What was the very first recognized snowmobile produced?

Answer - The Lombard Steam Log Hauler was patented in 1901 as the first commercially-produced vehicle to use a continuous track. This helped it glide over the snow and other types of tricky terrain with ease. Although it was not designed to be like our current snowmobiles as a sport, it was the concept that brought snowmobiling to what it is today.
