Sno-Trails Clubs Storage Building

The PLSA Club agreed and approved to move forward with the building of a storage facility for trail grooming equipment and signage. Currently this equipment is scattered across multiple club members properties. Many of these members are at an age that they may sell the land. The storage building will house all groomers, and equipment and well over 6000 signs. It will also have room for doing maintenance on the equipment. It will also centralize this equipment across the 4 Sno-Trails Clubs – Savage, Belle Plaine, Shakopee and Prior Lake. Scott County has offered the land for free and will allow the building to be put on the land behind Doherty's Tavern. The clubs will pay for the building, however the land will be tax free. Looking to get at least a 20-30yr lease agreement. The process is currently on hold.

Minnesota is only 1 of 2 states left with numbers. Vintage sleds are considered any sled that is 25 years and older. MnUSA is looking to increase the number of years to 30, so we can continue to fund our trails.



About Sno-Trails

Sno-Trails is the non-profit organization that all 4 clubs in Scott County rolls up to. This includes Prior Lake, Savage Sno-Pacers, Belle Plaine Borough Riders and Shakopee's River Valley Trailblazers. The reason for the 'parent' non-profit is that the State of MN only allows one club per county to interact at the state level. How is Sno-Trails funded? When you register your snowmobile \$105 is used to fund Sno-Trails. We get 1% of the gas tax. Our regional area gets \$7–10MM from registration to manage Grant-in-aid Trails. The annual Sno-diac dinner is a fundraiser with 125 tickets sold at \$125 and is another source of income for Sno-Trails. Generates ~\$8,000 in revenue.
