Our 2012 Winter Rose Get-A-Way Weekend will meet on February 17, 18 and 19 at the Eden Resort Inn in Lancaster, 717-569-6444. Please make your reservation before January 19<sup>th</sup>. Make sure to use group# 103700.

So many people work to make this event special for all of us and I would like to take a moment here to say thank you to all of those who help. Without everyone in the district, this event just couldn't happen!

This year we are trying something new! In addition to our fantastic arrangemnt workshop, we will be having a photography workshop. For everyone interested in improving their rose photography skills, bring your digital cameras and any other supplies you use, and we will have some stations set up where you can practice taking pictures, and get advice from some of the judges (Bill Kozemchak, Tom Mayhew, and Curtis Aumiller). Please note that because there are SO MANY different types of cameras, we will not be able to teach you how to use your camera, but we will be giving pointers on lighting, depth of field, and other bits of information. We will be photographing not only single specimens, but also the arrangements that are made during the arrangement workshop!

**Pat Bilson** will host another of her outstanding winter arrangement workshops on The Duke. Arrangers who register to participate in this workshop need to bring their own containers (not larger than 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  - 5 inches in any direction) and kenzons if they wish. # Plan Now for the ARS Penn-Jersey District Rose Get-a-Way Weekend Photo Contest

If you haven't already done so, prepare your color picture prints for the Penn-Jersey District Rose Get-a-Way Weekend Photo Contest so that you can enter them next January. A class for "Rose Art" has been added. The schedule includes a Novice Class, which is open to those who have never won a blue ribbon in a rose photo contest.

Each photo entry must be a 5x7 color print photo. Mail your entry with your name, the entry Class number and the name of rose or other photo identification attached to the back of the photo to: Bruce Monroe, 3030 Maple Shade Lane, Wilmington, DE 19810-3424. All entries must be received by Jan. 20, 2012. Exhibitors are limited to three entries per class.

All roses and activities must be correctly identified. Rose photos will be evaluated on 50% rose form and 50% photo quality. All photos entered will be on display and final judging and awards will be made at the Penn-Jersey District Winter Rose Get-a-Way Weekend. The judges' decision is final. Ribbons will be given in each class and awards to the top three photos overall. By entering the contest, you agree to allow the Penn-Jersey District of the American Rose Society to exhibit your photo at the 2012 Winter Rose Get-a-Way Weekend and publish your photo in the District Newsletter the **Rose Vine**.

The photo contest is open to any amateur photographer who is either a member of the Penn-Jersey District or who has registered for the 2012 Winter Rose Get-a-Way Weekend. You do not have to attend the Winter Rose Get-a-Way Weekend to enter the competition and you need not be present to win. The Novice class is open only to those exhibitors who have never won a blue ribbon in a rose photo contest. However, exhibitors who have never won a blue ribbon in a rose photo contest may also enter the other classes.

Please note the following definitions:

An **exhibition bloom** is a specimen that has one bloom per stem without side buds. Unwanted side growth, side buds and/or spent blooms may be removed from any specimen to improve the appearance. At its most perfect phase of possible beauty an exhibition bloom is generally one-half to two-thirds open, gracefully shaped with sufficient petals symmetrically arranged in a circular outline, and tending to a high center. An **open bloom** must have the stamens showing. A **spray** has two or more blooms per stem with or without unopened side buds. Roses classified as **single or semi-double roses** by the ARS are generally at their most perfect phase when fully open. A **bud** is not a bloom and cannot be considered for any award.

