deciding which plant would be the Mother with the ovaries and which the Father with the pollen, Chuck elaborated on giving the larger flower's pollen to the smaller

flower's ovaries because the

large flower's pollen is stronger but of course try going both ways. So off came the two pouches.

Meredyth put each pouch on her fingers and started her fingers "walking" around with the slippers on. It was very cute. With the entertainment finished, I took the pollen anthers off, scraped the pollen from them and deposited them carefully. Labelling each flower with the date and which flowers were used to cross it was the final step. Now we wait and hopefully

acquire a seed pod.

I have always wanted to fertilize some orchids but I was reluctant to do this in past years because it takes soooo very long to get a seed pod, flask the seeds, grow them in flask and then compot and tiny plants. Years!

If I don't start now, I will just be 2-3 years older in 2-3 years, instead of in 2-3 years getting a flask to start a compot of something I fertilized myself! I am very excited. What do you have blooming? Want to cross it with something else and make something new????

Paphiopedelum Macabre Allure will soon be mated with Damon's Paphiopedilum Supersuk!






