

Summary February Monthly Meeting

In February each year, the Orchid Growers Guild (OGG) opens the monthly meeting to the public. While the meeting is still held at Olbrich, it is held in the much larger Commons room to accommodate the large crowd that includes both OGG members and non-members. Many of the non-members learn about the February public meeting while attending Orchid Quest and through other PR campaign efforts. This year the speaker was Chuck Acker who is a member of OGG and is a well-known *Phragmipedium* breeder and expert general orchid grower.

Chuck's talk focused on the recent controversial discovery of *Phragmipedium kovachii* and the incredible hybrids created using this species. Many of these wonderful hybrids can be attributed to Chuck's breeding program. Creation of hybrids using the 20 or so species in the genus *Phragmipedium* between 1870 and 1990 was only 55. With the discoveries of *P. besseae* and *P. kovachii* the number of *Phragmipedium* hybrids have increased dramatically. Chuck reviewed many of the first, second and third generation hybrids. My favorite was the P. Sam Crothers that looks just like a mini *kovachii*.

Chuck and Jerry Fischer traveled to Peru in 2005 and were the first two growers in the US to legally import flasked seedlings. In 2009 at the Orchid Quest Show, one of Chuck's *kovachii*

plants was in peak bloom for the Saturday morning judging and received the best in show award. How cool is that that the most important species found in the last 100 years was shown maybe for the first time at Orchid Quest!

After the talk, Chuck had a selection of *kovachii* hybrids available for attendees to purchase. The hybrids should be easier to grow than the species. Here are Chuck's growing recommendations:

- Temperature range 55 F − 82 F.
- Ample bright indirect light (try various microclimates in your home that make the plant happy).
- Use water with a pH of about 6.5 and about 20 ppm (*P. Kovachii* and *P. fischerii* benefit from adjusting water pH to 7.5-8, the hybrids are not as picky about the pH).
- Keep roots moist, never allow roots to completely dry out.
- Fertilize regularly and add Ca/Mg.
- Keep roots cool.
- Use a loose and airy medium, do not firm in. Add crushed oyster shell or limestone to the medium if using RO water. The tap water in the Madison area generally has too high of a mineral content. Use RO, distilled or rainwater if possible.

News About the Guild's Book Collection

As many of our members are aware, in late 2022 an agreement was made between our guild and Olbrich Gardens, resulting in the guild's collection of orchid books to be housed and cared for at the Schumacher library. The library is a small room directly next to the conservatory. In early 2023 our collection was transferred to the library where the books were all cleaned and covered with archival plastic by library volunteers. They look terrific. Check-out privileges were reserved for OGG members only, and special arrangements were made for the library to be open during guild meeting times for members to pick up and return books. Unfortunately, some months ago the Library no longer had volunteers to staff the library for our meetings, and that convenience no longer exists.

Olbrich now has other plans for the library space. The space will become a Guest Resource Center where people will be able to sit and read but not remove resources from the room.

Olbrich would like the guild's book collection to continue to be housed in the Guest Resource Center, and has a plan for guild members to continue to be able to access and check out our books. Under the plan, on OGG meeting days the Olbrich staff will move our entire collection to a book cart and place the cart in our meeting room. Members will have access to the collection before, during, and after meetings and OGG will be responsible for how members check out and return our books.



Follow-Up by OQ Volunteer Coordinator

Congratulations and thank you to all the volunteers for Orchid Ouest 2024! It was an overwhelming success thanks to the help from so many members of the Orchid Growers Guild! On Friday there were at least 25 members hustling to put plastic up in the headhouse; setting up lots(!) of tables and chairs in the Atrium, the three Classrooms and Eviue Commons; unloading thousands of plants, display material, helping vendors move plants and supplies to the proper rooms; providing food and beverages to everybody as well as organizing and entering the registration for thousands of plants. In addition, fifteen members brought over one hundred plants that were then put into yet another award-winning display in the Atrium.

On Saturday it was all hands on deck! At least twenty five members were up before sunrise to begin clerking for the AOS judges as well as recording the winning orchids and getting the ribbons on the plants. Following the clerking duties, members fanned out throughout Olbrich to make sure the Guild Table, Plant Check, Atrium and Silent Auction were all staffed and ready to welcome the public.

The great speaker line-up consisted of our own local talent and featured a variety of topics from General Orchid Anatomy, Open Question and Answer Sessions as well as Reporting demonstrations and Panel Discussions.

On Sunday, the volunteers were back at it! In addition to filling in all of the volunteer positions until 3 pm, there was the additional chore of breaking down the show and returning Olbrich Gardens to its original state. That meant breaking down all those tables and stacking the chairs in all three classrooms, the Elvhue Commons, the Lobby and the Atrium. It meant making sure the vendors were able to get the supplies loaded up (I don't think they had very many plants left!). It meant taking down signs, folding table cloths, sweeping all the rooms as well as loading and returning all items to the Guild locker. Oh- and did I mention packing up members' own award-winning plants from the

exhibit!

As the Volunteer Coordinator there were a number of things that stood out to me. There were forty-six Guild members that volunteered their time, energy and expertise. There were eight new members that volunteered at Orchid Quest for the first time. Finally- there was lots of help with cleanup on Sunday! We were done and out of there by 5 pm! HISTORY OF THE ORCHID GROWERS GUILD

The inception of the Orchid Growers Guild began in the mid 1980's when the only orchid society near Madison was in Milwaukee. Local Madison orchid enthusiasts commuted to attend the Wisconsin Orchid Society's monthly meetings in Milwaukee. During one of those commutes in April 1985, Wayne King, Stan Grand and Milo Gilbertson discussed the possibility of forming a local orchid society. Stan offered to get the ball rolling. With assistance from Olbrich Botanical Gardens, Stan sent a letter to their membership to determine the amount of interest in forming an orchid group based in Madison.

Over the summer of 1985, a meeting with a select group of people was held at the Memorial Union on the UW Campus. It was at this meeting that Stan Grand, Wayne King, Milo Gilbertson, Mo Fayyaz, John Moses, Charlie Peckham and Chuck Acker tossed around the ideas for the name, time of month for meetings and other logistics needed to form a group. Shortly thereafter The Orchid Growers' Guild was official and the board was established.

Stan Grand was the first president, Chuck Acker the first vice president, George Allez and John Moses were the acting program committee. By the first regular meeting in November 1985 at the Memorial Union, bylaws were in place and efforts were well under way to obtain the "Charter of Incorporation" with the State and affiliation with the American Orchid Society. Officers and Board Members were elected and committee chairs appointed. In December 1987 Stan finished his term as president and moved away and Wayne King became president.

Student AOS judges and members of the WOS, LeRoy Peterson and Les Mischke, discussed ideas for programs and criteria for judging. The first judging of members' plants occurred in January 1986. The first publication of those results was in February 1986. The first AOS judged Orchid Growers Guild show was held the last weekend of January 1988 at West Towne Mall.

The Orchid Growers Guild lives on today, stronger than ever thanks to the incredibly enthusiastic, dedicated and passionate members that have all played important roles throughout the past 39 wonderful orchid growing years!
