## **ORCHID QUEST EXHIBIT**

Putting on an orchid show is a big deal and creating the host-society's exhibit is a second big deal!. We have been fortunate to have almost 100 of our members' plants in our past OQ exhibits. Needless to say this requires a lot of organization and cooperation between the timely arrival of the plants and the vision of the exhibit team. To make this process move smoothly there is some information on the OGG website to assist you:

## Dates and items to remember

- Send complete name of plant and parentage (if possible); to Sue (greed@chorus.net) by Monday, January 29. with its registration class
- Send notification of any plant cancellations by Thursday morning, February 1,
- Bring all plants, orchids and foliage plants to Olbrich Atrium by 11 am on Friday, February 2.
- Unpack your labeled pots, plants, and check them in at the exhibit set up area.
- Take your packing material, including

transportation stakes with you.

Thank you in advance for bringing orchids and foliage plants. It is extremely important to label your plants, pots, etc and to have your plant identification with the plant. We sometimes have multiple plants with the same name with different owners entered. Therefore we need to be very careful that members plants are properly identified.

We will have pre-printed plant identification tags to put on the plants as well as the plant registration tags. If owners do some of this labeling this will greatly assist the exhibit set-up. If there are 100 plants and it takes 30 seconds to one minute to label each one, this is 50 to 100 minutes just labeling plants before they can be put into the exhibit!

Plant registration is based upon the Orchid Quest Show Book. This will be available on-line in January. The show book is based upon the MAOC show plant registration book available along with registration information aids at: <a href="https://midamericanorchids.org/education">https://midamericanorchids.org/education</a>

or possible donation items, please feel free to ask Judy or myself.


We will also need volunteers to help set-up and run the silent auctions on Saturday and Sunday.