- Class 1 Novice Class One photo, appropriate for any of Classes 2-13.
- Class 2 One Exhibition Bloom, Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, or Floribunda no side buds
- Class 3 One Exhibition Bloom, Miniature or Miniflora no side buds
- Class 4 One Open Bloom, Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, or Floribunda (other than roses classified as single or semi-double varieties by the ARS) no side buds
- Class 5 One Open Bloom, Miniature or Miniflora (other than roses classified as single or semi-double varieties by the ARS) no side buds
- Class 6 One Open Bloom of a rose classified by the ARS as a Single or Semi-Double no side buds
- Class 7 One Spray, Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, Floribunda, Polyantha, Miniature or Miniflora
- Class 8 One Bloom or Spray, Species or Old Garden Rose side buds permitted
- Class 9 One Bloom or Spray, Shrub or Climber side buds permitted
- Class 10 A Rose Arrangement
- Class 11 A Rose Garden
- Class 12 A Rose Society Activity
- Class 13 Rose Art A photograph having altered reality, design, form or components of a rose plant or any portion thereof.

# The position of District Member of the ARS National Nominating Committee is up for election in February 2012.

This is an ARS position and as such the person holding this elected office must not only be a member of a Penn-Jersey District but also a member of the American Rose Society.

The duties of this individual are listed below as stated in the Penn-Jersey District By-laws:

F. District Member National Nominating Committee shall: (NNC)

- 1. Serve as (District) Chair of Prizes and Awards Committee and preside over the selection and presentation of the ARS Silver Honor Medal Award,
- 2. Serve as Chair of the District Nominating Committee,
- 3. Serve on the (District) Board of Directors.

This all sounds very formal and it really isn't. It, like most jobs or offices in our organization, is an opportunity to help out. This particular job comes with a few more hoops to jump through.

As the job description states the first item is to be the lucky person who gets to announce the 'will of the members' in their choice of the Silver Honor Medal recipient each year. This job entails notifying the society representatives for possible nominations in the early spring. After receiving their submissions, the SHM person will reproduce the submitted nomination forms and forward them to all voting members, collect the subsequent ballots, determine the recipient and order the medal and certificate that is presented at the Fall District Convention.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> item only comes up every three years. The NNC member is to actively solicit individuals who will offer to serve the membership by running for any of the National and District Offices. These offices are elected every three years and they include the Vice President of the ARS, the District Director, and the Regional Directors. The ballots for these positions are announced in the ARS Magazine and balloting is done by the most current ARS determined methods.

The other office that is an ARS position but is not elected on the ARS magazine ballot is that for the NNC. This person is to be elected by members of each district at one of their district meetings that precedes September of the election year. *We will be carrying out this election at the 2012 Winter Rose Get-A-Way.* The person does not take office until the conclusion of the Fall District Convention but the election must be at a District meeting before then – the Winter Rose Get-A-Way.

Our By-laws state that all of our officers are elected at the Fall District Meeting but this is not entirely accurate. It would be more correct to say that they are installed at the Fall District Meeting.

The District officers that are to be elected at that time are for the  $1^{st}$  and  $2^{nd}$  Assistant Directors, Secretary and Treasurer. A timetable for these nominations and the balloting will be determined at the Winter Rose Get-A-Way meeting.

I have enclosed the Declaration form that one should use to volunteer to run for the NNC office or (*after significant arm twisting of others*) now will agree to volunteer to run.

If you would like to run or would like to nominate someone for the position of District or Regional Director or ARS Vice President please contact me for the appropriate ARS forms for nomination and I will assist you in that process.

### 2011 Horizon Roses Now Available

The 2011 issue of "Horizon Roses" is now available. Horizon Roses, published annually for nearly 40 years, is a compilation of comments by the nation's top exhibitors on the exhibition potential of the newest hybrid teas, floribundas, miniflora and miniature roses. For most exhibitors, it has long been considered an indispensible guide to buying new show roses.

This year's edition contains 100 pages of information with 2,138 reports on 313 roses by 85 reporters. The reports include 67 new roses not mentioned in prior issues. All comments are candid and reported in the words of the reporter (with some abbreviation and condensation). They appear single spaced on both sides of 8-1/2" x ll" sheets folded into a mailer.

The reports are set forth alphabetically and include statistics of the show results of the reported varieties. In addition, information is provided on known sources for the reviewed varieties.


