Those ages 11 – 15 must also attend a class room session and driving test to receive a certificate.



#### Snowmobile Trivia

You're new to the sport of snowmobiling. You purchase a new snowmobile. If you are over the age of 18 you do not need to have a Safety Certificate to ride in Minnesota.

FALSE – If you are born after December 1976, all riders need a Safety Certificate and must complete an on line education class. Those from 11 to 15 must also attend an in class room and driving test.
