

## Happy Blessed Season of Advent, Everyone!

For many, the Advent Season is their favorite. I do believe you all know it is my favorite. Putting up the Christmas tree, setting up the Nativity scene, and oh, my Advent Wreath is my favorite thing to set up. Each wooden piece of my wreath has a one-sentence prayer. So, when my eyes first saw the prayers for hope, love, peace, and joy, I had to have it. And, of course, I can't leave out the Christ candle prayer.

Let me share each prayer with you. I hope the blessings bring you as much joy as they bring me. The *hope* candle prayer says, "God, fill us with the fruits of righteousness that Christ may receive an eager welcome from us at his coming and call us to his side in the kingdom of heaven." The *love* prayer is "God of love, fill our hearts with Your Holy Spirit, and as You revealed Your Son through his coming as man, so lead us through his glory of the resurrection." The *joy* candle's prayer is "God, may Your people, experience the joy of salvation and celebrate the coming of Christ with love and thanksgiving." The *peace* prayer is "God, open our hearts in welcome, so that we may share in the wisdom of Christ and become one with him when he comes in glory." The last and most importantly is the *Christ* candle's prayer, which is "O' God, bestow thy blessings upon this wreath and grant that we may receive Your bountiful grace."

When Nyomi and Blaine were younger, Bob and I would light the candle, and Nyomi and Blaine would take turns praying the prayer every Sunday in Advent before we left for church. Things are different now. Our traditions are changing, and that's completely okay. Yet, one thing will always remain a tradition, and that is, the Advent Wreath is on the table as a reminder that Christ is coming back and we must be ready when the day comes.

My siblings, I hope that during the Advent Season, you embrace God's unfathomable love for you and that it brings joy and peace only God can bring to your hearts and homes. And as always, it is an honor and an absolute joy to be your pastor during this most sacred Advent Season.

### THE MABEL HAGER MEMORIAL FUND

Mabel Hager was born in Harriman,
Tennessee, on January 10, 1901.
She married Charles Hager and together
they had two children, Phyllis and
Charles (Skip). The Hagers made their
home in Mio, Michigan, where Mabel
was a homemaker and was well known
for her wonderful biscuits. She never
drove a car because of poor eyesight,
but that never stopped her from being
an active member of her community.

In 1933 Mabel became a member of the Mio Methodist Church. She joined the Church's women's group and sang in the choir until she had to give it up because of her failing eyesight. She and several other ladies of the Church formed a prayer group that met weekly for many years. And for more than twenty years Mabel went to the Mio Nursing Home faithfully every Wednesday morning for a sing-a-long with the residents until the home was closed. Music and her church were very important to Mabel.



Upon her death, Mabel left instructions to use the assets in her estate to support the mio United Methodist Church. A fund was established to assist in the building of an addition to the Church as well as establish an endowment for the Church's future needs.

Mabel Hager made a commitment to her church both during her lifetime and after her death. Her legacy of caring will continue in perpetuity in the stewardship of the Community Foundation for Northeast Michigan. As years go by, and with the help of the Community Foundation, Mabel will continue to support the Church that she loved so much.

Our church and many missions and community ministries have benefitted from the endowment set up by Mabel Hager. Some of these are Vacation Bible School, Bikes donated for the Bike Safety Classes, Sports and Honors banquets hosted by our church for Mio School, musical instruments purchased for the school, scholarships for the school, also the Women's Retreat held at church in 2021, and the Grief Share Sessions hosted by our church.

Mabel's commitment to assist our church in ministry has blessed so many and her legacy of caring continues on. Mabel truly was a Proverbs 31 Virtuous Woman.

Looking forward to the fall of 2022, there are many things happening "behind the scenes" at the WCA. Recall that the WCA was formed 5 years ago to encourage an orthodox revival within the UMC and expanded it role as a division in the UMC became inevitable. About 9 months ago a group of UMC leaders and notable members announced plans to form a new denomination to be called the Global Methodist Church. The actual labor of all the steps needed is being done by the WCA staff and volunteers. The WCA staff is actually quite small so let me introduce these key people and their role in the new movement. FYI, there is no actual "office" in this age of virtual work.

Rev. Keith Boyette, a UMC Elder in the Virginia Conference is the President and works beyond "full time". Prior to the ministry, Keith was an attorney in Virginia, so his legal skills are a key ingredient in his job. He leads the organizing efforts of the GMC and importantly also leads in the negotiating process within the UMC to accomplish an amicable separation.

Rev. Walter Fenton. also a UMC Elder and Vice President of Strategic Relations manages and helps produce the extensive communications and documentations needed for this transformational journey. Prior to his WCA work, Walter was part of the staff at Good News Magazine, the renewal publication for evangelical Methodists since 1968.

<u>Teresa Marcus</u> is the Administrative Assistant located near Keith Boyette who manages the flow of activities for the dispersed staff members.

<u>Rev. Angela Pleasants.</u> another UMC Elder recently accepted the position of Vice President, Clergy and Church relations. In this role she will be key to the transitional process for IMC churches and Pastors who wish to migrate to the GMC beginning in 2022.

Mr. Simon Mafunda is a lifelong UMC lay member in the Zimbabwe East Annual Conference. He was just appointed Africa Coordinator to assist in the communications and organizing efforts of the African UMC churches where more than 1/3 of the present UMC membership resides.
