
An envelope for a Lenten Offering is included in this newsletter. All giving received will be used for the Adopt-a-Family Project at Christmas.

Printed here is the Moment for Mission presented on Valentine's Sunday. It concerns a new giving plan for the Mission program of our church. Thanks for reading about the plan and participating in it.

Good Morning Church,

This is our Mission's Sunday and I want to tell you about a new plan for your financial giving for the support of our Mission outreach program. This has been a difficult year in so many, but it has also been a year that has stretched us in our faith and in finding new ways to express our Christian commitment to our Lord. The mission agenda lacked the funds this year to cover all our commitments. Thankfully, the Mabel Hager fund provided those monies that we lacked in the Mission Budget. I never met Mabel but I'm thankful for her and that she met Jesus. He knew how Mabel's money would make a difference for us in so many ways here at Mio Methodist Church through the years since her passing.

I would like to present this new plan, on behalf of our Mission Committee and as approved by our Administrative Council. This plan would, hopefully, increase an awareness and a desire to participate in the mission program of our church. This is the plan! One of the projects we support, for example Noah's Ark or Lydia's Gate, would be presented on our Mission Sunday. We would describe the Mission and the purpose and how we have financially or otherwise supported it in the past and what our goal is for 2021. We would dedicate each month to a particular project. And all monies collected on that Sunday and in the following couple weeks would be sent directly to that mission at the end of the month. Presently we have put all monies for Missions into the budget and divided it up at the end of the year.

This new plan gives you an option and an opportunity to think about exactly where you would like for your mission dollars to go. You will be able to see a list of all the missions we give to in the newsletter and on a redone bulletin board and the monthly mission project will be listed in the bulletin.

God is our provider and knows our situation and the situation of the dear missions that we give to. We will be trusting Him to give us direction in our goals and provision to do his will. Please keep the mission endeavor of this church in your prayers.

In March, our Mission focus will be on UMCOR, the United Methodist Committee on Relief. This offering provides financial support for the programs aimed at providing food, shelter, and health around the world at a time of crisis wherever it may be happening. Right now, UMCOR Disaster Response Teams in the North, Central, Southwest and Rio Texas Conferences are responding to the crisis there. UMCOR always needs our help and support. Please pray for God's provision for you to give generously to this part of the Mio Methodist Mission Outreach.

Newsletter item

The 2021 August-September General Conference Has Been Delayed Until August 2022

On February 25, 2021 the UMC Commission on General Conference announced there would be no meeting this year due primarily to travel restrictions expected to remain in place, making international travel very expensive and difficult.

A new date in August 2022 has been set, again to be located in Minneapolis. <u>This is the earliest date the legislation to enact "Protocol for Reconciliation on Grace through Separation" can be considered.</u>

At this time, there is no reason to believe that this historic action to resolve differences in the UMC will not be enacted in 2022. Spokespersons from both sides of the divide continue to voice support for this needed path to resolution.

The Bishops have also put forth a very brief agenda of uncontroversial legislative items to be voted on by mail in May 2021. These items have to do with operational continuity and especially with the capacity to replace at least some of the 16 Bishops desiring to retire. You can read the details on the UMNEWS website.

As of the writing of this article, none of the advocacy groups, either WCA for the traditionalists or groups representing progressive members, have made any formal announcements about this delay.

My own feeling, based on earlier recommendations and practical limitations, is that the WCA will recommend that individual members, Pastors, Churches, and Conferences <u>remain</u> as <u>members of the UMC</u>. The practical side is that the option to depart without the protocol mechanisms remains cumbersome and expensive. It would also remove voting members at future General Conferences and Annual Conferences where those absent voters might jeopardize the voting strength needed to pass the Protocol legislation.

My own feeling is that for us at Mio Church, this delay <u>does not</u> have a big impact. We "are who we are" and will continue a vital ministry in our community. We can concentrate on our Faith witness and community engagement, and do all we can to be welcoming to all who seek a fellowship of people saved by God's grace through the atoning work of Jesus and the power of the Spirit.

Our challenge will be to overcome a present stigma that our denomination is both in disarray and/or holds beliefs contrary to those of prospective members. Let's make our local witness speak loudly about who we are.

As I now just finished this writing, Bishop Bard broadcast a statement regarding this matter. His remarks are gracious and optimistic. He acknowledges that we do have unreconciled differences and he continues to see a separation coming.
