As requested by some members at the January meeting, here are the web sites that I find very helpful in researching orchid plant parentage, accepted names and other pertinent information regarding lineage of hybrids.

The most recent site to come on-line and replacing the once popular site of orchidwiz is now orchidex. This site is very beneficial and can be found at <u>https://orchidex.org/</u>

Another very good source for researching accepted species and hybrids is orchids.org. You do not need to become a member of this site however, it does allow you more access and other benefits such as selling and buying plants from other members. This site can be reached at https://orchids.org/

Lastly, the site from the Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) is also very useful for researching find a **"Join/Renew/Donate"** tab. This includes mechanisms for accepting credit cards either for annual membership dues or to make a secure donation / payment in any dollar amount. A second tab provides information about our **"Away Shows"**. We also provide an archives of older **"Newsletters"** from 2002-2022 and more recent ones from 2023-present. Finally, members will find a tab labeled **"Governance"** which lists our current cabinet of officers, committee assignments, Guild bylaws, and other policies.

- **GROWING ORCHIDS** This is your library of valuable information related to orchid cultivation, including links to the AOS' culture sheets, our own Wisconsin specific culture sheets, and a variety of miscellaneous articles and links organized by topic.
- **EXTERNAL LINKS** Regional orchid society websites and other organizations of interest are listed here.

Orchid Quest Publicity

Cynthia, Ken, and his husband Brian have been extremely active in getting the word out about Orchid Quest 2025 and our expansion to Monona Terrace. Below is a summary of their activities over the past few months. If you have any experience in advertising and would like to help next year please let them know.

- 1. Radio ads and a live interview with Chuck on WPR's Garden Talk
- 2. Hold the Date bookmarks distributed around Madison
- 3. Posters throughout the area
- 4. Targeted ads from News 3 Now/Channel 3000 on their Facebook page (278K followers!)

Congratulations to our Guild Treasurer, Ken Cameron! Each year the International Neofinetia Facebook group holds a competition in which its 7,500 members from around the world vote on their favorite photographs of *Neofinetia* falcata cultivars and hybirds. The top 12 winners have their photos assembled into a calendar, with the first place photograph on the cover. Ken took top honors this year for his photo of *Neofinetia falcata* 'Unkai' and will receive a valuable handmade pot from one of Japan's top artisans as his prize.



Unkai 雲海 is a highly collectible fuukiran noted for its unusual flowers that are white with a faint pink blush, and with petals and sepals that are particularly long, pointing upward rather than in the standard open-faced orientation. It was first registered in Japan in 1991 and its name translates to "sea of clouds". Although these orchids flower in summer, Ken will have a display of rare samurai orchids and antique 19th century pottery at Orchid Quest. Be sure to check it out.
